PROMETEON AT A GLANCE

Prometeon Tyre Group (hereinafter "Prometeon", "the Company", "the Group") is a tire manufacturer focused on the industrial sector, including goods and passenger transportation, agriculture and off-road applications. As one of the leading players in the market, it is the only tire manufacturer worldwide entirely dedicated to these segments.

Prometeon was founded in 2016 as a spin-off from Pirelli Tyre, which holds no shares in the company. Over the years, the Group has consolidated its autonomy, managing the entire process from product development and production to sales. Today, it operates under the ownership of the China National Tire & Rubber Corporation (CNRC), a subsidiary of the Sinochem Group, which holds a 90% stake, while the remaining 10% is owned by the Chinese tire manufacturer Aeolus.

Prometeon is a global company headquartered in Milan (Italy) with four production plants across Egypt, Turkey and Brazil. Supported by a widespread sales network, it operates in 160 countries worldwide.

With a diverse and multicultural workforce representing nearly 40 nationalities, the Group employs approximately 8,000 people. Its strong industrial identity is reflected in the fact that 82% of its workforce consists of blue-collar workers. It is also a dynamic and youthful organization, with millennials making up 55% of its employees.

- The United Nations Convention against Corruption, 2003.






UNITED NATIONS SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS

The world is alarmingly off track in achieving the 2030 Agenda proposed by The United Nations and this makes essential for every company to act quickly and do more to help reach the Sustainable Development Goals (hereinafter "SDGs"), in order to build a fair and sustainable future for everyone.

From the most recent data showed, only 17% of the SDG targets are on track for reaching the 2030 agenda. Nearly half (48%) are demonstrating minimal or moderate progress. It is relevant to notice that 18% of SDG targets have stalled and 17% of them have fallen below the 2015 baseline levels.³

Given the global attention on the SDGs and the concerning distance from achieving these goals by 2030, Prometeon Tyre Group has renewed its strong commitment to this critical topic in 2024.

From Prometeon Tyre Group perspective, these targets serve as a blueprint for building a better and more sustainable future for all, addressing global challenges such as poverty, inequality, climate change and environmental issues.

As a company struggling to lead in SDGs performance, Prometeon concentrated heavily in 2024 on adapting its strategy, initiatives and practices to the overall goals. The Company worked diligently to address all key areas, utilizing every resource available to drive improvement.

Prometeon Tyre Group began its journey toward achieving the SDGs in 2021 by reviewing its targets and Sustainability Plan, introducing new initiatives such as ESG Rating assessments and Sustainability-Linked Loans.

The Sustainability Plan introduced by Prometeon Tyre Group in 2024 highlights a significant and unmistakable link to the following SDGs, as detailed below:

Water conservation strategies, pollution monitoring and water treatment initiatives like water collection and treatment project in Brazil (Gravatai)



Biodiversity protection, impact studies on each of Prometeon's plants ensuring that corporate activities do not interfere with local biodiversity.



Ethical business practices, **whistleblowing policy and responsible sourcing** (e.g. Conflict Minerals and Cobalt Sourcing Policy)



Collaboration with global partners for end-of-life tire management such as Innovando in Italy, ReciclANIP in Brazil, and LASDER in Turkey. Cooperation with various associations and organizations to promote sustainability, such as the partnership with SOS Villages in Italy and Alexandria to enhance children lives.

The data included in the current Report are gathered through the Company's information systems, such as HSE-DM (Health, Safety and Environment Data Management), SAP HR (SAP Human Resources), and SAP/HFM (SAP Financial Accounting), ensuring reliability and accuracy in the reporting process.

The Report is organized into four key dimensions that reflect the Ten Principles of the UNGC and are directly connected to the SDGs:

- Governance and Business Ethics: an introductory section outlining the Company's Sustainable Management Model, relevant policies and associated activities;
- Social Dimension: an area covering the description of welfare initiatives, industrial relations and activities aimed at both the internal and the external communities;
- Environmental Dimension: an overview of how environmental aspects and impacts are managed across the Company's plants and Headquarter;

• **Economic Dimension**: the section explores how the added value is distributed, providing insights into the Company's approach to managing relationships and performance with both customers and suppliers.

GLOBAL REPORTING INITIATIVE

Prometeon Tyre Group continued to base its Sustainability strategy on the Global Reporting Initiative (hereinafter "GRI") standard throughout 2024. The GRI framework provides a structured method for identifying the organization's most significant environmental, social and economic impacts, considering the nature of its business and the effects of its activities and decisions on key stakeholders.

MANAGEMENT MODEL

The responsible management model of Prometeon Tyre Group runs through the entire value chain. Every operating unit integrates economic, social and environmental responsibility in its own activity, while cooperating constantly with the other units, implementing the Group strategic guidelines.

The main management systems adopted include ISO 9001, IATF 16949, ISO 14001 and ISO 45001 certifications. Furthermore, the Company follows the principles of Standard SA8000® as a guiding framework for overseeing Social Responsibility within its Affiliates and throughout the supply chain.

SUSTAINABILITY STRATEGY AND CONTRIBUTION TO VALUE CREATION

Prometeon Tyre Group is a global multi-brand manufacturer of tyres for trucks, buses, agricultural vehicles and OTR applications. The Company designs, develops and engineers products and services tailored to meet customer needs and expectations. It places sustainable value at the core of its operations, integrating these principles into its business strategy and practices.

THE ORGANIZATION AND ITS REPORTING PRACTICES

Prometeon Tyre Group S.r.l. is a non-listed limited liability company operating in manufacturing and sales of tyres for industry, transport of goods and passengers, AGRO and OTR applications, with headquarters based in Milan (Italy) and a capital stock of € 100.000.000,00. Prometeon Tyre Group is part of Sinochem Holdings Corporation Ltd. Group.

Prometeon Tyre Group's Corporate Sustainability Report is published annually, covering the reporting period from January 1, 2024 to December 31, 2024. This reporting period aligns with

the Company's annual financial statements (please refer to the "Prometeon Tyre Group Financial Annual Report" for further details).



Prometeon Tyre Group sources raw materials from suppliers across various countries, with the majority coming from Latin America (29%) and Asia (35%).

All raw materials are transported to the Company's four manufacturing plants in Egypt (Alexandria), Brazil (Santo André and Gravataí) and Turkey (Izmit), where production follows Prometeon's commercial strategy to serve specific geographic markets. In Turkey, most of the production is directed to the European market, while the remaining portion serves the domestic market. In Egypt, the majority of production supplies the domestic market, with the rest distributed across Africa, the Middle East and a small portion reaching Europe. In Brazil, the Santo André plant, as the sole producer of Agro tyres, serves the global Agro market, while both Santo André and Gravataí primarily supply Latin America and North America. Each plant is structured with dedicated areas for material storage, production, quality control and outbound operations, ensuring efficient storage of finished products and proper waste management through recycling and disposal. Once production is complete, finished products are stored in warehouses and prepared for distribution to end users, including dealers in the Replacement channel and Original Equipment manufacturers. At the end of their lifecycle, tyres are collected by consortia or specialized companies for disposal or repurpose, with many of them being recycled or transformed into new products such as playground surfaces, sound barriers, or fitness mats, as detailed in the Economic Dimension section of this report.

Prometeon's Value Chain: driving sustainability across every stage

The representation below of Prometeon Tyre Group's value chain highlights the Company's commitment to sustainability throughout its operations. From responsibly sourcing raw materials to fostering partnerships with subcontractors, each step reflects attention to minimize environmental impacts and maximize value creation. Notable efforts include promoting recycling initiatives to prolong the lifecycle of tyres and reduce waste, as well as engaging with customers and consumers to emphasize sustainable usage practices.

GOVERNANCE SYSTEM

Prometeon Tyre Group's governance system is guided by the highest ethical standards, adhering to principles of integrity, transparency, honesty and fairness in all interactions with stakeholders. Committed to producing safe and high-performance products, the Group prioritizes excellence and competitiveness in the market while also respecting gender equality, human rights and sustainable product development. This ensures the preservation of the environment and the well-being of future generations, fostering eco-friendly growth.

The composition of the Board of Directors ("Board") of Prometeon Tyre Group during year 2024 has changed and as at the 27th December 2024, it consists of five Directors, out of which one Chairman. The Board has full authority over the ordinary and extraordinary management of the Company, including major ESG related decisions.

The Board members are appointed by the Quotaholders' meeting until the approval of the financial statements as of 31st December 2024. The five members all together represent the energy and dynamism of youthfulness as well as experience and wisdom of maturity; the Directors' ages vary between 40 and 50 years old. One Director is also part of the Company's top management. Certain Directors also hold managerial or directorship positions in companies of the relevant chain of control. The Chairman does not hold any managerial position within the Company but has been delegated with wide management powers with certain limitations.

With reference to the skills of the members of the Board, it shall be noted that, notwithstanding the change occurred with respect to the composition of the Board during fiscal year 2024, the competences of the Board members with respect to ESG matters and the Company's organizational structure has remained unchanged. Indeed, the General Manager of the Company (which also held the office as Director until 27 December 2024) had specific competences in sustainability with particular focus on ESG.

Moreover, the Deputy General Manager is an active member of the Company's Risk Committee and Sustainability Committee and is responsible for assisting in the management procedures and operations, also supervising the Company's various functions and thus giving concrete support to the Company in order to reach the goals set by Prometeon Tyre Group. In specific, the Deputy General Manager, thanks to his competence in sustainability matters, participates in important meetings and discussions about ESG topics. He also participates actively during the Board of Directors' meetings, especially the one convened to approve the financial statements report and the corporate social responsibility report, as well as in internal meetings and discussions about ESG topics. The presentation and approval of the Sustainability Report also serves as the main training tool for Board members on ESG issues.

Although Prometeon strives to comply with the best practices in terms of corporate governance, not being a listed company, no particular provisions have been implemented so far in relation to gender diversity within the Board of Directors, minorities and stakeholder representation, Board

evaluation. Moreover, the Board members do not receive any remuneration as a consequence of their office, with the exception of those provided for the positions held within the Company.

When called upon to approve the consolidated financial statements, the Board also approves, on a voluntary basis, the sustainability report. For this reason, the Directors receive in a timely manner the sustainability report so that they may revise it and comment prior to its approval.

To ensure that the Board remains continuously informed of critical issues and sustainability topics, an agenda with the relevant items is formed before each Board meeting. Moreover, there is a constant update of the Directors on the Group's critical issues also outside the Board meetings through continuous interaction between executives and Directors.

Through the Deputy General Manager's activities of supervision, the Board of Directors oversees the activities carried out by Prometeon Tyre Group and its subsidiaries. In addition, the inter-organizational control system in place has been built on communication and common policies and procedures. Thereby, the Company's subsidiaries conduct their activities under continuous coordination with Headquarter, without however their autonomy being affected.

The Company has appointed a Board of Statutory Auditors, which consists of three standing statutory auditors and two alternate statutory auditors, and an independent Auditor firm according to applicable provision of law.

In 2017 the Company adopted an organization model (the "Organizational Model") in accordance with the principles outlined in the Italian Legislative Decree no. 231/2001 (the "Decree"). The Organizational Model is updated whenever necessary and primarily when the legislature enacts provisions amending the relevant legislation.

The Organizational Model also provides for the establishment of a Supervisory Board, responsible for monitoring the implementation of, and compliance with, the Organizational Model.

In this regard, the Company has identified the members of the Statutory Auditors as members of the Supervisory Board and has established a whistleblowing channel which enables the stakeholders to anonymously report any actual or alleged violations of laws and policies.

The Company has implemented a Code of Ethics and a Code of Conduct which Directors, auditors, management and employees of the Company, as well as anyone operating in the name and/or on behalf and/or in the interest of the Company or that has business dealings with it, shall comply with in order to prevent situations that could lead to unlawful acts in general, and in particular the crimes pursuant to the Decree. More details on this topic can be found in paragraph "Our Policies" of the current sustainability report's dimension.

As presented under paragraph "Double Materiality for Prometeon Tyre Group" describing the impacts of Prometeon Tyre Group's business activities on people and environment, and, in a voluntary way, also the related financial risks and opportunities linked to sustainability topics on Prometeon itself, having specific communication channels with its stakeholders, in particular those externals (business partners, suppliers, local communities affected by business activities), is of vital importance to the Company. To this end, Prometeon Tyre Group avails different

platforms including the Company intranet and website, social media channels, as well as the whistleblowing channel. Further information can be found in chapter "The Relationship with Our Stakeholders" and paragraph "Reporting Procedure - Whistleblowing Policy" discussed under "Our Policies" chapter of the current report dimension.

The United Nations Global Compact (UNGC) is a voluntary initiative by the United Nations aimed at encouraging businesses worldwide to adopt sustainable and socially responsible practices and to report on their progress. Prometeon Tyre Group actively participates in the UNGC initiative and is a founding member of the UN Global Compact Network Italia (UNGCN Italia). The Company engages in webinars and surveys offered by both the UNGC and UNGCN Italia to enhance its corporate

social responsibility. Prometeon also submits an annual Communication on Progress to the UNGC, detailing its overall sustainability performance.



The European Tyre & Rubber Manufacturers Association (ETRMA) represents the regulatory and industry interests of European tyre and rubber manufacturers at both European and international levels. The association engages in ongoing dialogue with EU and international institutions, national agencies and other industry sectors. Acting as the voice of tyre

and rubber goods producers, ETRMA focuses on representing, promoting and communicating the industry's concerns to policymakers while offering technical support to its members. Details about the Company's collaboration with ETRMA can be found in the section "Focus: ETRMA European Tyre and Rubber Manufacturers Association" of the present report.



The European Tyre and Rim Technical Organization (ETRTO) is an association open to manufacturers of tyres, rims or valves with production facilities based in Europe. Recognizing the critical role of tyres in road safety, the association actively

collaborates with national and international organizations and legislative bodies to provide technical recommendations. ETRTO's activities are focused on the technical aspects of tyres, rims and valves, particularly regarding their fitting and usage. Key objectives include harmonizing national standards to ensure the interchangeability of pneumatic tyres, rims and valves across Europe, developing related technical legislation, establishing common engineering dimensions, load/pressure specifications and operational guidelines, as well as promoting the free exchange of technical information in these areas.



Federazione Gomma Plastica represents the Italian rubber, electric cable and related industries, aiming to promote initiatives that foster the industry's growth, It is an association of companies operating in the production of polymer matrix

products, rubber, plastic materials, and similar sectors, as defined by the Ateco codes assigned by Confindustria. Together with Confindustria and its other associates, Federazione Gomma Plastica contributes to the development of Italian society by supporting an innovative, internationalized and sustainable entrepreneurial system that drives the country's economic, social, cultural and civil progress. Full compliance with the association's criteria and supply chain standards is a key principle that the Company upholds and actively supports.



The members of Lastik Sanayicileri ve İthalatçıları Derneği - LASID (Tyre Manufacturers and Importers Association) consist of leading tyre manufacturers and importers operating in Turkey. The association's primary goals include raising public awareness about the sector and its products, promoting proper and responsible tyre

usage, and acting as a bridge between industry and institutions, legislators, and society. LASID addresses industry challenges collectively, providing suggestions and opinions to official authorities and stakeholders regarding necessary administrative and legal regulations. The association also controls the developments in the tyre industry within European Union member states and other countries, keeping both its members and the public informed. Furthermore, LASID actively participates in national and international initiatives aimed at minimizing the environmental impact of tyre production and usage.



YASED International Investors Association is the sole non-governmental organization (NGO) representing international companies operating in Turkey. Its mission is to enhance the efficiency and profitability of these companies while improving the country's attractiveness to investors by contributing to a more favorable business and investment environment. The

association aspires to be a leading NGO promoting Turkey's sustainable growth and development through value-added foreign direct investments. With member companies operating in 30 countries and across more than 15 sectors, YASED holds significant influence, particularly in its relations with the government and public authorities. The association plays a key role in shaping sustainable, predictable, and internationally competitive legal and regulatory frameworks. Furthermore, YASED collaborates with public authorities to boost the country's global competitiveness.



Lastik Sanayicileri Derneği – LASDER (Tyre Manufacturers Association) was founded by Turkey's leading tyre manufacturers to manage the collection, transportation, and recovery of end-of-life tyres (ELT) from sellers, service

providers, mechanics, and similar organizations across the country. Its objectives include representing the leading companies in the tyre sector, guiding the waste management industry effectively, raising standards through transparent and fair management, and increasing consumer awareness about the importance of waste management and recycling. LASDER actively collaborates with international institutions and organizations, such as the Ministry of Environment, Urbanization, and Climate Change, to propose amendments, additions, or updates to existing legislation based on practical experience. The association works closely with the Ministry to create suitable conditions for implementing potential advancements in waste management and recycling practices.



The Associação Nacional da Indústria de Pneumáticos - ANIP represents Brazil's tire and inner tube industry, comprising 11 companies and 21 factories, and works to protect the interests of the sector and international trade. One of its key

initiatives is combating the practice of dumping, where certain companies import products to Brazil at prices lower than those in other markets, a practice condemned by the World Trade Organization (WTO). Additionally, the association is actively involved in identifying and reporting import companies that fail to comply with reverse logistics regulations for the collection and disposal of waste tires. Since 1999, ANIP has been managing the National Program for the Collection and Disposal of Waste Tires. In 2007, it established Reciclanip, an entity exclusively dedicated to carrying out this program across the country.



The American Chamber of Commerce (AMCHAM BRASIL) is more than just a traditional chamber of commerce. It brings together Brazilian and international companies in a dynamic

environment that fosters cross-border collaboration and the exchange of knowledge. In addition to offering a portfolio of business products and services, the association plays an active role in shaping public policy in both Brazil and the United States, with a particular focus on foreign trade and business management issues.



The Centro das Indústrias do Estado de São Paulo (CIESP) is a non-profit civil organization that represents industrial companies, their parent organizations and associations linked to the production sector, as well as businesses with activities

directly connected to industrial interests. Its mission is to protect and promote the general interests of the industry and its over 8,000 member companies. CIESP studies, discusses, and presents matters relevant to the production sector to federal, state, and municipal authorities. The association provides support and advisory services to its members in various areas, including legal and technical consultancy, economic analysis, foreign trade, infrastructure, industrial technology, social responsibility, sustainable development and credit. Additionally, it facilitates participation in trade fairs, symposiums, business meetings, courses and agreements.

FOCUS: EUROPEAN TYRE AND RUBBER MANUFACTURERS ASSOCIATION

The European Tyre & Rubber Manufacturers Association (ETRMA) is an international trade association of the tyre and rubber industry representing nearly 4,400 companies in the EU directly employing about 370,000 people. The tyre business volume of ETRMA's member companies accounts for 70% of global tyre sales, and 7 out of the 10 world leaders in the sector are members of the association. With more than 70 tyre manufacturing plants and 20 R&D centers, ETRMA members demonstrate significant manufacturing and research capabilities within the EU and candidate countries.

ETRMA serves as the primary partner to EU institutions in shaping and implementing policies for the tyre industry, working toward a sustainable regulatory framework at the EU level. The association advocates for the regulatory and related interests of European tyre manufacturers, fostering collaboration with legislators to maintain a continuous dialogue with EU and international institutions.

Prometeon Tyre Group obtained full membership in ETRMA in February 2024 and collaborates with the Association on various initiatives to raise awareness among EU institutions and Member States about the importance of market surveillance in ensuring compliance with regulations related to vehicle and tyre safety as well as energy efficiency. The Company actively participates in several working groups addressing various aspects of tyre manufacturing and business, including trade, label regulation, CO2 and noise emissions, in-vehicle data access, on-board fuel consumption measurement and communication, product and industry health and safety, circular economy and end-of-life tyres (ELT).

Prometeon Tyre Group actively contributed to the Association's efforts in implementing the new EU tyre label regulation in the EU, Turkey and Israel, which came into effect on May 1, 2021. The updated label allows consumers to access detailed tyre information via the European Product Registry for Energy Labelling (EPREL) by scanning the QR code on the label or directly visiting the public website at https://eprel.ec.europa.eu/screen/product/tyres.

In 2024, the Company continued its collaboration with the Association to advocate for further enhancements to the label, particularly the inclusion of additional tyre performance information, such as abrasion and mileage, as well as its extension to cover retreaded products.

Furthermore, in 2024, Prometeon Tyre Group continued to support ETRMA in making its contributions and commitment to the twin transition: Green Deal & Digitalization. The new regulatory framework will focus on the following aspects concerning tyre business:

- European climate & environmental agenda
- Road safety
- Tyre wear abrasion
- Circular Economy (retreading label initiative) and Ecodesign
- Deforestation
- Tyre/Road traffic noise

- Access to in-vehicle data
- Euro 7.

Prometeon Tyre Group is dedicated to developing tyres with the lowest possible noise levels in response to the reduction of noise limits for tyres. In accordance with ETRMA's position, the industry emphasizes the need for greater focus on improving the accuracy of noise measurement methods. This is a critical factor for establishing a reliable policy that benefits the entire noise ecosystem, especially since there are currently no requirements addressing noise generated by road pavement.

On June 29, 2023, the new European Deforestation Regulation entered into force. ETRMA closely monitors regulations through a dedicated working group, assisting Prometeon Tyre Group in the implementation of new processes.

To promote collaboration with regulators and enhance its performance in Eco-Design, Prometeon Tyre Group, together with other stakeholders in the tyre industry, has voiced its support for including tyres in the new Eco-Design for Sustainable Products Regulation (ESPR) through the ETRMA working groups. This proposed regulation aims to establish eco-design standards for specific products, with a focus on improving circularity, energy efficiency and other environmental sustainability aspects.

The regulation will establish criteria focused on product durability, reusability, upgradability, and reparability. Additionally, it will assess the presence of substances that obstruct circularity, the proportion of recycled content, and the feasibility of remanufacturing and recycling.

The tyre industry is committed to actively participating in the development of this regulation. This proactive and cooperative approach is driven by the need to avoid the dissemination of misleading information and to assist regulators in creating a unified framework with clear, and universally recognized definitions that can be adopted by all stakeholders.

In view of the new proposal for the End-of-Life Vehicles Regulation, ETRMA is actively working to ensure there is no overlap with the Eco-Design for Sustainable Products Regulation. While the Eco-Design regulation is set to introduce circularity requirements for tyre design, similar measures might also be included in the End-of-Life Vehicles regulation.

As an active participant in ETRMA working groups, Prometeon is dedicated to preventing duplication or conflicts between these regulations. Tyres have been identified as a priority product for the initial phase of the ESPR legislation, as noted in the Joint Research Center's preliminary study. Avoiding overlapping legislation is vital, not only to support the business sector but also to ensure the regulations achieve their intended impact effectively.

In collaboration with ETRMA representatives, Prometeon Tyre Group has been actively working throughout 2024 to establish common guidelines for a reliable Life Cycle Assessment (LCA) procedure. This initiative aims to enable stakeholders to accurately represent the environmental impact of their products' life cycles and to facilitate the sharing and comparison of results.

The work within this group is ongoing and further efforts will be made in the coming year to finalize precise and dependable guidelines for conducting LCA on tyres.

In recent years, the automotive industry has undergone a profound digital transformation, leading to significant changes in tyre manufacturing, mobility and aftermarket services driven by data. In this evolving market, access to vehicle data has become a crucial factor for innovation and the delivery of advanced services. Recognizing the current and future potential of digitalization, tyre manufacturers have leveraged it to create innovative solutions aimed at enhancing road safety and advancing the decarbonization of transport.

The current technical solutions for accessing vehicle data through the Original Equipment connection position vehicle manufacturers as central players in managing data generated by their branded vehicles. Recognizing that only a regulatory framework can create a level playing field for all mobility stakeholders, Prometeon Tyre Group fully supports ETRMA's appeal to the European Commission to establish a sector-specific EU legal framework for accessing in-vehicle data. Such a framework would enable the development and implementation of advanced mobility services, promoting competition and innovation in the emerging mobility services market.

Prometeon has made another significant contribution to the community by supporting the full traceability of tyres throughout their lifecycle through its partnership with the Global Data Service Organization for Tyres and Automotive Components (GDSO).

GDSO, strongly supported by ETRMA, is a Brussels-based association focused on the standardization of tyre data and the management of access to tyre information through manufacturers' databases using a unique Tyre ID (Unique Item Identifier). This system enables secure and decentralized access to tyre manufacturers' databases, providing services built on a global, open, standardized, and secure data platform. Operated under robust and transparent governance, the system aims to support a sustainable and simplified mobility experience.

In 2024, Prometeon expanded the range of sizes available with RFID tags for digital tire identification and the management of tire carcasses at the end of their life.

The Tyre Pressure Monitoring System (TPMS) for commercial vehicles is one of the new requirements introduced in recent years. To meet this requirement, Prometeon Tyre Group collaborated with ETRMA and ETRTO to apply Regulation R141 to commercial vehicles as well. Prometeon continues to develop proprietary technology for a new generation of tire sensors to monitor not only pressure but also temperature and other data in real-time, which can be tracked online.

Another key initiative that Prometeon is collaborating on with ETRMA involves the development of standards and regulations for the implementation of the Vehicle Energy Consumption Calculation Tool (VECTO) with the target to reduce impact on CO2 emissions. This tool is essential for obtaining the vehicle certification for Heavy-Duty Vehicles (HDVs), including their original equipment (OE) tires, as required by the relevant regulations. Prometeon Tyre Group is committed to complying with these rigorous certification procedures to fully meet the requirements of the Monitoring and Reporting Regulation in the near future. The Company has also worked with ETRMA to implement VECTO certification for tires used in buses and trailer vehicles.

Prometeon is committed to contributing to a healthy environment. To achieve this, the Company supports ETRMA's efforts to gain a better understanding of the potential effects of particles generated during normal tire use and wear. This initiative is part of the Tyre Industry Project, which is overseen by the World Business Council for Sustainable Development (WBCSD).

Furthermore, Prometeon Tyre Group actively participates in the current efforts of the EU Tyre Industry to develop a new test method for measuring tire wear levels, with a view towards future labeling initiatives.

In April 2024, the EU Parliament approved Regulation (EU) 2024/1257 (Euro 7) aimed at reducing vehicle pollutant emissions. This new regulation includes requirements to minimize particulate emissions from tire abrasion, recognized as a source of microplastic release into the environment and will enter into force progressively from April 2032 for C3 tyres. The European Tyre Industry is collaborating at the UNECE level (United Nations Economic Commission for Europe) and closely with regulators to develop a reliable and representative test method for abrasion, along with associated thresholds, to be incorporated into a future UNECE regulation.

Evaluating new raw materials and auxiliary products before their use to identify potential health and environmental risks, it is a top priority for Prometeon Tyre Group. These assessments go beyond the restrictive European regulations on hazardous substance management, incorporating international standards and available expertise (such as specifications and databases), thereby fully implementing the principles outlined in the specific "Health, Safety, and Environment" Policy.

The company also collaborates with ETRMA to establish and enhance communication between downstream users and chemical producers, as specifically outlined in Regulation (EC) No. 1907/2006, also known as the "REACH Regulation." Through the Chemical Group (CG), composed of experts from tire companies and internal members, ETRMA liaises with the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA), interacts with member state institutions, and consults external experts to monitor and study chemicals used in the tire industry and address new chemical legislation regarding classifications and emerging issues. Thanks to the Rubber Chemical Monitoring Program, the association anticipates future actions on chemicals and monitors substances under evaluation by ECHA, as well as those that may be restricted. In this context, since 2020, ETRMA's activities have primarily focused on key topics such as 6PPD (an organic chemical used as an antiozonant in rubber tires), cobalt salts, resorcinol, carbon black, and DCBS (a sulfonamide accelerator with excellent anti-scorching properties and delayed onset of cure). ETRMA is also actively working to support a free market by advocating for the elimination of certain local restrictions and promoting the adoption of a harmonized certification framework to reduce the administrative burden in many countries, ideally following the UNECE framework.







SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE

A Sustainability Committee is a body responsible for the sustainability strategy and performance of a business. It is not only a fundamental aspect of good governance in any company but it also plays a crucial role in integrating both business and sustainability priorities, enabling the company to thrive.

The purpose of the committee is to create a unified perspective on ESG, enhancing understanding of three key aspects: environmental, social and governance. The Environmental, Social and Governance Committee (hereinafter "ESG Committee") is dedicated to supporting the Company's ongoing commitment towards environmental stewardship, health and safety, corporate social responsibility and corporate governance.

The main objectives of an ESG Committee are:

- 1. Highlight the importance of environmental measures, sustainability goals and performance at all levels of the business
- 2. Provide best practices on the structure, policies and regulations that impact the business
- 3. Enhance understanding and awareness of corporate governance and social aspects that influence the industry
- 4. Implement and promote common and practical standards of corporate governance for the business.

Prometeon Tyre Group has established **cross-functional committees** to evaluate and define new activities and key performance indicators (hereinafter "KPIs"). These committees operate both at the Company's headquarter and in its key locations in Brazil, Turkey and Egypt, fostering a unified and strategic approach. The aim is to **develop initiatives** at both **local** and **global levels under the coordination of the Headquarter Committee.** Establishing committees in production plant locations enables local teams to suggest region-specific actions that can later be adapted and scaled in other Countries.

The role of the Headquarter Committee is to verify and support the correct application of the standards and KPIs identified. It is important to note that the Headquarter Committee is also responsible for monitoring the commercial offices in the countries where the Company operates, with the goal of achieving a global presence.

To better coordinate the committees, the Responsible of the Headquarter Committee also participates in local meetings to provide suggestions, while local representatives attend Headquarter Committee meetings to update the working group on local activities. This collaboration has enabled the Company to set reduction targets for 2025 and 2030 with the support of all committee members worldwide. Additionally, in 2024, the Headquarter Committee, with the help of local committees, has fully implemented an ESG management software providing consistent calculation methods and ensuring support with carbon footprints track, workplace safety and supply chain sustainability optimization through data-driven insights and automation. This synergy has enhanced the committees' ability to improve their KPIs annually and has facilitated the introduction of new ideas and activities to improve the overall sustainability performance of Prometeon Tyre Group globally.

HEADQUARTER SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE

The Sustainability Committee at headquarter level is responsible for monitoring the legislative and regulatory landscape that may have impacts at both global and local levels.

The Committee is also in charge of defining the energy and climate transition plans, setting targets for energy, GHG, waste, solvents and water withdrawal reduction and renewable and circular material use. Details are disclosed in the Environmental Dimension of the current Report.

From the legislative point of view, the Headquarter Committee has been fully involved in the activities to guarantee the compliance to the European Union Deforestation Regulation (EUDR) and to the Corporate Sustainability Reporting Directive (CSRD) and in the monitoring of the Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism (CBAM).

During 2023, the European Parliament released a new regulation for **Deforestation**. **Regulation (EU)** 2023/1115 of the European Parliament and Council, effective June 29, 2023, aims to minimize the EU's contribution to global deforestation and forest degradation. It prohibits placing certain products, including pneumatic tires and natural rubber, on the EU market or exporting them unless they are deforestation-free, comply with the producing country's legislation, and are covered by a due diligence statement.

Natural rubber is among the commodities covered by this regulation, requiring businesses to refine their trade and manufacturing processes to prevent further deforestation.

On 23 December, the Regulation (EU) 2024/3234 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 19 December 2024 amending Regulation (EU) 2023/1115 as regards provisions relating to the date of application was published in the Official Journal. The amendment, formally adopted by the European Parliament on 18 December and the Council on 19 December, introduces a one-year postponement to the European Deforestation Regulation (EUDR), shifting its enforcement date from 30 December 2024 to 30 December 2025 and from June 2025 to June 2026 for SMEs.

Prometeon Tyre Group has already defined an action **plan** to **fulfill the regulation requirements**, involving all the relevant functions, including Procurement, Supply Chain, Manufacturing, Quality, Internal Audit, Sustainability & Compliance, R&D, ITC, Legal and AFC and appointing an EUDR officer.

The plan includes:

- Deforestation-Free Strategy: Define policies to eliminate sourcing from deforested areas
- **Due Diligence Systems**: Ensure traceability, risk assessment, and mitigation measures are in place
- Staff Training: Empower employees to adhere to EUDR requirements at all levels
- Supplier Collaboration: Foster partnerships to maintain deforestation-free supply chains
- Monitoring Systems: Use geolocation and satellite technology to track supplier compliance.

Prometeon is fully **committed to the EUDR compliance** by the new due date.

Directive (EU) 2022/2464 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 14 December 2022 (**CSRD**) requires companies above a certain size to disclose information on what they see as the risks and opportunities arising from social and environmental issues, and on the impact of their activities on people and the environment. This helps investors, civil society organizations, consumers and other stakeholders to evaluate the sustainability performance of companies, as part of the European green deal.

Prometeon is required to apply the new rules for the first time in the 2025 financial year, for reports published in 2026.

In advance of this requirement, as a voluntary exercise, **Prometeon has already completed its first double materiality analysis**. See section CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY DIRECTIVE ROADMAP of this report.

The Headquarter Committee has been fully involved also on the monitoring of the Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism (CBAM).

On May 17, 2023, the EU implemented **Regulation (EU) 2023/956**, introducing the Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism (CBAM) as part of the Green Deal. This mechanism adds an environmental cost to imported goods based on their greenhouse gas emissions, aiming to prevent increases in emissions outside the EU from undermining internal reduction efforts.

While CBAM currently applies to specific industries and excludes tires, Prometeon Tyre Group, with the help of the headquarter committee, is **closely monitoring regulatory developments** to ensure readiness for any future changes.

In 2024, the Sustainability committee addressed also the growing concern over microplastics, particularly **Tyre and Road Wear Particles (TRWP)**. These particles, generated by the friction between tires and asphalt during driving, contribute to microplastic pollution in the air, water, and soil, raising significant environmental and health concerns across Europe. Prometeon is

actively collaborating with a leading European university to develop methodologies that better align laboratory results with real-world conditions. Additionally, the Company continues to monitor regulatory developments through its Sustainability Committee to ensure compliance with any new legislation.

BRAZIL SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE

The Sustainability Committee plays a crucial role in proactively managing environmental impacts and addressing stakeholder expectations, given the presence of two production plants in Brazil, Santo André and Gravataí.

Fabiana Santana, the Director of Human Resources LATAM, emphasizes that Prometeon is more than just a company because it is a space where people care for one another, the environment and the future of other generations: "It is with a heart full of gratitude that I share with you the ESG + Prometeon 2024 Report. More than numbers or initiatives, it tells stories. Stories of how we work together to make a difference, not only within our organization but in the world around us".

Environmental, Social and Governance are not simply corporate practices, but they can be translated into actions for protecting nature, valuing individuals and enhancing transparency in every decision.

Prometeon Tyre Group in Brazil has taken significant steps during 2024 toward a more sustainable and equitable future, also through the efforts of every employee and the initiatives carried out by the committee.

Below the projects developed by the Brazilian Sustainability Committee from ESG perspective throughout year 2024 (additional initiatives related to trainings and social activities for employees will be further described in the Social dimension of the current report).

Environmental and HSE initiatives



I-REC Certification (International Renewable Energy Certificate) is a globally recognized standard that certifies the use of renewable energy sources. It provides businesses with a reliable way to demonstrate their commitment to sustainability by

ensuring that their energy consumption is offset by renewable energy generation. Through this certification, companies can track and validate their transition to greener energy practices. Prometeon Brazil recognized energy consumption as a major source of CO2 emissions. In 2024, the Company fully supplied energy for Santo André and Gravataí plants from renewable sources, certified by I-REC, reaffirming its commitment to sustainability.



World Water Day (22nd of March 2024): Prometeon organized initiatives such as water collection and treatment from Arroio Passo dos Ferreiros in Gravataí and the water reuse system in Santo André that saves over 165 million liters annually.

Social initiatives



Solidarity Campaign for Rio Grande Do Sul: Thanks to the solidarity of its employees, suppliers and distributors, Prometeon Tyre Group achieved remarkable results in its campaign to support families affected by the crisis. The initiative led to impressive numbers:

- 47 tons of donations were collected, including essential items
- 670 pallets were donated to serve as shelters for people and animals
- 496 employees contributed with monetary donations, reaching a total of R\$ 47,110.00. Prometeon tripled this amount, bringing the final sum to R\$ 141,330.00. The funds were then distributed among 23 employees who were directly impacted by the heavy rains
- Additionally, each of these employees received a voucher worth R\$ 7,500 toe used at Loja Colombo for purchasing furniture and/or household appliances.

This campaign reflects the Company's commitment to social responsibility and its dedication to supporting those in need.



Young Apprentice Program - Prometeon reaffirms its commitment to social responsibility through a strong apprenticeship program in partnership with important institutions such as CLASA, CIEE and SENAI. The program aims to provide young people with opportunities for professional development and learning.

In 2024, 317 apprentices took part in the program, demonstrating the Company's dedication to fostering the new generation of professionals.

TURKEY SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE


The Sustainability Committee in Turkey was established in September 2022 and restructured in 2023 to ensure a more effective integration of sustainability across all functional areas. These areas include Operations and Manufacturing, R&D and Quality, Social and Training (HR & HSE), Supply Chain (Logistics & Procurement), Corporate Communication (Marketing & Sales), Financial Operations and Mobility Solutions & Digitalization (ICT). Each function has defined its short-medium strategy and long-term sustainability goals during the committee's sessions and meetings within the year 2024.

Below the projects developed by the Turkey sustainability committee from ESG perspective throughout year 2024 (additional initiatives related to trainings and social activities for employees will be further described in the Social dimension of the current report).

Environmental and HSE initiatives

In 2024, Prometeon Turkey improved its environmental objectives by optimizing equipment for material reuse, enhancing water purification processes, upgrading energy systems, and reducing power consumption in factory operations, all according to its planned roadmap.

Among 2024 initiatives, the reverse osmosis project has led to notable improvements: it reduces water consumption, boosts system efficiency, and increases reusable water sold to the energy supplier from 95 m³/day to 140 m³/day. This has enhanced Prometeon Turkey's water conservation efforts.

Prometeon Turkey realized also initiatives aimed at reducing emissions and improving supplier management. Key actions included transitioning forklift batteries from lead-acid to lithiumion to reduce hydrogen emissions have been completed.

The Company has also introduced a classification system for suppliers and has started a CSR self-assessment audit for high-risk suppliers. Sustainable solutions have been prioritized in supplier selection, focusing on reducing environmental risks through material and product choices. The completed actions include digitizing customs documents, integrating smog checks for trucks accessing the warehouse and launching ESG-based supplier awards to encourage responsible practices.

Additionally, the Company prioritized digital transformation and energy efficiency through physical processes such as paper invoices, dealer letters of guarantee and export declarations substitution with electronic systems, reducing paper usage by 90%. Applications to legal authorities and tax forms have been also handled digitally, streamlining processes and increasing efficiency. The adoption of a hybrid working system contributed to energy savings, while the Renewable Energy Venture Capital Investment Fund has been acquired to support clean energy initiatives.

Prometeon Turkey also focused on enhancing energy efficiency and optimizing resource management in ICT, aiming to generate a positive environmental impact. Key actions included replacing outdated laptops, servers and other hardware to reduce energy consumption and uninstalling unused applications to optimize storage and performance. The Company has also initiated efforts to monitor inefficiencies remotely via KEPWARE and has implemented EUDR traceability for natural rubber, ensuring certification compliance. Furthermore, Prometeon supports productivity initiatives such as MES, HANA, and CRM projects, while contributing to the development of environmentally friendly tyres through digital design tools.

From HSE perspective, Prometeon in Turkey structured the strategy for safety excellence to enhance workplace security, employee well-being and compliance with international standards.

The main committee achievements of 2024 have been focused on immediate improvements, including the establishment of a Central HSE Committee and departmental subcommittees dedicated to communication, training and awareness. Employee health has been a key priority, and the Company enhanced access to physiotherapy, dieticians and psychological counseling, as well as the improvement of periodic health checks. The Company also revised safety procedures and prioritized risk assessments, while strengthening contractor management systems to ensure safer operations.

Prometeon Turkey in 2024 continued the journey toward employee awareness on environment and HSE topics with the organization of specific events such as **HSE week**, **Environmental Day and World Water Day:**


Quality and R&D initiatives

Prometeon in Turkey has defined a clear strategy for its R&D and Quality Assurance activities, focusing on innovation, sustainability and efficiency.

The achievements of 2024 are linked to prioritization of product innovation and sustainable practices. Key actions included the development of Rolling Resistance A-Class Tyres and the introduction of thin bladders to minimize environmental impact. Prometeon Turkey also implemented Real Dynamic Curing technology to optimize production processes and launching systems to reuse textile and mono-wire bead scraps.

Digitalization efforts are underway with RFID technology, digital operator checklists and the accreditation of its Indoor Test Lab for sustainable test management. Operational

enhancements include the deployment of new buffing machines to support waste recycling services and automated defect recognition systems to streamline quality assurance.



Social initiatives



Prometeon in Turkey is dedicated to embedding sustainability into employee mindset by enhancing activities for them and the stakeholders: the Company aims to create a healthier, more inclusive and environmentally conscious workplace.

The main achievements of 2024 have been concentrated on improvements to employee well-being, sustainability awareness and operational processes. Wellness initiatives include launching

physiotherapy, dietician and psychological consultancy services, along with a well-being project to support employees and their families in areas such as mental health, nutrition and sports.

Sustainability efforts involved the project of integrating eco-friendly products into workplace celebrations, hosting awareness campaigns like blood donation and incorporating sustainability training into first-day employee orientation programs. To enhance operational safety and preparedness, the Company has implemented contractor management software and conducted emergency training and evacuation drills.

Additionally, over 21,000 hours of training have been performed to develop soft skills, technical expertise and leadership capabilities across all levels.

In Turkey, Prometeon's commercial strategy integrates sustainability into its operations, focusing on strengthening its brand, enhancing customer engagement and promoting environmentally conscious practices.

The main achievements of 2024 have been focused on initiatives that can improve communication and operational efficiency while fostering sustainability awareness. Efforts included promoting retread technology by supporting dealer certification (ECE R109) and completing 14,000 tyre retreads. Customer engagement has been strengthened through training sessions on tyre lifecycle management, with 49 sessions involving 400 participants. Digital tools have been leveraged to track tyre movements and integrate renewable materials into marketing activities. Additionally, the Company supported CSR initiatives, such as partnerships with TEGV and universities and improved customer satisfaction through summits, and cooperative activities.

EGYPT SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE

Prometeon Egypt integrates sustainability into its business strategy, striving to generate a positive impact on the environment, society and local communities. Committed to long-term environmental balance, the Company fosters innovation and sustainable growth.

The Sustainability Committee, established in September 2022, integrates expertise from HR, HSE, Procurement, Marketing and Manufacturing. This cross-functional team is important to define clear goals and implement sustainable initiatives.

Prometeon Egypt's sustainability efforts for 2024 have been focused on expanding green spaces, reducing emissions, enhancing resource efficiency and promoting employee well-being. Looking ahead to 2025, the Company remains committed to balancing operational excellence with environmental and social accountability, ensuring a sustainable future.

Environmental initiatives

Prometeon Egypt prioritized 100% compliance with green policies and practices as a cornerstone of its sustainable growth strategy.

The Company secured environmental approvals for all factory expansions and new projects, ensuring adherence to regulations and conducting impact assessments. This proactive approach not only met but exceeded industry standards, reinforcing Prometeon's leadership in environmental responsibility and commitment to a cleaner future.



The achievement of the ISO 14001 certification, with zero non-conformities, highlighted Prometeon Egypt's dedication to environmental excellence.

This internationally recognized certification reflects the company's efforts to reduce environment negative impacts, optimize resource efficiency and integrate sustainability across all operations.



Prometeon in Egypt has been also committed to tackle the growing challenge of electronic waste. Through a strategic partnership with Tadweer Misr, the Company actively engaged in e-waste recycling, not only reducing the environmental impact of obsolete electronics but also contributing to the circular economy. This initiative ensured that valuable resources were reclaimed, while harmful substances were safely disposed of, minimizing Company's environmental footprint. As part of the

Presidential National Initiative "Go Green", which focuses on e-waste awareness and recycling, the project operates under the supervision of the Ministry of Environment & Waste Management Regulatory Authority. In recognition of its efforts, E-Tadweer Misr, the initiative's executing partner, has expressed its gratitude to Prometeon for its participation, highlighting the successful recycling of 340 kilograms of electronic waste.

In Egypt, Prometeon remains committed to delivering high-quality Health, Safety, and Environment (HSE) trainings to ensure the well-being and safety of all employees. In 2024, the Company successfully conducted 21,769 training hours, far exceeding its target of 13,200 hours. These sessions covered a range of critical safety and risk topics, including Risk and Safety Competence, Compliance and Standards and Targeted Training Initiatives.

Social initiatives

Prometeon Egypt supported the Blood Donation Campaign as part of its Occupational Health Initiatives, contributing to global health efforts to generate a positive impact on the community.

The initiative encouraged employees to participate in addressing the critical need for blood donations, reinforcing the Company's commitment to corporate social responsibility. By actively promoting engagement, the campaign contributes to saving lives, improving healthcare access and fostering a culture of giving and community involvement. This initiative highlights Prometeon Egypt's dedication to enhancing the well-being of both employees and the broader community.

Earning this certification reflects the Organization's dedication to fostering a superior work environment and achieving excellence in all HR practices that support our employees' growth and well-being.













ANALYSIS OF MATERIALITY

In 2022, Prometeon conducted an analysis of the environmental, economic, and social impacts characterizing the Company's activities, in line with the stipulations made in the latest version of the Global Reporting Initiative Sustainability Reporting Standards (briefly "GRI Standards"), updated in 2021. The same methodology was also adopted for the 2024 materiality analysis, updated in light of regulatory developments throughout the year. The identification of materiality issues for the company is linked, according to the Standard's requirements, to the identification of current and potential significant impacts generated or likely to be generated by the company on the economy, the environment, and people, including impacts on human rights, through all of the organization's activities and business relationships. These impacts include negative and positive impacts, short-term and long-term impacts, intentional and unintentional impacts, reversible and irreversible impacts.

The dedicated working group set up at corporate level, in collaboration with a team of external professionals to support it, structured the materiality analysis process in four different phases:

- 1. Understanding the context in which the Group operates: analysis of the sector in which Prometeon operates, taking into consideration different categories of sources, both internal and external to the Company.
- 2. Identification of Prometeon's actual and potential impacts: actual impacts are impacts that have occurred over time, while potential impacts could occur in the future.
- 3. Evaluation of the significance and materiality of impacts: all impacts have been assessed through a process of evaluation of the degree of significance developed in line with the criteria indicated by the Standard.
- 4. Prioritization of the most significant impacts for reporting purposes: the most significant impacts for Prometeon were prioritized and the impacts considered most relevant guided the identification of the material issues included in this Sustainability Report.

The following table shows a list of the themes found to be material following the identification and aggregation of material impacts. Each material theme has been associated with the relevant GRI Disclosures and, for each theme, the appropriate reporting boundary has been defined.

Materiality analysis according to GRI

In general, an impact may be actual or potential, negative or positive, short or long-term, intentional or unintentional, reversible or irreversible.

Actual impacts are those that have already occurred, while potential impacts are those that may occur but, at the time of analysis, have not yet occurred.

The assessment of each positive impact has considered the Company's direct and indirect contribution to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in line with the commitment made and taking into account the management tools put in place to monitor the targets set. With regard to the assessment of potential negative impacts, all policies, procedures and activities implemented by the company to prevent and mitigate the identified negative impact were considered.

The prioritization activity allowed the company to determine the material issues for reporting. At the methodological level, the main negative and positive impacts identified were prioritized and evaluated according to their degree of severity and likelihood of occurrence, respectively. The significance of an actual negative impact is determined by its severity while, the significance of a potential negative impact is determined by the severity and likelihood of the impact.

Specifically, the severity of an impact was assessed by taking into consideration three aspects:

- 1. **Scale**: how severe the impact is and the external context in which the impact occurs, including geography;
- 2. **Scope**: how widespread it is and can be measured in terms of its impact on the value chain;
- 3. **Irremediable character** 4: how difficult it is to repair the damage generated by the impact.

RISK FACTORS AND UNCERTAINTY

The Company oversees Enterprise Risk Management in light of the current macroeconomic outlook, business complexity, financial market instability, and evolving legislation across the countries where the Group operates. The goal is to maintain an overview of risk positions across functions and countries.

Risk mapping encompasses all internal and external aspects related to the business (commercial, procurement & supply chain, macro-economic facets), regulatory features (insurance, tax, general regulations), and values (ethics, social-environmental) at the Group level, with continuous monitoring activities in place. Identified risks undergo qualitative-quantitative assessments, leading to the establishment of governance and management structures as well as the preparation of mitigation or remediation plans and investments. Risk analysis activities result in defining risk reduction or elimination actions pursued within each country/function and implemented by identified process owners.

The objective is to monitor, assess, and manage risks effectively, protecting the Company's value and goals across all Group Companies. This includes preventing and neutralizing potential risks systematically and structuring strategies accordingly or leveraging additional opportunities by aligning business strategy with identified events. The Prometeon Risk Model systematically assesses three categories of risks:

- 1. External Risks: Risks associated with the external environment in which the Company operates, over which the Company has no control. This category includes risks related to macroeconomic trends, demand & supply changes, competitors' strategies, technological innovation, new regulations, and country-specific financial, security, political, and environmental risks, as well as impacts linked to climate change.
- 2. Strategic Risks: These are risks inherent to the business, and proper management of these risks can provide a competitive advantage or, conversely, lead to failure in achieving planned objectives. This category includes risks related to markets, materials procurement, product innovation and development, production processes, human resources and financial risks.
- 3. Operational Risks: These risks arise from the organizational structure, processes, and Group systems, where assuming such risks do not confer any competitive advantage. Included within this category are risks associated with Information Technology, Business Continuity, Loss Prevention, Health, Safety & Environment, Legal & Compliance, and Security.

Transversal to the listed risks is Corporate Social Responsibility, Environmental, and Business Ethics Risks. These risks pertain to non-compliance with local and international laws/regulations, best practices, and corporate policies concerning human and labor rights, environmental standards, and business ethics, and can arise from the organization as part of the value chain or supply chain. These risks are primarily linked to the countries where the Company has an industrial presence.

Additionally, the framework is applied as needed. For example, risk assessments are performed for projects to be undertaken following the specified scheme. The objective is to analyze and prevent potential risks that the Group may encounter and to define specific action plans accordingly.

Risks are reported to the Top Management to ensure that identified risks, along with relevant information, are periodically shared and discussed during the risk committee meetings. A monthly report is prepared for and provided to the shareholders.

Enterprise Risk Management activities are specifically conducted by the Headquarters and Local Regional Risk Committees. These committees discuss and analyze information while considering risks mapped with functions, and ensure:

The classification criteria of the risk are appropriate;

The completeness and accuracy of the basic information reported;

The action plans are defined, updated, and executed in a timely manner;

Major business risk events are accurately reported.

The Risk Committees handle information related to risk mapping/monitoring and may conduct detailed investigations based on the information obtained. The reports overseen by the Risk Committees include:

- Category risk (External, Strategic, Operational);
- Risk type;
- Name of the event;
- Date of occurrence or acknowledgement;
- Detailed description;
- Probability evaluation and legal opinion, if any;
- Impact evaluation in million €, if possible;
- Litigation.

Moreover, starting in 2023, Enterprise Risk Management results at Prometeon Tyre Group are reported to the Board of Directors for oversight and governance.

EXTERNAL RISKS

Risk related to macroeconomic outlook

Post-pandemic, due to the current contingency situations around the world, the market is characterized by significant volatile conditions and high energy prices. In addition to the global context, specific elements of individual economies also have to be considered, such as the hyperinflation in Turkey, currency shortage in Egypt, and political changes as elections occurring in countries where the Group is present. Further elements of uncertainty and instability persist with reference to geopolitical tensions, particularly the continuous crises caused by the Russia-Ukraine and Israeli-Palestinian conflicts. These conflicts, along with their associated political concerns, have far-reaching implications, affecting not only the market dynamics but also the operational strategies of the Company.

Country risk

The Company is committed to adopting a local4local strategy where appropriate to meet local demand with competitive industrial and logistical costs. This approach aims to enhance competitiveness and enable the Group to navigate protectionist measures such as customs barriers, technical prerequisites, product certification, and administrative costs & antidumping related to importation. The Group continuously monitors the general politico-economic situation, tax regimes, and associated risks from political, economic/financial, and security perspectives in the countries where it operates, aiming to implement timely measures to

mitigate potential impacts of any local changes. Additionally, an investment for volume optimization is planned to support the local-for-local approach.

Risks related to world-wide geopolitical conflicts situations

Russia-Ukraine crisis continues and remains uncertain, with international sanctions affecting Russia's economic growth, currency market, and financial system. This situation is driving up prices for energy, metals, and agricultural commodities, impacting the Eurozone's price pressure and growth prospects. These uncertainties may disrupt normal market dynamics and business operations.

Similarly, the Israeli Palestinian conflict persists and influencing global markets and could affect logistics, sales, and energy costs. The conflict's escalation is causing severe economic and financial repercussions and increasing political attention in the Middle East, potentially involving more countries.

The Risk Committee is monitoring these crises, and the Company has established mitigation measures and a contingency plan for identified risks.

Risks associated with the evolution of long-term demand

Mobility is experiencing significant changes due to advancements in technology (such as smart mobility, electrification of propulsion, driving automation, and digital connectivity) and regulatory shifts aimed at enhancing sustainability. The Company continuously monitors these developments by analyzing global and local studies and data, and by participating in national and international webinars and conferences. Additionally, the Company is involved in various category associations to better understand potential market orientation and sector impacts.

Risks linked to climate change

Climate change is an undeniable reality that brings significant alterations to the ecosystems of our planet. It leads to phenomena such as the expansion of arid climate zones, presenting serious risks to the wellbeing of all species on Earth, as well as regulatory concerns, including potential impacts on business and associated costs. For instance, these risks are likely to adversely affect human living conditions in various aspects, including economic, social, and cultural life.

Prometeon monitors uncertainties to implement suitable prevention and mitigation measures, protecting its business from potential financial and operational risks. Additionally, the company is dedicated to developing sustainable products with minimal environmental impact throughout their life cycle.

Moreover, specific attention is directed towards water management, as it is the most essential resource for life on Earth. The Company has established strategies and targets aimed at ensuring the efficient and responsible use of water in both production processes and the

workplace. Prometeon is dedicated and committed to continuous improvement in this area, considering both internal and external risks. For instance, regarding local water resources at production sites, topics related to water scarcity, drought, and legal restrictions have been identified. The Company has developed and anticipated dedicated alternative projects and action plans, along with related investments, to address these challenges.

To adhere to the biodiversity strategy and protect natural components, the Company follows each aspect of sustainable regulations related to nature protection and resilience. For instance, in addition to managing water resource reduction, the Company monitors soil contamination, pollution, and fire prevention for plants and headquarters as part of risk assessment. For further details, please refer to the chapters "Biodiversity" and "New Materials" under the Environmental dimension of the current report and to the chapter "Prometeon Tyre Group and Its Commitment for Climate Change" under the Economic dimension.

Risks related to raw materials

Considering the global macroeconomic situation and its impact on the cost of finished products, along with the significant volatility observed in recent years, synthetic rubber, natural rubber, and oil-related raw materials will likely continue to be sources of uncertainty. To protect the Company's assets and profitability, various measures are being considered under different scenarios, such as increasing sales prices or implementing internal cost efficiency strategies. These strategies may include using alternative raw materials, changing sources or suppliers, improving process quality, and reducing waste levels.

Additionally, the Company is involved in international associations that focus on research into green raw materials and sustainable products. Consequently, the adoption of renewable, sustainable, and non-polluting raw materials has become a formal principle of the Company. Continuous research and development are ensured by the participation in dedicated working groups led by associations of which the Company is a member.

Risks linked to competitive positioning

The Company operates in a market characterized by the presence of numerous competitors, some of which possess substantial financial resources and well-established industrial capabilities, along with brands that enjoy significant international or local recognition. Prometeon is the only tyre company exclusively focused on the Industrial sector (transportation of goods and passengers), as well as the Agro and OTR segments. The Company's payoff, "Tyre solutions for professionals," underscores its commitment to being the "Partner of choice."

Responsibility and trust granted by stakeholders form the foundational backbone of the Company. Continuous innovation and dedication are daily pursuits that strengthen the Company's connection with its consumers. For example, constant research and investment are

central to technology development, enabling the creation and production of innovative offerings, products, and services.

STRATEGIC RISKS

Exchange rate risk

The Company faces exchange rate risk due to its manufacturing and commercial activities in various geographic areas, where receivables and payables are denominated in foreign currencies. Operations and profitability can be influenced by changes in exchange rate volatility between currencies, as the assets and liabilities of local companies operating in non-euro currencies are converted into euros. The Company continuously monitors currency fluctuations and related exchange rate risk exposures.

Prometeon has an industrial presence in countries such as Brazil, Egypt, and Turkey, which experience currency fluctuations. To mitigate these impacts, specific actions and projects have been designed and implemented to neutralize the economic and financial effects.

Credit risk

Credit risk refers to the potential loss resulting from the failure of counterparties to fulfill their commercial and financial obligations as stipulated in agreements. To mitigate this risk, the Company has established a dedicated procedure for defining credit limits assigned to customers, monitoring expected cash flows and taking necessary recovery actions. Additionally, supplementary instruments are employed, such as various types of guarantees (authorization required), a master agreement with an insurance company for global credit risk coverage, and periodic reviews and renewals to ensure alignment with the business model and macroeconomic outlook.

Risks associated with human resources

The Company addresses the risk of losing key personnel or critical know-how by developing retention plans based on macroeconomic conditions and salary benchmarks, updated regularly. Skill and know-how mapping, incentive plans, and non-compete agreements are tailored to activities' risk profiles. Additionally, a talent program is planned to motivate and retain valuable employees.

OPERATIONAL RISKS

Risks related to environmental issues

The Company's activities and products are governed by a multitude of environmental laws that differ across the countries where it operates. Given the current trend, these regulations are likely to become increasingly stringent due to growing concerns within the international community about environmental sustainability. It is anticipated that progressively stricter laws will be introduced, addressing various social and environmental aspects such as atmospheric emissions, waste generation, soil impact, and water usage. To stay ahead of these developments, the Company continuously monitors changes in related laws and regulations through participation in industry associations, webinars, and consultation with experts in this field. This proactive approach enables the Company to study and analyze regulatory trends in advance and make informed investments where necessary, ensuring preparedness for future challenges and compliance requirements.

On a European level, the recent Regulation on Deforestation-Free Products ensures that EU products do not contribute to forest degradation and loss, thereby supporting the resilience of the biodiversity strategy. This regulation allows EU companies to produce certified products that comply with environmental laws already enforced by EU member states. Furthermore, due diligence is required and evaluated. The Company is closely monitoring the requirements of the Regulation to comply with the necessary measures. Risk assessment on this topic is regularly reviewed.

Employee health and safety risks

The Company incurs charges and costs for measures necessary to ensure full compliance with health and safety regulations in the workplace. For instance, following the pandemic contingency, the Company has adopted and continue with hybrid working model. With respect to activities performed at the production plant, dedicated procedures are established, and related training is periodically carried out to ensure the health and safety of all employees. Risks in this field are monitored.

Defective product risk

All tyres produced undergo thorough quality analysis before being placed on the market, with the entire production process subject to specific quality requirements and assurance procedures. Specific procedures are developed and defined for proper management of these processes. However, as with all manufacturers of consumer goods, Prometeon could face liability actions related to potential product defects and may be required to conduct product recall campaigns. Although no significant cases have been detected recently, the Company has dedicated insurance coverage for such events.

Litigation risks

The Company may encounter disputes related to commercial, trade, fiscal, legal, or labour law in the course of its activities. Prometeon identifies and implements the necessary measures to prevent, avoid, and mitigate any potential consequences and adverse impacts resulting from such proceedings.

RISKS RELATED TO INFORMATION SYSTEMS AND NETWORK INFRASTRUCTURE

Information and Communication Technology (ICT) systems play a crucial role in supporting business processes, evolution, and development. An analysis and assessment of ICT security has been planned and initiated to detect any security gaps and define specific corrective actions aimed at enhancing the Company's overall security. These measures are intended to protect information assets and upgrade security systems against unauthorized access and data management.

By improving both processes and technologies, these efforts also prepare the Company for future audit activities and ensure compliance with international standards and related regulations. Special attention has been given to technological obsolescence, particularly concerning infrastructure renewal, as it may pose risks of breakdowns and accidents that could significantly impact business and production activities. Dedicated remediation plans have been developed to mitigate these risks.

With hybrid working model, new cyber security risks and issues related to the capacity and resilience of technological systems have emerged. These risks are closely monitored, and periodic meetings are held between the ICT security function and the Risk Committee to share updates and initiatives regarding these matters.

Additionally, significant emphasis has been placed on cyber security awareness. Information sessions, such as phishing campaigns, along with training and updates on major cyber security risks, have been provided to users.

BUSINESS INTERRUPTION RISKS

Given Prometeon's international operations and global presence, the Group faces various risk scenarios that could lead to prolonged interruptions in business activities, significantly impacting operational capabilities and results. These risks include natural or accidental events (such as fires, floods, earthquakes), breakdowns in plants, wilful misconduct (including vandalism and sabotage), and/or utilities supply interruptions. Such events can cause severe property damage and disrupt production, particularly when they affect critical value chain activities or high-volume or specific product production sites.

Prometeon continuously monitors its vulnerability to catastrophic natural events (such as floods, hurricanes, and earthquakes) and estimates potential damage and business continuity disruptions based on the probability of occurrence for all buildings, especially production sites. Security measures, business continuity plans, and insurance policies are implemented to address property damage and mitigate any business interruptions that may affect production sites.

SOCIO-ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSIBILITY RISKS

Risks related to social and environmental responsibility and business ethics

Enterprise risk management encompasses an enterprise-wide approach to identifying, analyzing, and monitoring risks across various domains related to the Company's daily activities. This includes environmental, social, economic/financial, and business ethics risks directly or indirectly attributable to the Company. The assessments and monitoring activities address possible and potential political, financial, environmental, and social risks, including those related to human rights and labor laws.

The Company continuously monitors the application of internal regulations concerning financial and social (with a particular focus on human and workplace rights), environmental, and business ethics standards at its offices and sites. This monitoring is executed through periodic control activities and audits conducted by the Internal Audit Department. Additionally, in alignment with its sustainability principles, Prometeon has implemented a program of second-party audits along the supply chain via third-party companies.

Annual audit inspections are conducted on raw material suppliers, such as those providing natural rubber, carbon black, and chemicals, etc. to ensure compliance with established standards and mitigate risks associated with outsourced activities. The Company evaluates the conformity of its products and services by monitoring and assessing the performance of its suppliers. The objective is to evaluate their level of sustainability and compliance throughout the entire supply chain by examining the policies and procedures that enable these suppliers to

engage in responsible and sustainable procurement practices. To extend due diligence further, Prometeon has also decided to carry out audits on its cobalt and mineral suppliers.

Ethical risk assessment

To enhance and fortify the Governance & Business Ethics Dimension and further develop sustainability policies at the group level, a self-inspection for ethical risk assessment was conducted in 2024. This assessment focused on bribery and corruption and involved responsible personnel from various regions and countries within the Company. Assessing and managing the ethical risks that the Company may face is crucial to preventing reputational damage and financial losses. The results of this assessment are useful in identifying current areas requiring improvement, related developments, action plans to be implemented, and raising awareness of the ethical culture. Ethical risks, if identified, will be proactively managed to mitigate or eliminate their potential negative impacts.

The assessment specifically examined topics such as the Code of Ethics, Code of Conduct, Whistleblowing procedures, Gift Policy, Sponsorship, Consultancies services selection and engagement process, etc. Information and practices regarding acknowledgment, procedural and authorization applications, as well as awareness initiatives including publication channels, were taken into consideration. The 2024 assessment concluded with full participation from responsible personnel across different regions and countries, and no anomalies were detected.











CORPORATE SUSTAINABILITY REPORTING DIRECTIVE ROADMAP

Prometeon Tyre Group has taken a significant step forward in its sustainability journey by beginning the preparation for being compliance with the Corporate Sustainability Reporting Directive (EU) 2022/2464 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 14 December 2022 (CSRD).

This proactive approach demonstrates Prometeon's commitment to transparency, accountability and the integration of its business practices with evolving global standards. The CSRD represents a transformative shift in sustainability reporting, requiring companies to integrate environmental, social and governance factors into their core strategies while demonstrating measurable impact.

Prometeon's early preparation is not only ensuring regulatory compliance but also reinforcing its position as a responsible and forward-thinking organization. This initiative highlights the Group's dedication to meeting stakeholder expectations and contributing to a more sustainable future.

MEETING REGULATORY OBLIGATIONS

Prometeon Tyre Group is fully updating its practices in accordance with the new CSRD, which succeeds Directive 2014/95/EU. This new framework introduces stricter non-financial reporting requirements to enhance transparency and accountability in corporate sustainability disclosures.

The CSRD mandates that companies report on environmental, social and employee-related matters, as well as human rights and anti-corruption measures. These disclosures must also incorporate data required by the Taxonomy Regulation, further strengthening sustainability reporting.

The CSRD was formally adopted after key legislative milestones. The European Parliament approved it on November 10, 2022, followed by its formal adoption by the European Commission on November 28, 2022. The final text was published in the Official Journal of the European Union on December 14, 2022.

Within the current regulatory framework, the directive will be implemented in different phases: large public interest entities must be compliant in 2024, followed by other large companies in 2025. By 2026, listed SMEs, non-complex credit institutions and captive insurance companies will be included, with non-EU companies with substantial EU operations expected to comply by 2028.


Prometeon recognizes the importance of these enhanced reporting requirements and it is committed to redefine its processes to meet these standards. By doing so, the Company not only ensures compliance but also demonstrates its dedication to sustainability, transparency and responsible business practices.

DOUBLE MATERIALITY PRINCIPLE

The European Sustainability Reporting Standards (ESRS), developed by EFRAG under the direction of the European Commission, aim to improve non-financial reporting by establishing an overall sustainability disclosure requirement. Adopted in July 2023, the ESRS are based on the principle of double materiality, which combines two perspectives. The first is impact materiality, focusing on the company's effects on people and the environment. The second is financial materiality, which examines how sustainability risks and opportunities influence the company's financial performance, operations and position over time. Under ESRS 1, companies are required to disclose all material sustainability information after conducting a double materiality analysis. Additionally, some mandatory disclosures, particularly related to climate change, must be provided regardless of materiality assessments.

DOUBLE MATERIALITY FOR PROMETEON TYRE GROUP

Prometeon acknowledges the importance of these standards, which ensure transparency and accountability by addressing both the external impacts of sustainability issues and their internal financial implications. This framework strengthens the Company's accordance with regulatory expectations and stakeholder demands. As a voluntary exercise, Prometeon has already completed its first double materiality analysis, by adding to the impact materiality assessment (performed last year) the new assessment related to the implication of financial risks and opportunities linked to sustainability topics.




Prometeon Tyre Group applies the principle of impact materiality to identify and assess the positive, negative, potential and actual impacts of its operations and value chain on people and environment. This "inside-out" perspective ensures that the Company evaluates how its activities influence external stakeholders and ecosystems. To carry out this assessment, Prometeon analyzes sustainability reports from competitors, sector trends, key reporting standards, sustainability ratings and legislative pressures. It also considers geographical contexts and media analyses to better understand the environment in which the Company operates. This approach enables the identification of a preliminary list of impacts generated by Prometeon's activities.

The process further involves analyzing internal Company documents and validating the identified impacts to ensure their accuracy and relevance. This method highlights Prometeon's commitment to addressing its external responsibilities and contributing to sustainable development.

Impact Materiality - Evaluation methodology


Prometeon Tyre Group applies a structured methodology to evaluate impact materiality, focusing on the effects of its activities on people and environment. The evaluation considers

the severity of the impact, its geographic or demographic reach and the difficulty of reversing or mitigating any negative effects. These factors are combined with the likelihood of the impact occurring, taking into account the measures implemented by the Company to prevent or reduce risks.



Evaluation methodology

Prometeon evaluates the scale of impact as part of its materiality assessment to determine the significance of its effects on people and environment. Impacts are categorized from "None," indicating no recognizable effect, to "Absolute," representing critical and extensive influence. This approach ensures that Prometeon identifies and prioritizes actions based on the severity of both positive and negative impacts, supporting informed and responsible decision-making.




Evaluation methodology: impact scale

Prometeon evaluates impact severity based on geographical reach and value chain coverage, classifying it into six levels:


- 1) Global/Total: Affects a vast number of people globally with significant environmental impact (>66% of the value chain, >5 countries)
- 2) Widespread: Impacts a large population across multiple regions (33%–66% of the value chain, >5 countries)
- 3) **Medium**: Influences specific groups within a medium-scale area (33%–66% of the value chain, <5 countries)
- 4) **Concentrated**: Limited to a specific group or location with a localized impact (<33% of the value chain, >5 countries)
- 5) **Limited**: Affects a small number of people or areas with minor impact (<33% of the value chain, 2–5 countries)
- 6) **None**: No significant effect on people or the environment (<33% of the value chain, 1 country).

This classification helps guide sustainability decision-making and impact assessment.



Evaluation methodology: impact scope

Prometeon evaluates also the irremediability of impacts as part of its materiality assessment to understand how difficult it is to address or reverse negative effects (this is not applicable to positive impacts). This evaluation ranges from impacts that can be easily remedied in a short time to those that require significant effort over many years or are entirely irreversible. By incorporating this dimension, the Company prioritize actions that reduce long-term or permanent harm, ensuring a more responsible approach to its activities and their consequences.




Evaluation methodology: irremediablity

In the end, Prometeon evaluates the probability of impacts occurring as part of its materiality methodology. This probability can be measured qualitatively or quantitatively and considers the measures implemented by the Company to prevent or mitigate potential effects. The assessment ranges from "Guaranteed," where the impact or benefit is highly likely or frequent, to "Unlikely," where the probability of occurrence is minimal or rare. By incorporating probability into its evaluations, Prometeon ensures an understanding of potential risks and benefits, enabling it to prioritize mitigation strategies effectively:

Outside-In perspective

As anticipated above, as a preliminary and voluntary exercise, Prometeon evaluates financial materiality to identify risks and opportunities related to sustainability that could significantly impact the Company's financial position, cash flow and cost of capital over the short, medium, or long term. These considerations stem from environmental, social and governance factors that influence the Company's business operations and value chain.

The evaluation process includes mapping business relationships, dependencies on natural, social, human resources and sustainability-related actions implemented by the Company. Prometeon also conducts a preliminary identification of financial risks and opportunities linked to sustainability and validates these findings to ensure a global understanding of their financial implications. This approach enables Prometeon to integrate sustainability into its financial strategies and decision-making processes, considering the three key components: revenues, external investments and operating costs.

This framework helps Prometeon analyze how sustainability-related risks and opportunities impact its financial health and cash flow dynamics, ensuring informed decision-making and long-term resilience.


Risk Identification Process and evaluation methodology

Prometeon follows a structured process to identify material risks and opportunities by considering three key factors. First, it evaluates risks or opportunities arising from impacts generated by the Company's activities. Second, it examines risks or opportunities linked to actions taken by the Company to address sustainability issues, including efforts to mitigate negative effects or enhance positive impacts. Lastly, it assesses dependencies and relationships that may influence the Company's ability to access resources or rely on essential relationships under acceptable conditions.

The analysis also incorporates different forms of capital essential to Prometeon's operations, including natural, human, intellectual, relational, financial and productive capital. Each type of capital plays a critical role in supporting business continuity, fostering innovation, and maintaining operational resilience in accordance with sustainability objectives. This approach ensures that risks and opportunities are thoroughly identified and addressed in Prometeon's strategic planning.

Financial Materiality - Evaluation methodology

Prometeon's financial materiality assessment evaluates risks and opportunities by considering two key factors: magnitude and probability. Magnitude measures the severity of a financial impact, ranging from minor to catastrophic, while probability assesses the likelihood of an event occurring, from unlikely to guaranteed. By combining these variables within a matrix, Prometeon ensures a thorough understanding of potential financial risks and their implications, supporting informed decision-making and effective risk management strategies





DOUBLE MATERIALITY 2024: RESULTS FOR PROMETEON

Results of impact materiality

Prometeon's analysis of Impact Materiality evaluates both direct and indirect impacts across its value chain, focusing on their severity and probability of occurrence. Direct impacts include greenhouse gas emissions, high energy consumption, water pollution, biodiversity degradation and human health concerns linked to improper waste management. Indirect impacts address challenges such as stress on local communities, noise pollution, privacy violations and broader socioeconomic effects.


The company uses a matrix to assess the gravity of these impacts, ranging from critical to minimal, alongside their likelihood of occurrence, from improbable to guaranteed. This evaluation allows Prometeon to identify and prioritize the most significant risks and opportunities. Issues such as climate change mitigation, pollution and resource efficiency are given higher priority to ensure the Company actively mitigates critical impacts while enhancing positive contributions.



Impact Materiality outputs for Prometeon Tyre Group


Results of financial materiality

Prometeon's Financial Materiality Assessment evaluates both risks and opportunities, analyzing their magnitude and probability to prioritize areas of strategic focus. The risks identified are diverse, encompassing environmental, social and governance factors. Key environmental risks include the economic and reputational consequences of failing to implement decarbonization strategies, increased energy costs and insufficient waste management practices. Social risks are tied to health and safety incidents, privacy violations and inequities in the workplace, while governance-related risks highlight the importance of compliance with regulatory requirements and maintaining cybersecurity.

Conversely, the assessment also identifies significant opportunities. Environmental opportunities center on improving supply chain resilience, reducing energy costs and investing in recycling and reuse initiatives. Social opportunities focus on attracting and retaining qualified talent through dedicated training initiatives and community support programs. Governance opportunities, instead, focus on strengthening transparent business practices, ensuring ethical conduct, and fostering a culture of accountability across the organization.

This structured evaluation enables the Company to mitigate critical risks while capitalizing on opportunities that enhance sustainability, resilience and value creation.


Impacts, risks and opportunities from the analysis

The analysis of impacts, risks and opportunities focuses on both environmental and social dimensions within the value chain. Key areas of concern include climate change, pollution, biodiversity and resource usage. These topics highlight potential reputational, economic and operational risks that arise from inadequate mitigation or adaptation strategies, while also emphasizing business opportunities linked to resilience, efficiency and innovation.

For social aspects, issues such as working conditions, equality and workers' rights were identified as critical. These represent not only potential risks, such as legal violations or reputational damage, but also opportunities for fostering a sustainable and equitable workplace environment.

The identified impacts and their relevance underline the importance of integrating sustainability into business strategies to mitigate risks and leverage opportunities, ensuring both operational continuity and long-term value creation.

The double materiality matrix provides a well-rounded conclusion to the analysis, effectively categorizing material topics into relevant areas of financial and impact materiality. The findings illustrate a strong connection between critical environmental, social and governance factors and their implications on both business performance and societal outcomes. Topics such as climate change adaptation, pollution and resource management stand out as highly relevant across both dimensions, emphasizing their immediate and long-term significance.

Implementation of the Policies and Operating Procedures is entrusted to department directors who are responsible for ensuring their correct application within their respective department. Through the implementation and observance of its Policies and Operating Procedures, Prometeon Tyre Group ensures the remediation of negative impacts caused by its business activities, which are discussed under paragraph "Analysis of Materiality and Identified Risks" in the present chapter of the report.

All stakeholders pertaining to both external (business partners, suppliers, shareholders, locals living in the areas where the Company conducts business activities) and internal (employees) communities have the possibility to communicate to the Company their concerns regarding the business conduct of Prometeon Tyre Group. For detailed information, please refer to the dedicated paragraph below and to the "Focus: Whistleblowing Operating Procedure" paragraph discussed below in this section of the present chapter.

Prometeon Tyre Group acts in full compliance with laws and regulations applicable in the countries where the Company conducts business activities. During 2022, 2023 and 2024 no cases of non-compliance have emerged. For detailed information, reference should

The "Code of Ethics" identifies the general principles of integrity, transparency, impartiality, fairness and honesty inspiring the conduct of business. It indicates the objectives and the values

informing business activity in relation to the main stakeholders with which Prometeon Tyre Group interacts on daily basis. This document provides all the Company affiliates with cogent and uniform guidelines for the professional practices to be followed by anyone who works for or on behalf of Prometeon Tyre Group or has business dealings with it, including agents and other intermediaries ("Recipients of the Code of Ethics").

In June 2023 the Code of Ethics was updated. In particular, the principle of impartiality, aimed at rejecting all favorable treatments and inequalities, as well as an explicit commitment of the Company to oppose all forms of harassment and violence in the workplace have been included.

The "Code of Conduct" represents the operational declination of the principles, objectives and values of the Code of Ethics, identifying, by way of example, "do's" and "don'ts" referring, in particular to relations with Public Administrations, internal subjects and third parties and with the market.

The year 2024 witnessed once again the interactive training course on the Code of Ethics and Code of Conduct, edited by Compliance Department and Learning & Development Departments and made available to all newly hired globally. Thanks to this training, the awareness and knowledge of employees of the principles stated in these documents are raised and strengthened.

Moreover, in order to strengthen blue collar's awareness on these Policies and Operating Procedures, in 2023, in Brazil, Team Leaders of the factories were given a training organized by the Internal Audit, Sustainability & Compliance Department. For further details please refer to "Talent Development" paragraph discussed under "Social Dimension". In 2024 this project was also implemented in Egypt. In particular, all Team Leaders in the factory received a training from the local Corporate & Compliance Legal Assistant Manager on the following Policies and Operating Procedures: Code of Ethics, Code of Conduct, Anticorruption Compliance Program, Social Media Policy, Political Involvement and Lobbying Policy, Conflict of Interest Policy and Whistleblowing Operating Procedure.

During the training session, a document (so-called "Pocket Guide"), describing the main content of each Policy and Operating Procedure and including a QR CODE linking to the full version of the explained documentation, was distributed to all participants.

Subsequently, each Team Leader cascaded the training to his/her own team with the aim of covering 100% of the factory population.

The "Whistleblowing Operating Procedure" was enacted in September 2018, in implementation of the Company Code of Ethics and Code of Conduct, as well as of the applicable national and international regulations, and it was lastly updated in December 2022 in compliance with the European Directive 1937/2019.

The training on the Code of Conduct and Whistleblowing Operating Procedure was also conducted in 2024 in Brazil, Egypt, and Turkey by the Internal Audit, Sustainability & Compliance Department. The sessions were delivered to blue-collars using the so-called "multiplicator"

approach, meaning that the Internal Audit, Sustainability & Compliance Department first trained the Supervisors, who then passed on the training to the blue-collar workers.

The Operating Procedure defines communication channels for reporting violations, suspected violations and inducements to commit violations of any laws and regulations, principles enshrined in the Code of Ethics and the Code of Conduct, internal control principles, company rules and Policies/Operating Procedures and/or any other act or omission that may lead directly or indirectly to financial or image damage for the Company. Reporting can be done, also anonymously, through the Online Whistleblowing Platform available on the Company Website and Intranet and which comply with legal requirements and security standards or by contacting the Internal Audit, Sustainability & Compliance Department. In both cases confidentiality of communication is guaranteed.

The "Group Anti-Corruption Compliance Program", available in English and in Italian on the Prometeon Tyre Group's Intranet and Website, was adopted in 2017. Such a program is the corporate reference for the prevention of corruptive practices and sets out a collection of principles and rules aimed at preventing or reducing the risk of corruption. The Company is committed to fight "corruption in any guise or form, or in any jurisdiction, or even in places where such activity is admissible in practice, tolerated, or not challenged in the courts".

With reference to Italian employees, specific trainings are regularly carried out with regard to the Legislative Decree 231/2001 and related Prometeon Organization, Management and Control Model (the "Model 231"), including anticorruption matters. Such trainings are planned to the whole Italian corporate population in case of amendments of the **Model 231** and are supplied for new employees every six months.

In December 2023 the Company updated its Model 231 due to the occurred legislative and Company organizational structure changes. In addition, in order to facilitate users' access to the Model 231, Prometeon Tyre Group has made available a "Legal design tool" that allows users to navigate it in a simple and intuitive manner.

Likewise, specific training has been implemented in Spain in connection with the applicable Ley Orgànica 1/2015, which is the Spanish equivalent of the Italian Legislative Decree 231/2001. The Ley Organica 5/2010 introduced criminal liability for legal entities in Spain through Article 31 bis of the Spanish Criminal Code. According to such Article, companies are accountable for offences committed on their behalf or for their benefit by employees, managers or representatives. However, as for 231 Decree, a company can be exempt from liability if it has adopted an effective Organizational and Management Model and has appointed a Supervisory Body, ensuring its commitment to preventing and detecting criminal activities within its structure.

In order to comply with Article 31 bis of the Spanish Criminal Code, the Organizational and Management Model was adopted by Prometeon Tyre Group España y Portugal, S.L.U (hereinafter, "Prometeon Spain") in March 2018 and reviewed in September 2020.

Furthermore, a Supervisory Body, composed by an external and an internal member, was also appointed. Prometeon Spain's Supervisory Body, supported by HQ Compliance

Department, carries out a periodic analysis of the information flows in order to ensure that internal policies and procedures are complied with internally

In Brazil, there is an Attachment to the Anti-Corruption Compliance Programme in compliance with the Anticorruption Brazilian Law No 12.846/2013 and Decree No 11.129/2022. In 2024, we hosted the 1st Compliance Week LATAM which featured a live training session titled "Business Ethics: our role in the fight against corruption".

It is noted that during 2022, 2023 and 2024 no cases of corruption have ever been detected within the Company.

Referring to the contribution made to the External Community, Prometeon Tyre Group has adopted internal procedures defining the roles and responsibilities of the function involved and the operational process of planning, achieving, monitoring and controlling of results of initiatives supported. Prometeon's procedure specifies that initiatives may not be promoted for the benefit of beneficiaries in respect of whom there is direct or indirect evidence of failure to abide by the human rights, workers, the environment, or business ethics. Prometeon Code of Conduct and Code of Ethics set forth in their turn that the Company "does not give contributions, advantages, or other benefits to political parties or trade union organizations, or to their representatives or candidates, without prejudice to its compliance with any relevant legislation".

In terms of prevention and control, the audits carried out by Internal Audit, Sustainability & Compliance Department at Group affiliates include monitoring of crime risks, among which also the risk of corruption and fraud figure.

In particular, in April 2023, Prometeon Tyre Group adopted the "Gifts made, Gifts received and Donations Operating Procedure" that defines the rules on the management of gifts made, gifts received, donations and contributions by employees, executives and any third parties acting in the name and on behalf of Prometeon Tyre Group ("Prometeon Personnel"). As a general rule, it is forbidden for Prometeon Personnel to make/accept any gifts to/from third parties, except gifts received in the context of holidays and habits and provided that they are customary gifts and can be qualified as being of modest value (modest value meaning gifts with a maximum value of Euro 100.00 or Euro 250.00 in case of gifts collected in a single package). In the event that a gift is received outside the context of habits and holidays and/or exceeds the modest value, the recipient may refuse it or promptly notify the Compliance Department and send the gift to the Human Resources Department, which provides for its reallocation within the Company (e.g. through draws) and/or externally (e.g. in favor of charities).

With regard to donations, the procedure requires due diligence to be carried out on the identity of beneficiaries to verify the actual existence and operativity of the entity and the lack of any actual and/or potential connection and/or conflicts of interest between the Company and the beneficiaries with the support of Administration Finance & Controlling, Internal Audit, Sustainability & Compliance and Human Resources Departments. After to the donation, beneficiaries are required to prove how the resources provided and/or contributions made were actually used.

This procedure reflects Prometeon's commitment to maintaining ethical standards and transparency in its operations while preventing potential conflicts of interest.

Moreover, in December 2023 Prometeon Tyre Group adopted the "Entertainment Expenses Operating Procedure", applicable to Italy only and available on the Company's Intranet. This document sets out the rules on the management of entertainment expenses made by managers, employees and collaborators. The Entertainment expenses are the expenses by which Prometeon provides free of charge goods and/or services to third parties who are commercially interested in the Company and towards whom there are promotional and/or public relations purposes. In particular, the procedure identifies the management process of the entertainment expenses towards individuals and the Public Administration.

This document aims to ensure transparency, compliance, and proper oversight of entertainment-related expenditures, aligning with Prometeon's commitment to ethical and accountable business practices.

In 2018 Prometeon Tyre Group issued its "Prometeon Tyre Group Equal Opportunities Statement". The Company has been and remains firmly committed to complying with the principles of equal opportunities in the workplace, without any form of discrimination on the basis of gender, marital status, sexual orientation, religious or political beliefs, union membership, color, ethnic origins, nationality, age or disability. Moreover, the Company seeks the active support of all Group employees in putting the principles into practice.

As laid down in the "Global Human Rights Policy", the Company's activities are based on respect for global human rights, which are a non-negotiable fundamental value of its culture and corporate strategy, in line with the sustainability model foreseen in the international standard SA8000.

Prometeon Tyre Group promotes respect for human rights and adherence to applicable international standards with its partners and stakeholders and bases its governance model on the recommendations contained in the United Nations Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights, implementing the "Protect, Respect and Remedy" Framework. Additionally, the Company is open to cooperation with governmental, non-governmental, sectorial and academic bodies for the development of global policies and principles aimed at protecting human rights. The latest developments, activities carried out and the performance achieved by the Company are regularly shared with stakeholders, primarily through Prometeon Tyre Group's annual report and the corporate website.

Prometeon Tyre Group's adherence to the UNGC and inspiration for the SDGs are indeed the result of the Company's loyal commitments to both the promotion and protection of respect for universal human rights and to openness to cooperation. The Policies and principles adopted by the Company are not just in line with the Ten Principles of the UNGC, but also instrumental for achieving the SDGs set under the agenda 2030. In particular, the "Code of Ethics", the "Prometeon Tyre Group Equal Opportunities Statement" and the "Global Human Rights Policy", combined with the Company's enthusiasm for cooperation, are of significant importance to

Prometeon Tyre Group in offering its humble contribution to achieve the SDGs for "Decent Work and Economic Growth", "Reduced Inequalities" and "Partnerships for the Goals" by 2030.

Prometeon Tyre Group pursues and supports compliance with internationally proclaimed human rights. The Company's sustainable development strategies pursue various objectives, including continuous improvement in the environmental and occupational health and safety conditions affected by its own activities, in firm compliance with and support of the "Universal Declaration of Human Rights", the "International Labour Organization's Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work", the "Rio Declaration on Environment and Development" and "the "United Nations Convention against Corruption". The Company's firm belief is that, through the application of the policy, Prometeon Tyre Group can offer a humble contribution to global commitment for ensuring present and future generations' conditions and tools for a better quality of life.

Prometeon Tyre Group is committed to comply with the rules laid down by domestic and international laws and regulations put in place to protect free competition. The Company recognizes and promotes fair and loyal competition as a key element for the development of both its own business and the market in general. The "Global Antitrust and Fair Competition Policy" defines the principles which must be followed by all the Company employees and persons who operate on behalf of Prometeon Tyre Group in carrying out business activities.

In matter of antitrust and fair competition, in 2022 Prometeon Tyre Group issued a "Competition Compliance Manual" with the purpose of helping employees to understand basic competition law issues and what is expected to in order to comply with the laws.

In 2022, an administrative proceeding was instituted against Prometeon Tyre Group in Brazil by the Administrative Council for Economic Defense (CADE) for an alleged anticompetitive behavior affecting tyre resale market in several regions of Brazil. On 07/12/2023, CADE General Superintendence issued an opinion recommending dismissal of the investigation. On 28th June 2024 the administrative proceeding was archived.

In 2024, the Turkish Competition Board conducted a preliminary investigation against some companies operating in the field of tyre production and distribution in the automotive sector, pursuant to Article 40 of the Law No. 4054. As a result of the preliminary investigation, in November 2024 a full-fledged investigation started against Turkish subsidiary of Prometeon Tyre Group to determine whether a violation of Article 4 of Law No. 4054 occurred.

In 2024 the HQ Internal Audit, Sustainability & Compliance Department, in order to strengthen Prometeon Tyre Group employees's compliance with existing internal processes and antitrust applicable regulations and best practices, implemented a "Global Anti-trust Program" (the "Program"). The Program consisted of three phases: (I) risk mapping and analysis, through interviews with heads of function globally; (II) documentary analysis of all the relevant key Company Policies and Operating Procedures and drafting of additional documentation; and (iii) training.

With reference to the last phase, 5 training sessions of 2.5 hours each, were conducted globally in local languages (Italian, English, German, Polish, Portuguese, Spanish and Arabic) by lawyers

with expertise in antitrust matters. A training session in Turkish will be conducted in January 2025.

Training sessions were targeted at those specific Prometeon Tyre Group's Departments where antitrust risks are inherent, such as Sales & Marketing.

Integrity and Transparency are two fundamental ethical principles governing Prometeon Tyre Group's conduct, success and capacity to generate long-term growth. In December 2022 the Company issued the "Political Involvement and Lobbying Policy", updated in December 2023, with the aim of setting out its commitments regarding political involvement and responsible lobbying. In accordance with the policy, the Company does not spend corporate funds for political purpose (e.g., contribute to candidates, political parties and political committees) and therefore does related political recipients objectives. any At the same time, Prometeon supports the citizens' civic commitment, including participation in the political democratic process. In particular, employees engaging in personal political activity must do so strictly as private citizens (e.g., not on behalf of Prometeon or in such a way as to create the perception that it is carried out on behalf of Prometeon), not during paid work hours, without using Company resources and guaranteeing that conflicts of interest with the Company are avoided and/or duly identified and handled.

Referring to lobbying activities, when the best interest of the Company is at stake, Prometeon may engage in discussions with public decision makers through Prometeon's employees, consultants or associations, in accordance with applicable laws. Lobbying activity must be exercised in the interest of Prometeon with the consequence that should be encountered a real or potential conflict of interest situation, the Company must be immediately informed in order to apply the relevant existing policy and to avoid the persisting of the conflict.

Prometeon shall not take part in any political lobbying and commits to disclose lobbying expenditures, when required by relevant applicable regulations.

Concerning the "Compliance with limitations on relationships issued by authorities Policy", Prometeon Tyre Group is committed to the utmost promotion and protection of respect for Universal Human Rights, Global Peace and Justice. In line with its commitment, the Company complies with the provisions issued by national, international and supranational authorities such as the United Nations, European Union, and the United States of America on the limitations of relationships with governments and/or natural and legal persons based in countries where gross human rights violations and armed conflicts are currently taking place, such as Syria, Sudan, North Korea, Iran and Cuba. Therefore, Prometeon Tyre Group is not engaged in business activities with the aforementioned countries and subjects thereof. Moreover, Prometeon Tyre Group constantly verifies and monitors, and support its subsidiaries to verify and monitor the integrity of its clients and collaborators also in the non-sanctioned countries or in those countries subject to less invasive restrictions, to ensure that the business is always operated in compliance with applicable sanction and export control laws. In fact, before starting business relationships, the Company verifies, also through digital platforms, if the entity itself and the entity's legal representatives are included in any sanction lists. Only in the event of a negative

outcome of the analysis, HQ Compliance Department give green light to proceed with the registration of the client.

For the purposes of ensuring compliance thereof, the functions involved are also requested to verify – before the contracting phase – the presence or absence of restrictions on the type of product/service offered or to be purchased in the country in which the sale/purchasing is to take place. The Chief Financial Officer of each company within the Prometeon Tyre Group must ensure compliance with any restrictions that may have an impact on the management of banking and treasury services (e.g. termination or suspension of payments to an entity/country) and must report any breach or suspected breach of the provisions of the Policy without delay to the HQ Compliance Department and to the Chief Financial Officer of the Group for the necessary and appropriate audits and resulting actions, without prejudice to the civil, administrative and criminal liability of the entity that has carried out the violation of such requirements.

European Union, OFAC, United Nations and other national and international authorities at worldwide level have imposed sanctions against Russia in response to the invasion of Ukraine on 24 February 2022 and the annexation of Ukraine's Donetsk, Luhansk, Zaporizhzhia and Kherson regions. In particular, new targeted restrictive measures (individual sanctions), economic sanctions and visa measures have been issued in addition to the existing measures already imposed on Russia since 2014, following the annexation of Crimea and the non-implementation of the Minsk agreements. At the same time, new sanctions have been imposed against Belarus in response to its involvement in the invasion of Ukraine.

In particular, up to now the European Union has adopted fifteen packages of sanctions in such respect. The Company regularly analyzes the European and international applicable legal framework, carefully identifying the risks arising from every transaction involving the Russian Federation and Belarus and adopted an "enhanced due diligence" approach in order to neutralize the risks, avoiding every possible negative impact for the Prometeon Tyre Group.

Furthermore, in 2023 the Compliance Department also carried out, in the context of a "Sanctions and Export Compliance Program", a risk assessment and a gap analysis aimed at identifying and mapping risks related to international sanctions and export control. The risk assessment activity represents the basis for the adoption of a "Global Sanctions and Trade Compliance Manual", through which Prometeon reaffirms its commitment to ensuring that all Group entities, subsidiaries and individuals comply with applicable economic sanctions and export control laws in all jurisdictions in which they operate.

In addition, as part of this program, in 2024 a new digital tool has been adopted and is being set up in order to monitor and neutralize third parties 'risks related to international sanctions and export control.

In 2022, 2023 and 2024 Prometeon was not involved in any proceedings or investigations as a consequence of sanctions and export controls laws' violations.

With reference to **Privacy**, the year 2024 saw consolidation of the Cybersecurity and Privacy Committee, which meets every three months in order to manage properly any issues related to

these matters. In Brazil, during 2024 the Record of Processing Activities was duly updated according to Brazilian Data Protection Law No. 13.709/2018.

In Turkey, activities aimed at strengthening compliance with the Turkish Data Protection Law No. 6698 have been carried out in 2024. Furthermore, meetings with consultants with in-depth knowledge of the subject are held on a monthly basis.

Please note that during 2022, 2023 and 2024, Prometeon was not involved in any proceedings, investigations or inspections by data protection authorities, either within the European Union or elsewhere.

The "Operating Procedure Regarding Personal Data Breach" defines the implications of personal data breaches in order to allow Prometeon Tyre Group S.r.l. and its controlled companies (branches and subsidiaries) in Europe to set an effective and consistent approach on how to manage personal data breach cases.

As regards Enterprise Risk Management, the year 2024 witnessed further consolidation of the Risk Committee created at the end of 2021 in order to identify, monitor and assess risks which could affect the Company's value and goals achievement. The aim of the Committee is to ensure that risks identified within all the Group Companies are managed properly, through prevention and neutralization of such risks in a systematic and structured way or rather seizure of advantages of potential additional opportunities by aligning business strategy with event identified. The "Operative Instruction on Internal Risks Monitoring" published in 2022 states the instructions regulating composition of both HQ and Local Risk Committees, frequency of the meetings and activities that should be performed by the committees. At HQ level, the Group Risk Committee discusses and analyzes the information and reports provided by the Local Risk Committee. More precisely, risks are categorized in 3 typologies (external, strategic, and operational) and, for each risk identified, event probability, impact, related provisions and remediation plans have to be studied. In other words, the Risk Committee activities allow the Group to have an overview of risk position across the functions and countries. The activities related to the Risk Committee were kept fully operative in 2024.

The Risk Committee reports monthly to the main shareholders on the most relevant risks according to the requirements and criteria defined by the same shareholders. The alignment of the activities carried out in the Risk Committee and the Board is ensured thanks to the presence of the General Manager in both bodies. For further information please refer to "Risk Factors and Uncertainty" paragraph discussed under the present Dimension.

The "Health, Safety and Environment Policy" lays the Company's foundations for ensuring the well-being and protection of people's health, safety and environment in conducting and developing business activities.

Prometeon Tyre Group pursues and supports international compliance with human rights. Publishing its "Corporate Social Responsibility Policy", Prometeon Tyre Group has internally diffused and at the same time communicated its guarantee for a correct balance between sustainability and industrial development, reaffirming the Company's firm belief to its

commitment to help ensuring that present and future generations will enjoy the conditions and possess the tools necessary for a better quality of life.

Even if Prometeon Tyre Group, as a tyre manufacturer, does not own either natural rubber plantation or processing plants, it is committed to promoting, along the entire natural rubber supply chain, a sustainable, transparent, traceable and responsible production and transformation process, that: (i) takes care of people, respecting human rights and ensuring workers' health, safety and welfare; (ii) takes care of environment, protecting ecosystems and preserving forests and resources; and (iii) respects local laws and applicable international regulations, standards and best practices. In this regard, in November 2018 Prometeon Tyre Group adopted the "Sustainable Natural Rubber Policy", that in 2023 has been integrated with the "policy framework" required by Global Platform for Sustainable Natural Rubber ("GPSNR") and approved by the latter. In February 2024, the updated Policy was approved by the General Manager and made available on Prometeon Tyre Group Website and Intranet (for further details on this Policy please refer to "Sustainability Committee HQ – GPSNR Adherence and Implementation" discussed under the present dimension).

It is noted that the current problems concerning global peace, justice, and rule of law as well as ending all forms of violence and torture against children and adult people remain as one of the most difficult challenges to overcome for creating a sustainable world and ensuring a bright future for all of us. The Ten Principles of the UNGC and the SDGs require urgently from Global Business Community to take concrete steps and implement efficient solutions. As the cause at stake is directly related to the fundamental values of both the humanity and Prometeon Tyre Group, the Company is endeavoring to achieve the SDG for "Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions" through cooperation with national, international and supranational authorities.

Prometeon Tyre Group shares international concerns about the conflict in the Democratic Republic of Congo ("DRC") and adjoining countries (so-called "Conflict Region") and is working to ensure that the mining of Tin, Tungsten, Tantalum or Gold (so-called "Conflict Minerals") and Cobalt that end up in its products does not contribute to human rights violations, financial crimes, as well as the financing of armed conflicts in the Conflict Region.

Indeed, the Company recognizes the existence of significant risks which are also associated to negative impacts regarding the extraction, trade, handling and export of Conflict Minerals and Cobalt from the Conflict Region.

Regarding Cobalt, although it is not formally defined as a "Conflict Mineral", its extraction contributes to the violation of human rights in many areas of the world, therefore the Group has decided to treats cobalt as a "Conflict Mineral".

In this regard, in December 2023 Prometeon updated the "Conflict Minerals and Cobalt Sourcing Policy" adopted in 2018, in order to publicly declares its commitment to: (i) promote the responsible mineral sourcing practices from Conflict Region; (ii) support the aims and objectives of the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission rules and regulations related to the supply of Conflict Minerals and Cobalt; (iii) ensure that the sourcing of Conflict Minerals and Cobalt within its supply chain happens through responsible mineral sourcing practices; (iv)

ensure that Conflict Minerals and Cobalt used in its products and originating from the Conflict Region have been certified as "conflict free".

In particular, Prometeon expects its suppliers to undertake reasonable due diligence along their supply-chain to assure that the Conflict Minerals and Cobalt are only being sourced from mines and smelters outside the Conflict Region or, if sourced within the Conflict Region, which have been certified as "conflict free" by an independent third party. Suppliers must immediately inform Prometeon should they believe that any product provided, or expected to be provided, to Prometeon is not "conflict free". When evidence arises that Conflict Minerals and Cobalt are being sourced from Conflict Region and/or that they are not "conflict free", Prometeon reserves the right to immediately suspend and/or terminate the relationship with the related supplier. Prometeon Tyre Group annually schedules audit on suppliers of raw materials to verify their level of compliance with Group requirements.

During the year, no business transactions have been carried out with any supplier operating in Democratic Republic of Congo.

Prometeon Tyre Group complies with the laws and regulations of the countries in which it operates, applies to the highest social, economic, ethical and environmental standards, and ensures its commitment to identifying and mitigate risks associated with its procurement process.

In this regard, in December 2023 the Company, in order to increase overall sustainability along supply chain and to meet international standards on supply chain management, adopted the "Global Sustainable Procurement Policy", applicable to Prometeon Tyre Group S.r.l and its subsidiaries. The Sustainable Procurement Policy sets out principles and guidelines that both Prometeon Tyre Group and its suppliers must adhere to throughout their supply chain.

The "General Conditions for the Purchase of Raw Materials, Semi-Finished Products and Auxiliary Materials" have been updated accordingly.

The Company sets Quality at the heart of its "Global Footprint Industrial Strategy" through the recently reviewed "Global Quality Policy" and ensures the implementation of this approach, for example through:

- a cooperative mindset in order to enable quality excellence
- the synergy with partners driven by the principles of internationalism, multiculturalism and networking
- the commitment to continuous innovation of products, services, processes and systems
- the promotion of a corporate and sustainable culture and vision oriented towards Governance and business ethics, Social, Environmental and Economic dimensions
- the protection of people's health, safety and wellbeing in the workplace, as well as the safeguard of the environment throughout the best practices
- specific learning and development activities aimed to empower and strength internal competences.

Moreover, in Brazil, the Company continued with the implementation of the project "Culture Evolution", which is based on three main pillars: Safety, Quality and Compliance, with the aim to plan and deliver a sustainable future. To achieve it, Prometeon Tyre Group is engaging the teams on Culture Evolution journey, reinforcing the way to do things.

As mentioned above, Safety (please refer to Social Dimension in this report), Quality (please refer to Economic Dimension of this report) and Compliance are the key pillars to keep the workplace and employees safe, and products and services well recognized, keeping the image and brand with flawless reputation.

Compliance is based on the principle that the Company's processes, within a good Corporate Governance process, and the actions of employees, must be ethical, in line with procedures and laws. Specifically, the Compliance project has been organized by the end of 2020 and implemented in 2021, guiding employees in the behavior that should be adopted in the performance of activities, seeking adherence to the Code of Ethics and Group policies demonstrating the Company's image of ethics and transparency, internally and externally.

As mentioned above, Safety (please refer to Social Dimension in this report), Quality (please refer to Economic Dimension of this report) and Compliance are the key pillars to keep the workplace and employees safe, and products and services well recognized, keeping the image and brand with flawless reputation.

To ensure that decisions taken at any level are not influenced by personal interests and/or relationships and are made in the exclusive interest of Prometeon Tyre Group, in February 2022 a "Conflict of Interest Policy" was issued and communicated to all stakeholders through the publication in the Company's Intranet and Website.

The Policy sets out specific procedures aimed at preventing the occurrence and correct management of potential or existing conflict of interest situations concerning the employees, suppliers and other business partners. In accordance with the Policy, all employees are requested to disclose any existing or potential conflict of interest. Moreover, commercial agreements with suppliers or customers are to be signed or renewed solely on the basis of objective criteria, including the quality, price and reliability of the business partner in question.

According to the Group's Code of Conducts, Code of Ethics and Conflict of Interest Policy any situation that could generate a potential or actual conflict of interest must be communicated to the Head of Internal Audit, Sustainability & Compliance Department and/or the Group Chief Human Resources Officer.

Upon receipt of a disclosure by any employee or contractor regarding a conflict of interest, the Head of Internal Audit, Sustainability & Compliance Department and the Group Chief Human Resources Officer will consult and evaluate the effective existence of a conflict of interest.

Furthermore, directors should inform the Board and the Board of Statutory Auditors of any conflict of interest with the Company and/or with the representatives of the Public Administration, specifying its nature, details and seriousness.

Should a conflict of interest be detected, the corrective actions are implemented by the Company and, in consideration of its nature and seriousness, a report to the Board is made. According to such principles, no Conflict of Interest was reported to the Board of Directors throughout 2024.

In September 2022 Prometeon issued the "Social Media Policy" aimed to provide guidance on how employees are expected to use Company's and personal social media accounts while working for Prometeon to the extent that such use may affect its business. In fact, whether on one hand Prometeon recognizes the benefits which may arise from an appropriate use of social media, at the same time it is also aware of the risks connected with an unproper use of them, including disclosure of confidential information and intellectual property details, damage to Prometeon's reputation and the risk of legal claims. The Policy states the rules applying to the use of social media to minimize these risks.

With reference to training activities, in 2024 the HQ Compliance Department made available to the whole corporate population a digital training dedicated to "Conflict of Interest" and "Social Media" Policies. The HQ Learning & Development Department constantly monitors the training attendance by all employees, including the newly hired.

In March 2023 the Company issued the "Prometeon Tyre Group Risk Management Approach Policy", aimed at describing the Company insurance risk management approach, which is based on a direct involvement in all negotiations with insurers and reinsurers. The Policy is applicable to the Group.

In October 2023, in line with specific business needs, market conditions, and inflation impact, the "Global Travel Policy", whose main purpose is to establish general rules and principles for travel undertaken by Prometeon Tyre Group employees, was updated.

Regarding the prevention of tax evasion, Prometeon Tyre Group established - according to the Company Code of Ethics - organizational mechanisms aimed at preventing infringements by its employees and external staff of the rules and principles of transparency, propriety and fairness, and checks that these rules are complied with and implemented.

In line with the "Group Tax Policy", the Group conducts all of its business in an honest and ethical manner. Prometeon Tyre Group takes a zero-tolerance approach to facilitation of tax evasion under the laws of any jurisdiction in which Prometeon Tyre Group operates.

The Company is committed to act professionally, fairly and with integrity in all its business dealings and relationships wherever it operates, as well as to implement and enforce effective systems to counter tax evasion facilitation.

In December 2022 the Company issued the "Transfer Pricing Policy", that outlines the methodologies and the underlying principles governing all the types of the intercompany transactions carried out by Prometeon Tyre Group. In particular, the Policy aims at guaranteeing that entities involved in intercompany transactions are remunerated in line with their functional and risk profile, in compliance with the Organization for Economic Co-operation and

Development arm's length principle, pursuant to the "OECD Transfer Pricing Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises and Tax Administrations".

At the same date, the Company updated the "Intercompany Pricing Policy for Financial Transactions", whose main purpose is to define a methodology for the definition of the economic and contractual conditions applicable on all financial transactions performed amongst Group companies, with the aim to ensure the application of the arms' length principle and the fulfillment of tax requirements of all Group companies.

The Company has always been committed to protecting tangible and intangible assets, human lives, information and its reputation from acts of negligence and malice. In this regard, during the year 2024, Prometeon Tyre Group implemented a series of Policies and Operating Procedures related to security matters.

In particular, in March 2024, the Company issued the "Global Corporate Security Policy", with the purpose of providing a framework and a guidance on the minimum security requirements to be followed within each Prometeon site and facilities, in order to maintain security and mitigate any criminal risks that may arise, and the "Global Corporate Security Policy" that provides guidelines that each employee of the Company must observe when accessing all Group's facilities.

At the same date, the Company adopted the "Events Security requirements Operating Procedure", that specifies the requirements for assessing risks at events held at Prometeon and the guidelines for implementing adequate measures to protect Prometeon's assets during such events.

Moreover, in order to provide guidelines on how to respond to "critical events", the Company has adopted the "Critical Events Operating Procedure".

At the end, in August 2024 the Company issued the "Travel Security Policy", to be read in conjunction with the mentioned "Global Travel Policy", to ensure a protocol of actions aimed at minimizing the exposure of Prometeon's employees to any risks during their business trip, and to provide the necessary support in case of safety and security needs.

Prometeon is an equal opportunity employer and does not discriminate in employment with regard to race, color, religion, national origin, citizenship status, ancestry, age, sexual orientation, marital status, physical or mental disability, military status or any other characteristic protected by law. In May 2024, Prometeon Tyre Group through the "Global Talent Acquisition Operating Procedure" provided an overview of the guidelines and criteria that the Company is required to adhere to throughout the talent acquisition process.

In addition, during the year 2024, the Company worked on the drafting of the "Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Policy", which will be approved and published in 2025.

In July 2024, through the issuance of the "Procedimiento Operativo de prevención y actuación ante situaciones de acoso", Prometeon Tyre Group España y Portugal S.L.U expressed its commitment to create and keep a safe and harassment-free workplace, showing zero tolerance towards this type of behaviors. The Operating Procedure describes the procedure for reporting,

managing and preventing harassment situations in the workplace, in compliance with the requirements of the Organic Law 3/2007 of 22 March 2007 on the effective equality between men and women and the provisions of the applicable collective agreement. The Operating Procedure applies to the Spanish company only and represents a derogation from the Global Operating Procedure OP-3 2019 on Whistleblowing. Following its issuance, a training session was organized in July 2024 to explain the main contents of the document to those responsible for guaranteeing its practical implementation at local level.

PROMETEON TYRE GROUP'S APPROACH TO TAXATION

In line with the "OECD Guidelines" ⁵ (to which the Company adheres), Prometeon believes that a coherent and responsible approach to Tax is an essential element of its sustainable business development. Consistently, Prometeon tax governance, outlined by the Group Tax Policy, is aimed to set up a tax governance system with the purpose of:

- promote a general tax culture within the Group
- mitigate possible tax risks
- enhance control over the Group tax situation
- outline guidelines to be followed, assign the related roles and responsibilities, as well as define the authorization processes in order to ensure:
 - i) compliance with the relevant local and international tax laws and regulations
 - ii) transparency, honesty and fairness in managing tax activities
 - iii) complete and accurate fulfilment of tax obligations
 - iv) adequate information flows towards management and stakeholders
- ensure that the tax affairs are managed in an efficient, effective and sustainable manner
- establish a collaborative, constructive and transparent approach towards local tax authorities, in order to develop and sustain a fair and honest relationship and prevent possible tax disputes.

The Group tax strategy is defined by the HQ Tax Department, in accordance with the Board of Directors' vision.

The HQ Tax Department oversees and coordinates each local Tax Departments, defining applicable guidelines and supporting them (or the local CFO/Administration Department) in managing tax matters.

In order to assure visibility and information, enhance the control over the Group tax situation, timely identify any tax risk and activate any necessary actions, the local Tax Departments, CFO and Administration Department are responsible for:

- formalize computation results in a dedicated form in order to represent the situation related to corporate income taxes and deferred taxes and analyze and explain any discrepancy compared to the previous tax situation. In particular, it has to be outlined any tax efficiency/inefficiency achieved, reporting related explanations and identifying any possible action of improvement
- share the year-end tax calculation with in-charge tax advisors, in order to assess its consistency with applicable tax laws and regulations, as well as the accuracy of the computation
- send the tax calculation form to HQ Tax Department and HQ Financial Statements
 Department
- account for tax items in compliance with approved computations and deadlines provided for both local financial statements and reporting package sent to HQ
- verify that the transfer pricing documentation complies with local applicable laws and regulations and report to HQ Tax Department any possible local obligation (requested by law) or suggested by tax advisors
- draft the Transfer pricing report and transmit to HQ Tax Department on a yearly basis
- report to the HQ Tax Department the profitability situation related to cross-border infra-group transactions on a quarterly basis (except for the Brazilian, Turkish and Egyptian subsidiaries which shall perform and share the profitability computation on monthly basis)
- monitor that prices applied to intra-group transactions are "market prices" and consistent with the applicable local transfer pricing policies and report to HQ Tax Department
- assure the traceability and availability of the intercompany prices applied and resulting profitability for at least 5 years (or for the extended period provided by the local Statute of Limitations), in case of tax audits or incoming requests by the tax administrations
- promptly notify by e-mail the HQ Tax Department of any other ad hoc tax information or request received by the local Tax Authorities, as well as of any possible exceptions or missed deadlines related to tax return preparation and submission and/or tax payments, along with resulting payable fines /delay interest
- monitor, with the support of in charge tax advisors or in-house tax attorney tax laws and regulations changes, non-routine operations planned/started by the Company and changes in accounting records, in order to promptly detect significant impacts on corporate income tax or other current and deferred taxes. In case a significant change or a non-routine operation occurs or is expected to occur within the next 12-month period, it shall be promptly reported to HQ Tax Department
- monitor, with the support of tax advisors in charge, the availability of tax credits, tax exemptions or tax incentives allowed by local tax rules and/or Government Regulations.
 In case of any potentially available benefit, inform and get approval from HQ Tax Department ahead of using /accounting for such tax incentives/exemptions or credits

- manage relationships with tax or Customs authorities, in coordination with the HQ Tax Department, which shall be timely and fully briefed, with a collaborative, transparent and fair attitude
- provide full, accurate and truthful answers to the authorities' queries, in case of audits
 by the competent authorities, through the coordination of in charge tax advisors. In
 addition, inform immediately the HQ Tax Department, that may require further details
 and provide instructions to be followed during the audit
- not conclude any agreement and not sue with tax authorities without HQ Tax Department's prior authorization.

REPORTING PROCEDURE - WHISTLEBLOWING POLICY

Prometeon Tyre Group has established a whistleblowing procedure to address reports of breaches, suspected breaches and inducements to breaches of laws, regulations and principles outlined in the Code of Ethics. This includes concerns related to equal opportunities, discrimination, mobbing, corporate policies and any action or omission that could cause financial, reputational, or operational harm to the Group.

In accordance with Directive UE 2019/1937 and best practices, in 2023, the Company launched a new digital whistleblowing platform, called "Whistlelink", replacing the previous email channel (ethics@prometeon.com). The platform, accessible 24/7 via the Company's intranet and website, enhances the independence, reliability and confidentiality of the reporting process. It supports multiple languages and allows employees, customers, suppliers and other external stakeholders to report unethical, illegal, or inappropriate behaviors. Whistlelink is referenced in all contracts with providers and customers, ensuring accessibility and transparency.

For Italian employees, reports related to Legislative Decree 231/2001 can also be directed to the Supervisory Body via a dedicated email (odv.ptg@prometeon.com). Additionally, concerns may be submitted by regular mail.

Prometeon guarantees the confidentiality of whistleblowers' identities and complies with the highest privacy and security standards. Whistleblowers are protected from retaliation and discrimination. All concerns are thoroughly assessed and investigated by the Internal Audit, Sustainability & Compliance Department, which involves relevant corporate functions for verification and implements necessary disciplinary or legal actions when reports are substantiated.

During 2024 the Whistleblowing procedure was activated 68 times. Each report was reviewed, and the Company remains committed to addressing concerns effectively and transparently, in full compliance with applicable regulations.


Whistleblowing recap for 2024 and 2023

In detail:

- The 68 reports referred to 11 different countries/regions, including the UK, LATAM & MACC, Mexico, Hungary, Italy, Egypt, Turkey, China, USA, and Poland, as shown above
- 5% of the reports (3 cases) were submitted via email address ethics@prometeon.com
- 85% of the reports (58 cases) were submitted via the Whistlelink Platform
- 10% (7 cases) were directed to management, which involved informing the Internal Audit,
 Sustainability & Compliance Department according to corporate rules
- 35% of the reports (24 cases) were signed, while 65% (44 cases) were anonymous. Of the 24 signed cases, 9 were reported by external stakeholders and 15 by internal stakeholders.



Actions overview

Regarding the 68 reports for which analyses were completed with the involvement of relevant corporate functions, it has been determined, based on the activities conducted and the documentation provided during the assessment, that:

- Reported facts were confirmed in 30 cases, while in 25 cases, the reported matters were generic and assessed as unfounded or not substantiated.
- The 30 confirmed cases mainly involved management misconduct, complaints about business processes and other types of misbehaviors. Appropriate actions have been taken, including disciplinary measures and corrective interventions to improve processes and strengthen the internal control system
- Investigations and analyses are still ongoing for the remaining 13 cases.

The Internal Audit, Sustainability & Compliance Department periodically reported the reports received, and the progress of the analyses conducted to the management.




COMMUNICATION AT THE SERVICE OF THE END-USERS





Prometeon website homepage










Monthly follower growth synthesis




Engagement synthesis by topic





DIVERSITY MANAGEMENT

Prometeon Tyre Group operates in a multinational context, where individuals embody significant diversity. The conscious and effective management of such diversity generates both a competitive advantage for the Company and a shared social value. Prometeon Tyre Group's commitment to ensuring equal opportunities and promoting diversity in the workplace is formalized within the Group's primary sustainability document: the *Ethical Code*, approved by the Board of Directors and signed by the Chairman. This document has been distributed to all employees in English and published on the Company intranet.

While respecting the cultural specificities of each country in which it operates, all Prometeon Tyre Group subsidiaries adhere to shared corporate values, policies and rules, which are applied at Group level and communicated in English to all employees.

To ensure equal opportunities and mitigate the risk of potential violations, Prometeon Tyre Group provides employees, suppliers and external stakeholders with the possibility to report any suspected breaches anonymously through the Group's Whistleblowing procedure. In 2024, Prometeon Tyre Group continued to monitor and enforce the new Whistleblowing procedure introduced in 2022 (for further details refer to the dedicated paragraph "Reporting Procedure – Whistleblowing Policy" under the Governance & Business Ethics dimension of the current report).

Internationality and multiculturalism represent key pillars of Prometeon Tyre Group's identity. Operating in over 20 countries, the Company considers cultural diversity and inclusion fundamental elements in shaping its corporate identity. This commitment is reflected both in the Code of Ethics and in the principles promoted by the Sustainable Development Goals ("SDGs"), in particular SDG 10 "Reduced Inequalities" and SDG 8 – "Decent Work and Economic Growth", which inspire the Group's vision. In line with these principles, Prometeon Tyre Group is committed to providing equal opportunities to all employees — regardless of gender, culture, religion, or other characteristics — by offering international mobility opportunities and training programs.

Prometeon Tyre Group is committed to ensuring equal treatment for all individuals in order to enhance diversity and inclusion and avoid potential discrimination issues among the Company.

As a starting point of this path towards a stronger diversity, equity and inclusion culture within the organization in 2021, the Company focused on gender equality assessment. This initiative aimed to evaluate gender equality using both qualitative and statistical data, identifying concrete actions to support and enhance diversity within the Company. The analysis covered the regions of Brazil, Egypt, Turkey and the Company's headquarters, involving managers and white-collar employees.

The insights gained from this assessment have been instrumental in shaping the Prometeon's ongoing commitment to diversity and inclusion within the years. As a direct outcome of this initiative, the Company has been working on the development of a structured **Diversity**, **Equity & Inclusion Policy**, aimed at formalizing and strengthening its approach to equal opportunities and set to be published in 2025.

Furthermore, it is important to note that, in 2024, no incidents of discrimination occurred within the Company. All whistleblowing reports submitted through the established channels were thoroughly investigated and analyzed. Interviews with the individuals involved were conducted, whenever possible, and the investigations concluded with no evidence of discrimination. This reflects Prometeon's rigorous approach to addressing potential issues and ensuring a workplace free from discrimination.

With regards to the standard salary paid to new hires employees during the first year in the Company, it must be highlighted that the total amount provided to the employees is higher than the minimum prescribed by law and no difference between gender is made. The following procedures and activities to promote equal opportunities have been established as follows:

- introduction of new initiatives aimed at respecting cultural and religious diversity (e.g. different and clearly marked diets in canteens, kitchens typical of different cultures from that of the host country, dedicated prayer room in HQ building in Milan, Italy)
- welfare and work-life balance initiatives (refer to the paragraph "Internal Communication and Community" and "Local activities" of the social dimension of the current report)

LOCAL ACTIVITIES

Europe

In Europe, the new model has been implemented following the main guidelines defined by Headquarter. "Smart Kit@Home" has been structured following three enabling factors with the aim to better support employees' daily work providing the best conditions to carry out professional activities.

Here below the activities carried out:

- All colleagues enabled to work in Smart Working received IT equipment (monitor, keyboard and mouse)
- Benefits for an ergonomic workstation (professional office chair and table)
- A fixed allowance to cover costs of Mobile Phone (calls and internet line).

Turkey

In Turkey, for the application of Blended Model which officially started on September 2021 and still on going in 2024, employees working remotely signed an additional agreement contract. Smart kit@home has been provided to all "Prometeons' smart workers" including ergonomic chair, headphones, mouse, keyboard and monitor.

As part of the Workplace Enabler initiatives, several actions have been introduced. In the Istanbul office, the workspace layout has been redesigned in line with the New Way 2. Work approach. Employees can access a dedicated link to reserve their desks, ensuring flexibility and better space management. Additionally, a new application has been introduced for shuttle reservations, allowing employees to book their seats and track shuttle routes and stops in real time.

Egypt

In Egypt, the implementation of the new model offers employees the opportunity to work remotely, with mandatory remote work ("Smart Working from Home") every Sunday. The **Smart Working Policy** was introduced at the beginning of 2022 and communicated to all employees, and it continues to be applied in 2024.

To further support employees, the following tools have also been provided: laptops, mouse, keyboard wireless, headset, mouse pad, notebook & internet Wi-Fi.

In addition, in 2024, Prometeon Egypt renovated its admin building and built a new R&D center to improve the workplace of the employees. The admin building now features new workstations for the Supply Chain and Procurement teams, as well as dedicated spaces for the HR, Legal and Finance teams. Furthermore, new meeting rooms were added to facilitate team discussions and collaborations.

The renovation also focused on improving ergonomics with more comfortable workstations and furniture, creating a better environment for employees. The design of space helps improve communication between teams.

The new R&D center provides a dedicated area for research and development, equipped with modern tools and resources to support innovation in the laboratory. It also encourages collaboration between the R&D teams and Quality Department, further enhancing teamwork across the Company. These updates are designed to improve work efficiency, comfort.

Moreover, a large fishpond and peacocks were introduced to improve the workplace environment, alongside the creation of dedicated break areas for employees.

Americas

In the Americas region, the new working model was introduced in four countries — Brazil, Colombia, Mexico, and Argentina - and has been consistently applied throughout 2022, 2023 and continues in 2024. The working model is based on 60% of the time of the week at the office and 40% remotely and involves 100% of the population eligible to apply smart working conditions. In Brazil, the local policy agreement was signed in October 2020. Employees who adhered to the agreement received a booklet outlining the guidelines to be followed for the correct implementation of "Trabalho Remoto", including specific IT requirements.

Regarding the "Smart Kit @home" in Brazil, employees received an equipment containing IT tools (mouse, keyboard wireless, headset and notebook) that can enable the remote working conditions.











EMPLOYER BRANDING AND TALENT ACQUISITION

In 2024 in the production sites where the Company operates (Brazil, Turkey and Egypt) and in the offices in HQ and Europe, events, projects and meetings were organized with the aim to promote Employer Branding initiatives, as Career Days, Job Fairs and factory tours. These activities have been carried out thanks to the network and partnerships with prestigious universities in different countries. The collaboration with these academic institutions provided young graduates with the opportunity to work alongside the Research & Development and Industrial Technology teams, as well as other departments such as AFC, Marketing, HR, Procurement, and Supply Chain. This experience allowed them to enhance their knowledge and develop new skills within an international environment, supported by a smart working setup.

ITALY - HEADQUARTER INITIATIVES

At the Headquarter level, Prometeon Tyre Group organized several initiatives throughout 2024, including the renewal of agreements with some of Italy's leading universities, such as Università Bocconi, Politecnico di Milano, Politecnico di Torino, Università Milano-Bicocca, Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore, Università Statale di Milano, Libera Università di Bolzano, Università degli Studi di Trento, Università degli Studi di Napoli Federico II, Università degli Studi di Brescia, as well as the POLIMI Master in Digital Marketing.

Moreover, during 2024 the Company started new partnerships with Università degli Studi di Modena e Reggio Emilia.

Furthermore, in 2024 Prometeon had the opportunity to attend 2 Career Days.

The first event was held at Bocconi University, focusing on internships in staff functions such as AFC (Administration, Finance, and Control), Sales & Marketing and related areas. The second event took place at Politecnico di Milano, with an emphasis on international opportunities of internships and technical roles, including R&D, Quality, Manufacturing, Procurement and Supply Chain.

Participating in these career days provided Prometeon with the valuable opportunity to connect directly with high-potential candidates, showcasing the Company's dynamic work environment and growth opportunities. It also allowed Prometeon to highlight its dedication to fostering young talent through internships programs. A key strength of the Company's presence at these events was the inclusion of interns who had previously attended these universities, alongside

the HR and Employer Branding teams. This approach not only underscored Prometeon's investment in developing future leaders but also served as an inspiring example for prospective candidates.

During the 2024 Prometeon had also the opportunity to attend a special Job Fair – characterized by blind interview. The event, titled "It's a Match," was organized at the Politecnico di Milano by the professor of the master's in design the digital strategy. Before the career day, both employers and students filled out a survey with questions about the requirements of the company for candidates and vice versa, along with some general questions. Based on the cross-referenced results, compatibility matches were formed between companies and candidates, allowing them to conduct interviews.

One of the key benefits of these blind interviews was that they enabled a focus on skills and compatibility without the influence of biases related to appearance, background, or other personal characteristics. This approach ensured a more objective and fair assessment, fostering an inclusive recruitment process that prioritized the qualities and potential of each candidate.

Moreover, Prometeon decided within the year 2024 to renew partnerships and collaborations (started in 2023), with other important organizations and institutions such as:

- HR Community
- Ambrosetti
- World Business Forum

Regarding the HR Community, Prometeon participated in the certification process of Best HR Awards by HRC, presenting various projects in the fields of training, international mobility, well-being and work-life balance for employees. Additionally, for the occasion, a manifesto video was created to showcase the pillars of the HR team's People Strategy at Prometeon. The actors in the video were the HR colleagues themselves, who interacted with animated tyres. The HQ HR team achieved the certification, underscoring their commitment to excellence in human resources practices. This certification brought significant benefits, enhancing the company's reputation and credibility in the industry. The manifesto video served not only as an effective tool for presenting HR values but also as an enjoyable and engaging team-building activity for colleagues.

Moreover, in 2024, as part of its commitment to education, Prometeon collaborated with the company We School on the "NO PRESSURE project". This initiative divided in two waves, involved 130 high school classes across Italy and one Italian school in Egypt. The students were assigned challenges related to Prometeon's areas of Sustainability, Procurement, Product Marketing and R&D. For each of these areas, four mentors (senior managers and executives) were involved in two key phases: a Q&A session, where they shared insights into their professional roles and Company activities in November 2024; and a project review session with improvement feedback, held in January 2025. Finally, in February 2025, these mentors evaluated the projects and select four winning classes, one for each area. The benefits of this project include providing students with practical insights into real-world business challenges, fostering innovation and problem-solving skills and enhancing their understanding of various professional areas. Additionally, the involvement of experienced mentors offered invaluable guidance and motivation, making the learning experience both impactful and inspiring.

BRAZIL INITIATIVES

TURKEY INITIATIVES

During 2024, in Turkey, Prometeon took part in several events aimed at strengthening the Company's Employer Branding, thanks to collaborations with the country's top 10 universities.

Factory Visits & Tour - It is worth mentioning that Prometeon regularly welcomed university students for factory tours. During these visits, the Company provided detailed insights into Prometeon's business environment and core values, thanks to presentations delivered by the Human Resources team. In 2024, Prometeon organized a total of five university visits, offering students the opportunity to tour both the Manufacturing and R&D areas.

In 2024, Prometeon Turkey welcomed and trained a total of 47 long-term interns — 41 at the Kocaeli Factory and 5 at the Istanbul Office — along with 75 summer interns. The Company also had the opportunity to prepare and involve new teammates, who were entrusted with mentoring the interns and supporting their professional development within the organization, for a period ranging from a minimum of 1 year to a maximum of 2 years. The Long-Term Interns also played a key role in employer branding activities. They introduced Prometeon and its innovations to their personal networks, contributing to the Company's visibility and strengthening its employer branding.

A training program was introduced to support the development of long-term interns, who received training in 2024 in the area of Digital Transformation, PowerAutomate, PowerBI Training, Canva in BusinessLife Training and Advanced Excel Program.

Global Digital Job Application Platform - The internal job posting system, initially introduced at the local level in 2023 was rolled out globally. Through this system, employees from all countries can view open positions across different locations and submit their applications.

Graduate Projects support - the Company provided technical support for three academic projects, sharing knowledge and expertise to help students develop their theses. When needed, function managers were also available to work with students and their professors to identify appropriate project topics. In 2024, Prometeon Egypt supported the following projects:

- Tomorrow's Young Calibers Internship Graduates Program On average, the Company hired 25 interns as part of a structured program featuring an initial 6-month contract, renewable for up to a maximum of 2 years. The program welcomes recent university graduates from a variety of academic backgrounds and is designed to support them in their daily tasks while providing valuable learning opportunities through direct exposure to the Company's operations and business environment.

The program, structured into a Business Track and an Industrial Track, spans two weeks and is delivered as a full-day experience, led by Prometeon's internal Ambassadors and trainers.

Universities Students Factory Tours - the Company hosted a total of five factory tours for university students, with each tour welcoming an average of 15 to 25 participants. During the full-day visits, students were provided with an overview of the Company's history, an

introduction to the various departments, and an explanation of the production process, followed by a guided tour of the factory in operation.

These in-factory sessions were conducted by Prometeon's local trainers, offering participants up-to-date expertise on relevant technologies and processes. Each session hosted groups of 20 to 30 students, giving them the opportunity to engage directly with industry professionals and gain hands-on exposure to cutting-edge practices.

Each session hosted between 15 and 20 students, offering them the opportunity to explore potential career paths and gain valuable information for their future studies.



TALENT DEVELOPMENT AT GLOBAL AND LOCAL LEVEL

Performance Pro

Regarding Talent Development, the journey started in 2023 continued during 2024 with new Performance Management process: **PerformancePRO**. The aim of the project is not limited only to the adoption of a new fully digitized tool for the Performance Management but also to provide the Prometeon population with changing mindset and developing a culture of feedback.

Consistently with the Prometeon people strategy, the end stage of PerformancePRO, set for 2026, is to achieve only one annual behavioral appraisal fostering continuous feedback about the performance appraisal.



Performance PRO road map


In line with the planned roadmap, to support the achievement of this ambitious goal, two formal **CHECK-IN** moments have been introduced during 2024.

These two steps of the process took place respectively in June and September, have been an opportunity for managers and employees to give and seek feedback within the Performance Management tool.

During the CHECK-INs, the goals assigned at the beginning of the year were discussed, identifying any obstacles, reviewing priorities and making changes if necessary.

Moreover, thanks to 1-to-1 meetings which provided an important chance to exchange feedback, it had been possible to acknowledge what has already been done, thus, to keep motivation high, and to target any development areas.


All other PerformancePRO steps followed the same timeline with those carried out last year. While **Goal Setting** was completed in March, **Self-Assessment** and **Manager & Matrix Assessment** were done in December. The process is set to be concluded by February 2025 with the 1-to-1 Performance dialogue and will start again with goal setting and objectives assignment.



Performance PRO implementation timeline


Moreover, the delivery of the adoption plan, defined and started in 2023, was carried out also until March 2024 with the aim to support the implementation of the new Performance Management process and the cultural transformation mentioned above.

Regarding the training, in 2024 the learning journey with 2 more sessions which respectively with focus on feedback and goal setting. In order to foster the involvement and increase moments of exchange between participants and the trainers, all sessions are carried out in 8 different languages: Italian, English, Arabic, Turkish, Portuguese, Spanish, Polish, German and French.

Moreover, to pursue continuous improvement regarding training activities, at the end of each session, participants have been asked to respond to an evaluation survey. Results of the surveys highlighted that in 2024 overall satisfaction rating was recorded 3.5 out of 4.

The session regarding Feedback phase had a focus on:

- The meaning of feedback and its importance in Prometeon's new performance management;
- How to foster continuous feedback culture;
- SBI (Situation, Behavior, Impact) model of constructive feedback;
- How to handle difficult pushbacks;

The session regarding the Goal Setting was about:

- A deep dive on the goal setting phase;
- How to cascade goals (for managers only);
- Setting SMART (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant, Time-Based) goals.

Moreover, short tool desks were organized for all participants to give them immersive experience in the Performance Management system to better manage both Feedback and Goal Setting phases.

For all new hires, additional sessions have been organized to ensure they are informed about the performance management process, including its pillars and steps.

Regarding the communication plan, similarly to training, actions started in 2023 continued in 2024 to increase the engagement of all people involved in the learning process. **PerformancePRO** project has been linked to the image of space and galaxy to use the metaphor of the need to pass from each galaxy to complete the learning path. Furthermore, all communications sent to the employees were designed with elements referring to adventure in space, rockets, galaxy, etc.



Sales Pro

2024 witnessed the launch of the **SALES PRO**: the learning path dedicated to Sales, Marketing & Customer Service colleagues to equip them with helpful internal and external knowhow and tools for facing the new challenges of the market within Prometeon rebranding contest.

Thanks to this journey, that is set to last at least till 2026, employees working in Commercial and Marketing Departments will be able to help our brand to position as premium one, spreading Prometeon DNA.



The goals of Sales Campus are:

- promoting a global sale approach;
- fostering knowledge sharing;
- developing a distinctive style to build Prometeon branded sales journey.

The content of Sales Campus program focuses on the following topics:

Marketing & Products:

- o Basic tyre knowledge & Prometeon product range;
- Prometeon product range & SerieO2;
- Pricing policy;
- o Customer Relationship Management (CRM) and use of the B2B platform;

Manufacturing, Quality & Supply Chain:

- Production process overview;
- Claim management;
- Planning-distribution-warehousing processes;

• Finance & Reporting:

- Credit management policy;
- o Profitability;

Soft Skills & Brand Identity:

- o New Mindset:
- o Brand & Role Identity;
- o Sales Skills.

80% of the contents are internally driven, through the expertise and the know-how of Prometeon employees from Marketing, Manufacturing, Quality, Supply Chain, AFC and Brand Departments. Indeed, 14 master trainers among HQ departments and 71 local trainers were identified to respectively design all the technical courses and deploy & deliver the courses.

The selection of these trainers was based on the criteria of active listening, ability to facilitate technical training, good interpersonal skills and fluency in English. Moreover, their role includes to be responsible for technical skills development in local language, codesign with HQ to customize content based on country/region and business needs and to become the local point of contact for contents' delivery. For the purposes of soft skills training, a global external partner was chosen for the 3 modules, 8 hours each.

The Go Live session of Sales PRO was held in February with the launch of a video to announce the starting of the project and the opening of the sales assessment, to understand better training needs, development areas and points of strength of sales managers (99) and sales people (291).

Following this first step of 2024, 26 training editions of 35 hours/each in 8 different languages, for a total of 14 525 training hours have been delivered.

Moreover, to monitor the delivery of the training plan implemented satisfaction surveys were conducted after each session.

Reward Training

In 2024 the HR Compensation & Benefits team launched the new **Salary Review** management process within the Compensation Module of SuccessFactors (same tool used for the Performance Management Process).

At the organizational level, the new management process consisted in a significant change, as historically, this activity was handled by the Heads of Functions and Departments. With the introduction of the new process, responsibility has been shifted to all managers (i.e., everyone with at least one direct white collar employee reporting) with a hierarchical upward approval process.

Therefore, to support this transformation at a global level and to provide them with the skills and tools they need to effectively manage the new Salary Review process, **Reward Training** program has been developed with two key objectives:

 Training on Total Reward & Job Architecture Topics, to provide an in-depth understanding of total reward concepts and role structure, which are essential for effective Salary Review management process; Managing Personnel Themes, focusing on the practical management of these concepts for direct reports and collaborators, ensuring that managers are well equipped to apply the new policies and procedures.

The training program has been divided into two different modules:

- Module 1: Job Architecture
- Module 2: Salary Review Process.

In addition, there were organized single editions of the Success Factor tool (compensation module) to ensure that all people involved are properly trained in the use of compensation software.

The learning path was launched in February 2024 first for HR population (Regional HR Directors, HR Business Partners, Compensation & Benefits teams and Head of HR) and then in March 2024 for all the managers at a global level.

Moreover, the training contents had been customized in 8 languages (Italian, English, Arabic, Turkish, Portuguese, Spanish, Polish, German and French) to ensure maximum understanding and applicability.

Talent Acquisition Training

Furthermore, 2024 saw also the launch and implementation of new Global Talent Acquisition process in line with Prometeon People Strategy and other Talent management processes within the Company - such as Performance Management and Job Architecture – ensuring consistency, transparency, efficiency and quality. Within this context, following the launch of the new Global Talent Acquisition Procedure, a learning path dedicated to the new process was designed to support the adoption and enablement of managers.

The learning path was divided into 2 modules:

Module 1: Talent Acquisition Process (1.5 hours) where an in-depth analysis and a comprehensive explanation of the new Talent Acquisition process, detailing each step to clarify roles and responsibilities of the people involved and align expectations was provided.

Module 2: Behavioral Interview Training which provided managers with a global methodology for selecting the best candidates during the selection process.

The training program was designed to guide managers and HR people through the transition, equipping them with the skills and tools needed to effectively manage the new talent acquisition process.

In total, 28 training sessions were held for the first module and 26 sessions held for the second module at a global level, delivered in local languages. In addition, there were sessions dedicated specifically to HR colleagues and the Leadership Team.

Compliance Training

To reinforce the values that make Prometeon a transparent and responsible workplace, in 2024 the Company continued to invest in Compliance Training.

The year witnessed the continuation of the Code of Ethics & Code of Conduct training to all new hires. Moreover, new e-learning courses about the Conflict-of-Interest Policy and Social Media Policy were launched as well.

The Code of Ethics & Code of Conduct is a document drawn up by the Company to collect within it the set of social and moral rules that Prometeon considers its own which all employees, business partners and other stakeholders are required to comply with. Prometeon or work with Prometeon must comply. The values upheld by these rules consist in Prometeon's identity, and, for this reason, it is the manifesto of the ethical principles of the Company. In specific, it is based on the key concepts of transparency, honesty and fairness.

The Conflict of Interest outlines the procedures for identifying, disclosing, and managing situations where personal interests could interfere with professional duties. It ensures transparency and integrity by requiring employees to avoid actions that could compromise their objectivity.

The Social Media Policy is aimed at providing guidance on how employees are expected to use the Company's and personal social media accounts while working for Prometeon to the extent that such use may affect the business of Prometeon. This Policy applies to all Prometeon employees, including those employed by the subsidiaries and branches, and consultants and covers all forms of social media platforms and applications where users can create and share content and/or take part in online networking.

Human Resources, Compliance and Internal Audit Departments worked together to spread the content of these document to all the Prometeons. To this end, sponsors from each functions were identified to directly engage and encourage colleagues to do the training through customized communications and small gamification actions.

Regarding the training, in 2024, the e-learning course involved for the Code of Ethics & Code of Conduct all new hires and for the Conflict of Interest and the Social Media Policy the entire white-collar employee population of Prometeon, with a total of **1.300 people and 98%** participation rating.

In specific, the Code of Ethic & Code of Conduct training consisted of 2 modules of 20 minutes each. One dedicated to the Code of Ethics and the other one to the Code of Conduct. To promote understanding of the contents and participation, the training was available in Italian, English, Portuguese, Turkish and Arabic.

Moreover, several actions were also carried out to spread the contents of Compliance Training and Sustainability to Blue Collars in factories in Brazil, Egypt and Turkey as well. In particular, "Train the Trainer" sessions on Code of Ethics & Code of Conduct as well as Sustainability in Prometeon were carried out by the Internal Audit & Sustainability and/or Compliance team.

Then, the trained Supervisors of the factories held internal training on the contents to blue collar employees reporting to them. The full completion of this cascading operation, in order to cover the entire Blue-Collar population, is scheduled for 2025.

Moreover, during the training mentioned above it has to be noted that also the Whistleblowing procedure has been explained again in order to guarantee a yearly remind regarding the use of the complaint channel available for all, employees, suppliers, customers and all other stakeholders.

Furthermore, Prometeon launched an **Antitrust training** initiative across all its countries, organized by the Compliance department in collaboration with legal external partners. This program engaged 450 individuals from the Sales, Marketing, and Customer departments, as well as the Heads of HR and AFC. The training sessions began in December and are scheduled to be completed by the first months of 2025.

This initiative aims to enhance awareness and understanding of antitrust laws among employees, ensuring compliance and ethical conduct in all business practices. By involving a diverse group of participants from different departments, the initiative fosters a culture of compliance and shared responsibility. Additionally, the training helps mitigate legal risks and promotes fair competition, ultimately contributing to the company's reputation and long-term success.

Z-Hero Gravity Project- Digital Transformation


Z-HERO GRAVITY project, a significant digital transformation and digital workplace initiative focusing on the MS365 suite (SharePoint, OneDrive, Teams, etc.) was launched in 2024 as well. The aim of the initiative is to transform and improve the working processes by using the full potential of digital tools.

The project began with the DigitalPRO town hall in July, during which it was officially announced emphasizing the importance of the digital transformation journey for the Company's future.

Right after this event, the Digital Workplace survey was launched to all white-collar employees with the aim of identifying the "heroes" —key employees who would lead the implementation and adoption of the new technologies – of the project to a bottom-up election process by their own colleagues.

In the light of the survey results, **24 Heroes** were identified across countries and departments. These colleagues were included in a training path consisting of 5 sessions dedicated to them during which, helped by external partners, they brought real work cases and microprocesses that could be improved and made more agile by using the full potential of MS365.

At the end of this path, in October, again through the results of the above survey, **340 Tutors** were then identified - always proportionally between country and business functions - to form working groups for which the heroes will be responsible for transmitting and cascading the best practices learned during the lessons. Sessions with tutors began between November and December are set to be completed in January / February 2025, with the aim to create a more efficient and collaborative digital work environment, enhancing productivity and communication within the Company.

OFF-SITE 2024 & TEAMBUILDING

In 2024 several off-site and teambuilding activities have been organized.

Leadership Team Off-Site 2024

In February, a two days off-site training for the Leadership Team was organized to:

- Align the Leadership Team with strategic priorities and support the definition and implementation of action plans;
- > Develop a new mindset and widespread level of commitment to implementation of the planned changes and execute the strategy;
- > Define ways to align the entire Prometeon population with the Company goals for the new Performance Management Cycle.

During these two days the Leadership Team had the opportunity to delve into the **5 Chairs Method** by Louise Evans. This approach allowed them to reflect on their behaviors and learn how to manage interactions more effectively.

The workshop began with an introduction to the five chairs:

- 1. **The Red Chair**, representing the "Attack" mode, where individuals react aggressively or defensively
- 2. **The Yellow Chair**, symbolizing the "Self-Doubt" mode, where individuals feel insecure or uncertain
- 3. **The Green Chair**, standing for the "Wait" mode, encouraging patience and reflection before reacting
- 4. **The Blue Chair**, representing the "Detect" mode, where individuals observe and analyze situations calmly
- 5. **The Purple Chair**, symbolizing the "Connect" mode, promoting empathy, understanding, and collaboration.

Throughout the activities, each team member identified which "chair" they tended to occupy in stressful situations and learned how to move towards a more constructive chair. Practical exercises and group discussions helped them recognize their emotional triggers and choose more effective, collaborative responses.

The outcome was a more cohesive and self-aware team, capable of communicating more effectively and supporting each other. This approach not only improved group dynamics but also provided practical tools for addressing daily challenges with greater emotional intelligence and leadership.

Global HR Conference

Moreover, in July 2024, the first global HR Conference was hosted at the Company HQ in Milan, involving all the HR team of HQ and the first line of HR & Organization department of each Country.

During the 2 days spent together the HR colleagues had the opportunity to attend the Hulympics – Human Olympic Games, the games of HR – having the goal to let the HR people think about the role of the function and how to evolve themselves in an ever-changing world.

Through speakers, workshops and laboratories they will have the opportunity to be inspired by new boundaries to face, news limits to define, innovative strategies to share.

In general, these activities were aimed at increasing the sense of teamwork and trust among the people of the groups involved and to foster thinking on topics such as collaboration and the importance of the individual's contribution.



LOCAL LEARNING & EDUCATION

During 2024, at **HQ** and Italy level, the Company provided several training activities to ensure the continuous development of Prometeon Tyre Group's population. Internal and external training sessions were held to increase and strengthen employees' technical and soft skills, such as:

- **Presentation Skills**, with a focus on enhancing employees' ability to effectively communicate and present ideas in a clear and engaging manner
- Better Way Forward, a training initiative aimed at developing strategic thinking and problem-solving skills to drive the company towards continuous improvement, with a focus on the Supply Chain Department
- Project Management, a training program to provide useful tools and techniques for planning, executing, and managing projects efficiently, with an emphasize on R&D, Quality and Manufacturing Departments
- Excel, training on advanced excel functions and data analysis to improve productivity and decision-making
- Focus Group for Employees Under 30-35, to younger employees in discussions to gather and share insights to better understand their needs.

Moreover, during the first half 2024 English and Italian courses through digital e-learning platform were carried out as well, giving all employees the opportunity to their language skills and abilities through one-on-one lessons.

LOCAL LEARNING & DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES

In **Turkey** during 2024 approximately 28k hours of training were delivered, including onboarding programs, technical skill development, soft-skill courses and awareness webinars.

Training needs are identified with the help of skill matrix approach and every year employees' competencies are reviewed together with department managers.

During the year, all learning and development activities are managed through digital systems and solutions except mandatory documents that are required to be collected in paper forms.

In line with development requirements of the program, all employees of Prometeon Turkey organization have been involved in "Behaviors Training". Training contents designed scope of competencies related to Prometeon values and behaviors set. Otherwise, storytelling module followed by behavioral training.

Moreover, to support organizational development, the Country Top Leadership team completed the Team Coaching process, transforming the group potential into performance by navigating change to enable them to work more positively and productively together. After the completion of the process Mentoring – Reverse Mentoring Program, which is a continuation of the Team Coaching, has started. The Country leaders had a chance to sit both sides of the table, becoming both mentors and mentees. The selection process of mentors and mentees was carried out through applications made by volunteering employees. The first group was created by eliminating applications based on performance scores and years of experience according to the specified criteria. Those who could not participate in the program this year will have this opportunity in 2025.

At the same time, in parallel with organizational development, 1 to 1 individual coaching sessions were organized for roles Manager and Directors. After completing the Manager Development program, people focused on their own and unique development areas and thus with the aim to do faster progress with their coaches.

Seven types of development programs were realized in 2024, to support all levels of positions in their competencies, such as new-commers, high performed specialists, high performing Managers, recently promoted leaders and blue-collar management specialists.

What's more, 2nd wave of Kaizen Program has been completed and 3rd wave has started in 2024. New Kaizen Leaders completed their projects and made presentations to other colleagues and their managers. They will be keep going this journey as new Mentors of Kaizen, adding value to the Company in many ways with the ROI ratings of the projects they managed.

To inform and raise awareness among all Prometeon Turkey community on the Company's current agenda, Global Sustainability Projects were shared with all employees through various online and on-site training sessions. HQ Sustainability & Internal Audit team shared sustainability related inititatives and projects related to governance & business ethics, environment, social and economic areas answering questions coming from colleagues in Turkey.

In parallel, training was carried out also by internal trainers to blue collar employees. Moreover, a survey was conducted to understand the needs of sustainability training program and subsequently tailor-made training program was organized for Country Top Management and employees.

In Turkey, university students had the chance to work full-time or part-time in all Departments inside the Company in line with their academic path. In 2024, approximately 41k hours of training have been realized for Blue Collar employees, including onboarding programs, health and safety topics and technical courses needed to improve their job and skills^[1].

In **Europe**, several new trainings have been put in place all over Europe, both technical (e.g. Quality, Finance, and Sales trainings) and soft. These initiatives had the aim to improve employees' skills, their satisfaction and possibility to create career paths.

In **Egypt**, the Company undertook a comprehensive training initiative aimed at enhancing the skills and competencies of the full population. Carried out a total of **62K training hours** and conducted across various categories, including **Health**, **Safety**, **and Environment** (**HSE**), **On-the-Job Training**, **Technical Training**, **International Certifications**, and **Soft Skills Development**.

The training needs were primarily identified through two key tools: the Soft Skills Catalogue and the Departmental Competency Matrix. These tools helped to pinpoint skill gaps across departments, ensuring that the training provided was targeted and aligned with both individual and organizational needs. The focus on closing these competency gaps was critical for improving performance, safety standards, and overall workforce efficiency.

By addressing both technical and non-technical skills, these training activities contributed to building a more skilled, adaptable, and well-prepared workforce, in line with global best practices.





GLOBAL LEARNING KPIs

As regards Long Term Incentive KPIs, with reference to the ESG KPIs for the compensation of the LTI, the Company carried out in 2024 training related to this topic. Regarding the KPIs set for the achievement of the LTI yearly and with the 3 years plan, Prometeon decided to set a KPI dedicated to the training which are not mandatory by law and considered for the calculation of the compensation. INTERNAL COMMUNICATION AND COMMUNITY

Prometeon Tyre Group consistently demonstrates a strong commitment to fostering a positive and inclusive work environment by actively promoting local initiatives dedicated to its internal community and employees. The Company strongly believes that employee well-being, engagement and professional development are fundamental pillars for long-term success.

Through a wide range of programs and activities, Prometeon supports not only the personal and professional growth of its people but also the creation of a collaborative, inclusive and dynamic workplace culture. Whether through health and safety campaigns, diversity and inclusion projects, or employee engagement events, these initiatives reflect Prometeon's ongoing effort to cultivate a work environment where every individual feels valued, supported and empowered to contribute to the Company's success.

The Company's attention to local initiatives highlights the importance of addressing specific regional needs while ensuring that Prometeon's global values—Responsibility, Passion, Courage, Focus on Results and Openness—are embedded in all internal activities. This local-global approach helps strengthen a sense of belonging, reinforces corporate culture and supports the development of a resilient and engaged internal community.

The following section provides an overview of the activities carried out in 2024 across Brazil, Turkey, Egypt and Headquarters. These initiatives are further detailed in the section dedicated to Local Sustainability Committees, within the Governance dimension of the current report.

BRAZIL

In 2024, Prometeon Tyre Group significantly emphasized initiatives dedicated to health, safety, environmental sustainability, diversity and inclusion, particularly in Brazil. These initiatives, which are further detailed in the Governance dimension of the current report, reflect the Company's strong commitment to fostering employee well-being, promoting environmental responsibility and supporting an inclusive workplace culture.

A wide variety of activities took place throughout 2024, reflecting both global awareness campaigns and topics of local importance. These included **World Water Day**, where Prometeon showcased innovative water-saving projects at its Brazilian plants and **HSE Week**, which involved employees through interactive activities, live sessions and emergency drills aimed at promoting safety awareness.

Environmental initiatives also played a key role, including the Cigarette Butt Recycling Project, which combined environmental preservation with social impact by transforming waste into corporate gifts produced by individuals with psychosocial challenges. Additionally, Prometeon Brazil transitioned its entire energy matrix to 100% renewable sources, certified through IREC, significantly reducing its CO₂ emissions.

The Company also actively promoted employee health and well-being through numerous initiatives, including Health Week, vaccination drives, eye health checks and awareness programs addressing mental health, hypertension prevention and the importance of early disease detection. Throughout 2024, Prometeon organized campaigns connected to various awareness months, such as Pink October for women focus disease and awareness and Blue November for men disease prevention, both of which featured consultations, workshops and interactive sessions.

Diversity and inclusion were at the heart of Prometeon's agenda, with dedicated initiatives for Trans Visibility Month, LGBTI+ Pride Month, Black Consciousness Month, and the International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination, reinforcing the Company's commitment to fostering a culture of respect and belonging.

These efforts extended to celebrating special occasions, such as International Women's Month, which featured tailored activities including lectures, personal styling sessions, and employee recognition programs. The year concluded with a Christmas initiative, where Prometeon volunteers distributed nearly 5,000 Christmas kits to employees and their children at the Gravataí and Santo André plants.

TURKEY

In Turkey, throughout 2024, Prometeon carried out a variety of social and employee engagement initiatives designed to foster a sense of community, well-being and inclusion across its workforce. These activities covered a wide range of topics, from **health and wellness** to **cultural and social events**, creating opportunities for employees to connect, learn and celebrate together.

Among these initiatives were the Happy Hours – Breakfast & Barbecue Days, held quarterly in the factory garden, where employees gathered in an informal setting to enjoy time together. Team spirit and collaboration were also encouraged through Bowling, Backgammon and Football tournaments, organized both at the Istanbul Headquarters and the factory, with small prizes awarded to top participants.

Cultural enrichment played a key role, with the launch of **ProClub**, a music and theater club formed by volunteer employees. With guidance from external trainers, the theater team successfully completed its first performance, while the music club continued to develop their talents in the Company's dedicated music studio.

On International Women's Day, employees took part in an Ecological Plant Workshop, where they explored sustainable living practices and planted their own plants with the support of Kokopelli City. Proceeds from the workshop kits supported self-sufficient school garden projects, contributing to a greener future.

To promote diversity and inclusion, Prometeon hosted an Inclusion & Diversity Webinar, featuring an expert external consultant, aimed at raising awareness on these critical topics. Employees and their families also participated in a Cooking Workshop, fostering creativity and connection beyond the workplace.

Employee well-being was further supported through initiatives such as **Office Yoga**, where employees in the Istanbul office learned practical yoga techniques to improve posture and relaxation in an ergonomic work environment, guided by trainers from Wellbees.

For **National Sovereignty and Children's Day** on April 23rd, 2024, the Company engaged employees' children with a **costumed "My Hero" competition** and a painting activity, creating a fun and inclusive family celebration.

Health and well-being remained a central focus, with a series of **Health Webinars** covering topics such as **healthy nutrition**, **heart health**, **and disease prevention**. In addition, **a new well-being app** was launched in Turkey, offering employees access to articles and videos across eight core well-being themes, as well as consultations with psychologists, dietitians and fitness trainers. The app also allows employees to create challenges and clubs to further strengthen their sense of community. On-site services were also enhanced, with **a psychologist**, **dietician and physiotherapist** available at the factory to support employees' individual needs.

Finally, key awareness events such as **HSE Week** and **World Water Day** were celebrated, reinforcing Prometeon's commitment to health, safety, and environmental sustainability through dedicated activities and communications.

EGYPT

Throughout 2024, Prometeon Egypt organized a wide range of initiatives and activities aimed at enhancing employee engagement, strengthening internal cohesion and promoting health, well-being, and cultural awareness. These initiatives, reflecting the Company's commitment to valuing its people and fostering a positive work environment, covered celebratory events, health campaigns, training sessions and opportunities for dialogue and connection across all levels of the organization.

Among the key moments of the year was the **Prometeon Egypt 30-Year Anniversary Celebration** held in May 2024, marking three decades since the construction of the Egyptian plant. During the event, employees who had dedicated 30 years to the Company were honored with certificates of appreciation, personally presented by the CEO. The celebration also included a factory tour for top management, showcasing recent renovations and improvements, highlighting Prometeon's continued investment in modernization and growth.

The **Prometeon Egypt Annual Convention 2024** served as another important occasion, bringing together employees at the start of the year to reflect on past achievements and define future priorities. This event also provided an important platform for new generations of employees to introduce themselves, share ideas and engage directly with senior leadership, further promoting a culture of open communication and collaboration.

Prometeon Egypt also honored traditional, social, and religious occasions, recognizing their importance in Egyptian culture. Throughout 2024, employees received gifts marking key celebrations such as sweets for the Prophet's Birthday, nuts during Ramadan, and cakes for Eid Al-Fitr, as well as greeting cards for Eid Al-Adha. Additionally, through the Company's ID card program, employees were granted discounts on healthcare services, fashion, beauty products, mobile accessories, entertainment, educational services, food outlets, and restaurants, enhancing both their well-being and purchasing power.

To further strengthen employee engagement, Prometeon Egypt continued its tradition of organizing summer and winter trips, offering employees the chance to enjoy time together, reinforcing team spirit and a sense of unity. Similarly, gatherings with employees and the workers' union were held, including a special celebration recognizing the children of employees who achieved top academic results, reinforcing employee loyalty and pride in belonging to Prometeon

The Company also celebrated **International Women's Day** in March 2024, recognizing the contributions of female employees with the distribution of personalized gifts as a token of appreciation and respect.

ITALY - HEADQUARTERS

Throughout 2024, Prometeon Headquarters organized a diverse range of engagement and cultural initiatives, reinforcing the Company's commitment to fostering a strong internal community, promoting its corporate values and enhancing employee involvement. These activities, which brought together employees from different functions and levels, created valuable opportunities for dialogue, collaboration, and shared experiences, supporting both cultural evolution and engagement.

One of the most significant milestones of the year was the launch of **Generation Prometeon** (GenP) during **Prometeon Day** in July 2024. This new communication plan was designed to embed Prometeon's values and leadership model into daily interactions, marking the beginning of a new era for the Company — not only in terms of corporate culture and internal voice, but also in connection with brand identity and product evolution. GenP, which will continue in 2025, aims to create a unified way of presenting Prometeon globally, ensuring all employees become brand ambassadors and actively contribute to shaping the Company's image.

THE WELLBEING OF OUR EMPLOYEES

REWARDS

The remuneration strategy of Prometeon Tyre Group is aimed at guaranteeing a fair and attractive reward package, considering the individual performance, the internal equity, the market practices, the macroeconomic and social environment in continuous evolution.

A fair and attractive remuneration is a key pillar to attract, retain and motivate key people, and, at the same time, to promote a conduct aligned with the corporate culture and values.

Prometeon adopts a **total reward strategy** that includes several tools to compensate its employees who are motivated through a competitive **base salary**, a short-term **variable incentive** evaluated and paid on annual basis, a long-term variable incentive for top management roles and a **welfare offer** that can balance personal and professional needs.

Furthermore, Prometeon total reward strategy previews career plans, **training** and **development** opportunities and **international assignments** possibilities, all aimed to foster professional growth.

The **Compensation and Benefits processes** for the Company **Top Management** is directly managed by the Headquarter Human Resources and Organization Department, specifically by the Global Compensation & Benefits function.

In July 2022, Prometeon Board of Directors approved the "2022 Prometeon Tyre Group Executives Remuneration Policy", a set of principles for a remuneration strategy aimed to attract, motivate, and retain Group Management Team, and support the accomplishment of company strategic objectives, the long-term value creation, and the alignment of Executives interest with company and shareholders perspective.

The policy is proposed by the General Manager to the Board of Directors that approves it.

It describes the main component of remuneration of the company Global Executives: fixed base salary, variable remuneration (short-term and long-term incentive plans), benefits and other reward components.

It provides a reward structure pursuing the correct balance of the monetary component of remuneration and the enhancement of the non-monetary component, always ensuring the remuneration competitiveness on the labor market.

In particular, the salary market benchmarks are provided by the external consultancy company Willis Towers Watson, based on the role covered, the level and the responsibilities of each executive, referring to the following market surveys:

1) General Manager and Strategic Management: "European Western Europe Manufacturing Peer Group" by grade and role at median (P50) level.

2) Key Management and Other Executives: "Local Executives Market" at Median (P50) level.

The remuneration of the Executive population **is reviewed** annually during the *Executives Salary Review Process*, **conducted** by the HRO department at the HQ level.

The increase of base salary or variable incentive level is decided based on two elements: market positioning and performance rate, this last as result of *Performance Management process*. The General Manager is responsible to validate any changes of the remuneration of Executive population and should inform the Board of Director regarding the remuneration of Strategic Management that is established in line with Prometeon Executives Remuneration Policy.

In 2024, the ratio between the annual total remuneration⁸ of the most paid employee and the median of all other employees' annual total remuneration was 140⁹. Looking at the global employees' remuneration average, the median of Company employees decreases of 16.8%¹⁰, while the most paid employee remuneration has increased of 139%.

The data for 2024 have been heavily influenced by:

- the payment of the 3 years LTI plan (2021-2023) in April 2024 for Executives. Excluding the LTI, the ratio between the annual total remuneration of the highest-paid employee and the median annual total remuneration of all other employees' would be 48
- the fact that Prometeon operates in countries experiencing hyperinflation and depreciation of local currencies such as Egypt and Turkey.

The 2021-2023 long-term incentive plan, dedicated to a selected group of Executives, had been paid as cash component in 2024, based on the achievement of Company KPIs related to Profitability, Revenue, Financial Health, and Company sustainability.

Moreover, in 2024, a new LTI plan has been launched with a rolling approach to foster alignment between the management interests and those of shareholders, in creating company value and achieving strategic company objectives. The plan is also intended to enhance engagement and stability through management retention. Beginning with this scheme, Prometeon Tyre Group will be introducing a "rolling" mechanism structured across a series of three-year performance periods ("cycles"), which will start in 2022, 2023 and 2024. Every year, a new cycle - covering the 3 subsequent years – will begin, with each cycle generating a potential award that is equal to 33% of the individual opportunity range of the overall LTIP.

The Board of Directors of Prometeon has decided to maintain an ESG objective for the company executives, in order to enhance management commitment in focusing on Prometeon sustainability objectives.

The Company sustainability KPIs considered in the long-term incentives for 2022-2024 period are related to:

- Suppliers third party audit
- Training
- Waste reduction

The Training ESG KPI used in the long-term incentives for 2022-2024 is also one of the KPIs considered for the Premio di Risultato (PDR) paid to Italian not Executives, agreed with unions on a yearly basis. For year 2024 the maximum achievable amount was 2.500€.

Regarding the **non-Executives population**, Blue Collar salary level and increase is handled in line with CLA negotiation in each country, while White Collars employees are subject to an annual *Salary Review Process* that takes place every year, following the Performance Management closing, and in line with the Global Remuneration Policy for white collars, that has been drawn up in 2023.

In this document the guiding principles of Prometeon's remuneration strategy are stated such as: equal opportunity, fairness and internal/external consistency, that are adopted to guarantee competitiveness and the respect of Company's values.

The main purposes of the policy are:

- to provide a reward structure, always ensuring the remuneration competitiveness on the labor market, and which reflects a balanced pay mix between the monetary component of remuneration (fixed and variable remuneration) and the enhancement of the non-monetary component (benefits and welfare) intended to meet the needs and improve the well-being of employees and their families.
- promote employee engagement and strengthen the sense of belonging, through instruments that encourage direct participation in achieving objectives and company performance.

An external provider has been selected to provide salary benchmarks data to assure that a proper compensation package is offered according to the breadth, complexity and strategic nature of the role held by each employee, anchoring value to the reference local market.

The salary benchmarks are updated on an annual basis. In the case of high inflation, a most frequent update is considered to take into account the inflation's impact on the job market.

The salary increase is defined based on the following variables: remuneration fairness compared to local market, performance rate, inflation of the country and available budgets.

The non-Executives salary review process is managed by the local Human Resources Department, following the guidelines and timing established by HQ Compensation & Benefits.

Starting from 2024, the salary review process was digitalized and managed through SuccessFactors compensation module for all Prometeon white collar across countries. This new tool guarantees a common process with a more transparent and traceable approach.

WELFARE

The welfare initiatives that Prometeon Tyre Group attempt to its employees vary from country to country, in accordance with the specific needs identified in the social contexts in which the affiliates operate.

Each country implements the Group guidelines with a local approach: the affiliates adopt activities, tools and welfare processes aimed at creating collaborative environments and to provide adequate support for the needs of personal life, respecting local regulatory, social and cultural specificities.

A significant focus is always dedicated to the **employee's experience**, meaning the day-to-day life of employees in and outside the office. The objective is to facilitate the sharing of information, administrative tasks, and a better balance between personal and professional life, in particular supporting health care, familiars, employees' free time and flexibility on the job.

Employee experience is more and more important in contexts where employees are performing their role in the new **Hybrid model**, switching between presence in the office and smart working.

Prometeon has implemented and regulated in each country, based on local requisitions and practices, an hybrid model, internally called **New Way 2.Work** (here in after "NW2.W") and the reward initiatives are constantly evolving to support this new context.

In terms of welfare, one of the main focuses of Prometeon Tyre Group is a continuous contribution to support to Health, Social and Medical needs of employees and their relatives.

The Company maintains and updates, in line with local market practices and requirements, various supplemental medical benefit plans. These healthcare schemes vary from country to country in terms of allocation levels and the types of coverage provided. The social benefits recognized by Prometeon Tyre Group (including life insurance, invalidity/disability insurance and travel insurance) are furthermore recognized to all employees, regardless of the type of contract whether permanent, temporary or part-time, in compliance with company policies and local trade union agreements.

In Italy, in addition to Italian public health system, Prometeon Tyre Group ensures to all employees a high level of health care coverage though a medical insurance that covers medical

checks, including dental care and hospitalization for employees and their relatives in addition to Italian public health system.

Moreover, all employees can access to specialistic medical examinations in Milan Bicocca **Polyclinic** and the related costs are completely covered.

Starting on January 2022, the health additional coverage offered by the Company to all non-Executive employees has been renegotiated and a new package offered by Generali through AON is available for all Italian employees; family members can be included with a monthly contribution in charge to employees. This additional coverage offers higher caps and coverage compared to what is provided by the related National Collective Agreement.

In line with the hybrid model and to support employees working from home in their daily spending, the **Ticket Restaurant program** is in place and a lunch voucher with a 9-euro value is assigned for each working day, including if the daily working activity is performed at home. When in the office, the employees can choose between a selection of restaurants and taking advantage of the ticket restaurant program. Ticket restaurants can be used in the main chains of restaurants, supermarkets, and food shops.

At Headquarter level the Company offers scholarship to employees and their children for high school and Universities which are given based on their results of the school year.

Concerning **Retirement - Social Security**, the Company supports its employees who decide to allocate to the Social Insurance Fund (*Fondo Gomma Plastica*) the deferred compensation (*Trattamento di Fine Rapporto*) giving them a proportional amount which is directly deposited in the Social Insurance Fund account.

As every year, to recognize the seniority and the loyalty of its employees Prometeon Tyre Group, the Company assigned **Seniority Bonus Awards** that are previewed to celebrate 20, 25, 30, 35, 40 and 45 years of company seniority. The award consists of an additional monthly salary in November payroll plus a company gift delivered during a celebration moment with colleagues.

Prometeon Tyre Group maintains a continuous focus on the work-life balance of its employees, with initiatives aimed to improve the quality of professional and personal life.

In July 2024 a net amount of 450€ has been granted to each employee to be spent on **Welfare** services and products. The welfare services, available through a dedicated website, include scholarships and books reimbursement, culture and sport, vouchers for supermarkets, shops and public transportation pass. Moreover, it is possible also to allocate the welfare amount to the Retirement fund.

Starting from 2024, to promote sustainable mobility, the company has introduced reimbursement for all employees who have an urban (100€) or extra-urban (200€) annual subscription.

To support parenting, the Company decided to implement and regulate two different solutions: 100% salary integration for maternity leave (maternità facoltativa) and 10 additional days for paternity leave.

Global inflation continuously rose in 2024 higher than seen in several decades with an extended impact worldwide. Prometeon Tyre Group reacted with different approaches: in hyper-inflation countries, such as Argentina, Egypt and Turkey, constant increases during the year have been applied to employee's base salary, in order to maintain the purchase power updated.

In Brazil, Prometeon Tyre Group provides for its employees a health plan that covers most medical examinations and services such as providing, in case of hospitalization, a private room. Employees are covered by medical insurance which provides for healthcare coverage either at local or at national level, through an accredited network of doctors, clinics, and hospitals. In addition to that employees can also benefit from a dental care plan which offers coverage through an accredited network of doctors, clinics and hospitals at national level.

Employees can use a drugstore card to pay **purchases of medicines** which are partially reimbursed by the Company. Moreover, employees and their relatives can ask for an allowance regarding the purchase of optics and orthotics that need to be justified by a medical prescription mentioning the medical necessities. These services are guaranteed to all employees, including retired employees of Santo André plant, which can benefit from the health plan for another 12 months after their retirement.

Along with Social Security Plan, which is mandatory by law, in Brazil, Prometeon Tyre Group offers to its employees the possibility to have access to an additional private retirement plan named *Previdência Privada*. The aim is to complement the old-age pension after the termination of the employment relationship. The subscription of the employee to the Private Retirement Plan is on a voluntary basis, the participation is encouraged by a contribution that the Company adds to the monthly contribution paid by the employee.

In Brazil, employees can benefit from the "shuttle bus" services provided by the Company, which makes round trips through previously defined lines and, in alternative, employees can ask for Collective Transport Ticket from the Company, which is a right provided by the present legislation.

Employees benefit from the **canteen** on site at Santo André and Gravataí plants while employees working in the Commercial Department benefit from "meal card", through which they pay for up to 20% of the cost.

Furthermore, a several options of gym membership is offered to employees and their dependents through the partner company **Gympass** with affordable monthly fees.

To support the employees who have just become mothers, **childcare** is offered for their children up to 6 years of age and part of the monthly fee paid by Prometeon.

In Egypt, Prometeon Tyre Group offers to its employees, their spouses and, starting on July 2020, one child, and starting on July 2021 another child a **private medical insurance** which is completely at Company charge. The employees have also the possibility to have optional benefit which enrolls their children under the umbrella of the coverage at a competitive price. Private health insurance includes medical examination, hospitalization, medications, dental and eye care. A **life insurance** is granted to both Blue and White Collars employees, covering death and disabilities caused by injuries suffered from work accidents.

In **Egypt**, the **Company retirement** plan foresees a one-shot bonus for all employees at their retirement moment.

Employees working in Alexandria benefit from the canteen, where hot meals are served for both Blue and White collar. For employees (both Blue and White collar) who cannot go to the canteen due to work, it is also possible to have a "Fruit basket" and in Cairo employees are entitled to meal allowance. The Company worked on restaurant meal improvements, trying to enhance employee satisfaction, process simplification and control, and diversification of menus served to employees. Moreover, the operation method had been digitalized and supported by a new IT system and meal provision had been assigned to one of the most reputable catering companies in Egypt.

Furthermore, in Egypt, transportation between the City of Alexandria and the Company premises is organized, minibus for Blue Collars, microbus for White Collar employees. The service covers every shift and is not available in Cairo, as most of the employees working there use their own car; for this reason, the Company provides a monthly allowance to reimburse the fuel expenses.

Prometeon Tyre Group also contributes to summer and winter employees' travel, supporting average 25% of the cost and install the rest in 12 equal installments, and providing the service through a travel agency contracted by the Company.

In **Turkey**, a Private Health Insurance ensure to employees and their family the access to health care in hospitals within the scope of ambulatory, patient treatment and a check-up package for employees up to the age of 35 years.

The Private Pension System guarantees a Company contribution that can reach the 100% of the employee's contribution and thus after 5 years enrollment.

A new well-being application has been launched this year called WellPro. Thanks to this mobil application, articles and videos on the 8 main topics of wellbeing, support from psychologists, dietitians and sports trainers, and the opportunity to create challenges and clubs among employees are offered. Moreover, in the factory infirmary there are psychologists, dietitians and physiotherapists to support all employees with their needs.

To support family welfare, a dedicated plan contributes to the expenses of scholarship for employees' children enrolled in first school, high school and university. Specific allowances are previewed for events like childbirth, marriage, maternity and family fatality.

White collar employees can profit from of a "flexible benefits" program that consists in the possibility to choose different welfare services offered by the Company. The program includes also the option of not benefiting from private health insurance made by the Company for his/her family and to allocate all the money to an individual retirement plan offered and managed by the Company.

The Company assigned "points" to the employees instead of gifts for various occasions such as New years' eve, Mother's Day etc, with the accruing of the points employees will be able to purchase various goods through the online welfare system "HEDIYEMO".

Moreover, all employees in Turkey can benefit of the following services: canteen for all employees working in Izmit plant and in Istanbul; employees have a prepaid card, with this card they can eat in a partner restaurant located in the shopping center next to the offices, meals are borne by the Company. The Company provides also services of transportation to and from the Company, in Izmit, shuttle buses are provided to all employees to go from the city to the factory and Istanbul to go and get back from the office.

Employees working in a hybrid model receive a meal card for remote workdays.

Employees who are working hybrid are also provided with office equipment: chairs, earphones, keyboard, monitor and mouse.

Employees with 5, 10, 15, 20, 25, and 30 years of service are awarded plaques and various gifts during a ceremony every December. Wristwatches, gift cheques, additional premiums etc.

Salary increases are made twice a year for white collar employees in order to support the employees' purchasing powers that is impacted by strong inflation Turkey is facing and this is in line with blue collars treatment.

In **Europe** (e.g. UK, Germany, Poland), the Company offers to its managers, their spouses and children, a private medical insurance and, accident insurance to Managers, Sales population, and frequent travelers, who face higher risk in terms of travels.

In **Germany** Prometeon also offers a **private pension insurance to all its employees**. Prometeon Tyre Group acknowledges the importance of taking care of its employees through salary, medical care options, and paid vacation time. Therefore, the Company has decided to offer an additional retirement plan that will help employees now and in their retirement years. This

initiative is aimed at enhancing retention and is considered an excellent tool for attracting and retaining valuable employees, contributing to a more financially sound future.

In the **UK**, the pension plan covers a minimum of 3% of the annual salary of employees, with the company increasing the pension to double (to 6%) of their contributions. In Poland and Spain, the Company provides retirement plans for its employees. In both countries, the contributions for the plan are fully covered by the Company.

In **Poland**, the Company offers to its Managers and Employees, depending on their seniority, a private medical insurance and Accident insurance extendable to their spouse and children. In Poland, we also offer a PPO which is a pension savings program. Employees who have been with the company for up to three years receive an extra 100 PLN per month paid directly to their savings account. Employees with a service period between three and five years are entitled to a monthly payment of 200 PLN. For those with more than five years of service, the payment increases to 300 PLN per month.

In **USA**, the Company currently provides a wide range of insurance benefit programs including medical, dental, vision, disability and life insurances available to you on your first day of employment. Should you elect to participate in the medical/dental/vision programs, you will be required to make a bi-weekly contribution through payroll deduction. The Company also offers you participation in its 401k plan from your start date. The first 6% of employee contributions will be matched by the company at a rate of \$.50 for each \$1.00 contributed.

SUPPLEMENTARY PENSION PLANS, SUPPLEMENTARY HEALTH PLANS AND OTHER SOCIAL BENEFITS

Prometeon Tyre Group has defined contribution and benefit funds, the benefit plans at Group level are:

- Health plans: accident insurance for Company users and the management, full medical tests for the management twice a year, life insurance also for the family (e.g. dental plans, optic, vaccine, etc.), invalidity/disability insurance, additional parental leave and pharmacy discount
- Social benefits: canteen, internal polyclinic based in Milan Headquarter (instrumental examination, therapies etc.), family support as scholarships, summer camps for employees' children, flexible working hours, plenary meeting, funeral expenses support, social security complementary subsidy, and educational school kit (granted to kids up to 14 years old). The Company makes available to employees a dedicated internal website: benefits, discounts with many external partners and providers like a company nursery at discounted prices as well as schoolbooks with discounts for the employees' children.

Moreover, in-house doctor visits and private retirement plan and local pension plan are calculated yearly according to the annual salary, saving schemes.

The Company also maintains various supplemental medical benefit plans at its affiliates according to local requirements. These healthcare schemes vary from country to country in terms of allocation levels and the types of coverage provided. The social benefits recognized by Prometeon Tyre Group for employees (including life insurance, invalidity/disability insurance and additional parental leave) are generally recognized to all employees, regardless of the type of contract whether permanent, temporary or part-time, in compliance with company policies and local trade union agreements.

INTERNATIONAL MOBILITY

International mobility in Prometeon Tyre Group is highly promoted with the aim to enhance cultural and value integration, sharing of experience and professional development, an approach that the Company considers crucial to create and maintain value for the long term.

Prometeon International Mobility Policy has been standardized and shared within all the affiliates, with common treatment rules at Group level that enable uniform management for expatriate employees.

The policy guarantees the application of a fiscal neutrality principle as well as specific benefits in order to support expatriates and their relatives ensuring the application of an equitable and appropriate remuneration package thus facilitating the international mobility within the Group.

At the end of 2024, the active International Assignment in Prometeon Tyre Group were 24. International Assignments have decreased (-6) compared to the previous year.

Movements taken place in 2024 are as following:

- 1. 3 Localization after expat (2 in Italy from Brazil and 1 in Italy from Egypt)
- 2. 9 returns in home country (1 in Turkey from Italy , 1 in Italy from Poland , 2 in Brazil from Turkey, 1 in Italy from China, 1 in Italy from Germany, 1 in Italy from UK, 1 in Turkey from Egypy and 1 in Egypt form Turkey))
- 3. 6 New Expat: 2 from China to Italy, 1 from Egypt to China, 1 From Egypt to Turkey, 1 from Italy to US, 1 from Brazil to Italy.



OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH, SAFETY AND HYGIENE

MANAGEMENT MODEL AND SYSTEM

Prometeon Tyre Group's approach to managing occupational health, safety, and hygiene responsibly is founded on the principles and commitments articulated in the Group's "Ethical Code". These are further elaborated in the "Health, Safety and Environment" Policy, issued in 2017 and available on the Group's intranet, as well as in the "Global Human Rights" Policy and the "Quality" Policy. Specifically, the "Health, Safety and Environment" Policy details the Company's dedication to:

- manage its activities regarding health and safety protection at work in compliance with the laws and all the commitments entered into, as well as according to the most qualified management international standards
- ✓ pursue objectives of "no harm to people", by implementing actions for early identification, assessment and prevention of risks for health and safety at work aimed at a continuous reduction in the number and severity of injuries and occupational illnesses, activating health surveillance plans in order to protect workers from specific risks associated with their business duties
- √ develop and implement emergency management programs to prevent and avoid harm to persons
- ✓ define, monitor and communicate to its Stakeholders specific objectives of continuous improvement of health and safety at work
- empower, train and motivate its employees to work safely involving all levels of the organization in an ongoing program of training and information, aimed at promoting a culture of safety at work
- ✓ promote information and awareness-raising on health and safety issues
- ✓ provide ongoing and concrete support aimed at facilitating the work-life balance
- ✓ manage its supply chain responsibly by including issues of health and safety at work in the supplier selection criteria, the contractual clauses and the audit criteria, also requiring suppliers to implement a similar management model in their supply chain

✓ make available to all its Stakeholders a channel (the "Whistleblowing Policy-Reporting Procedure" published on Prometeon Tyre Group's website and intranet) dedicated to reporting, even anonymously, of any situations that constitute or may constitute a risk for the protection of the health, safety and well-being of people (reference is made to the Paragraph "Focus: Reporting Procedure-Whistleblowing Policy" of this Report).

The **occupational safety management system** was established in accordance with centrally developed procedures and guidelines. This framework ensures a unified approach to communication, alignment, and effective management across the Group.

In 2024, the HSE Incident Management Standard was revised, issued, and implemented across all manufacturing sites. This updated standard provided clearer guidelines on injury classification and reporting, enhancing the accuracy and consistency of injury data.

The Company uses an ISO 45001:2018 certified occupational health and safety management system, accredited by ANAB. RINA Services and TUV Austria evaluated the conformity of Prometeon Tyre Group's system in 2024, as they did the previous year.

Periodic meetings are held at each productive unit with employee representatives (Health & Safety Committee, HQ and local Health, Safety and Environment Departments, and the local unit manager) to review activities done and planned and share workplace risk assessment results.



SAFETY CULTURE

"The Zero Accidents Target" is an important corporate goal. The Company believes that leaders play a key role in risk prevention and that their behavior should set an example for all employees. From an industrial perspective, this goal is pursued through investments in the technical improvement of work conditions while also emphasizing the cultural and behavioral aspects for all Company members.

It is important to follow safety protocols while being aware of individual responsibilities toward oneself, others, and their families. This method, combined with ongoing communication between management and workers, has contributed to a reduction in injury rates.

In particular, beyond reinforcing and consolidating safety culture concepts based on behavior, there has been a further development in the focus on Leading Indicators. These indicators measure the preventive measures that should be implemented and the methods for doing so, as opposed to Lagging Indicators, which are reactive measures such as the number or frequency of accidents.

The **Safety Culture** was communicated through periodic newsletters such as the **Safety Bulletin**, and significant events were published regularly via traditional internal communication channels.

The "Zero Harm" Program (Brazil) focuses on improving governance on safety, organizational structure, clarity of tasks and roles, empowering workers, enhancing communication, sharing objectives, and motivating staff. These initiatives aim to create a psychosocially healthy work environment where employees feel valued and psychosocial risks are effectively managed.

Furthermore, in 2024, as part of the Company's commitment to foster a strong safety culture, **Life Saving Rules** program was launched Turkey. The initiative defines **10 critical safety rules** designed to prevent fatalities and serious injuries by addressing high-risk activities in the workplace.

The Life Saving Rules serve as clear, non-negotiable guidelines that all employees and contractors must follow to ensure a safer working environment. To reinforce compliance and awareness, the program includes **training sessions**, **leadership engagement**, **and continuous monitoring** to drive behavioral change and accountability.

SAFETY TRAINING

Prometeon Tyre Group offers safety training locally at each of its companies. Additionally, there are activities and projects conducted globally that involve multiple countries, aiming to align culture and vision while working towards the Company's improvement targets.

In 2024, the Company continued to organize safety training for all employees, with a focus on new employees.

HEALTH, SAFETY AND ENVIRONMENT ACTIVITIES

In accordance with the Company's policies and aligning with the SDGs "3 Good Health and Well-Being" and "8 Decent Work and Economic Growth", Prometeon Tyre Group aims to promote a healthy lifestyle and increase awareness of environmental and workplace safety.

The Group has established specific guidelines and procedures for implementing management systems, and utilizes a web-based Health, Safety and Environment Data Management (HSE-DM) system. This system, developed and managed by the Health, Safety and Environment Department, enables monitoring of HSE performance and the preparation of various reports for management and operational purposes.

The HSE-DM system collects all the information on accidents, significant first aid, near miss and unsafe behavior occurred at the factories, Group fitting units, equities and logistics units managed directly by the Company (accident analysis, corrective action taken etc.). If the dynamics of a particular case are significant, all the plants are provided with the information via Safety Alert system and urged to conduct an internal audit as to whether conditions similar to the ones that caused the injury at their plants and define in case any possible corrective

measures. By using this system, every site has access to the solutions adopted by other plants and can apply the best choices.

PERFORMANCES

The performances reported below pertain to 2022, 2023, and 2024, covering the same scope of Group consolidation.

The following tables present the number and percentage of workers who are covered by ISO 45001 occupational health and safety management standard certification. This includes both employees of Prometeon Tyre Group and non-employees whose work and/or workplace is controlled by the Company.

All four manufacturing sites where significant activities related to workers' health and safety take place are certified under the ISO 45001 occupational health and safety management standard. The Company Headquarters and R&D Center in Italy, along with commercial branches and subsidiaries in Europe, are currently outside the scope of this certification. However, plans are in place to achieve ISO 45001 certification for the HQ and R&D Center in Italy by 2026.

In 2024, the Company recorded 197 work-related injuries among Prometeon employees, marking a significant reduction from the 250 injuries reported in 2023. Of these, two were classified as high-consequence injuries, resulting in more than six months of sick leave. While our ultimate goal remains zero injuries, these results demonstrate meaningful progress. Notably, the Total Recordable Injury Frequency Rate (TRIFR) dropped from 16,56 in 2023 to 13,36 in 2024 (19% improvement), as shown in the table below.

The significant improvement in workplace safety in 2024 was driven by a targeted approach focusing on sites with higher injury rates. To enhance health, safety, and environmental (HSE) performance, the Company launched several key initiatives and programs.

A dedicated HSE roadmap was established, outlining strategic actions to strengthen our safety culture and risk prevention efforts. This roadmap included:

- Leadership Coaching and Training Enhancing managers' and supervisors' ability to drive a strong safety culture through dedicated coaching and development programs.
- Increased HSE Inspections and Audits Conducting more frequent site inspections and audits to proactively identify and mitigate risks.
- **Department-Specific HSE Committees** Establishing committees within each department with clear goals and responsibilities to drive accountability and engagement.
- Behavior-Based Observation (BBO) Program Expansion Strengthening our BBO program to reinforce safe behaviors and address at-risk actions through continuous feedback.
- Topic-Specific HSE Workshops Organizing focused training sessions on critical safety topics to enhance employees' awareness and competence.

These initiatives collectively contributed to the overall reduction in injuries, reinforcing our commitment to continuous improvement in workplace health and safety.

In 2024, there were zero reported cases of work-related ill health, as shown in the tables below:

FATALITIES

From 2022 to 2024, there were no fatal accidents involving Prometeon Tyre Group employees or contractors working at the Company's operational sites.

HEALTH AND SAFETY INVESTMENTS

Over the nine-year period from 2016 to 2024, the Group invested approximately €25.6 million in health and safety projects, including €2.8 million in 2024 alone.

These investments primarily focused on enhancing safety at manufacturing sites, with key improvements in machine guarding, ergonomics, and mobile equipment safety.

HEALTH AND SAFETY TARGETS

The Company is committed to maintaining a **fatality-free workplace** as a fundamental priority. Ensuring the health and safety of our employees remains at the core of our operations, with a strong focus on risk prevention and continuous improvement.

To further strengthen our safety performance, we have set ambitious targets. Our primary short-term objective is to achieve a **20% year-over-year reduction** in the Total Recordable Injury Rate (TRIR). This continuous improvement approach aligns with our broader, long-term goal of reaching a **TRIR below 5 by 2027**, positioning us among the best-in-class safety performers in the industry, based on U.S. benchmarks.

To achieve these targets, we will continue implementing proactive safety initiatives, reinforcing leadership engagement, and fostering a culture of accountability and risk prevention across all sites.

INDUSTRIAL REALATIONS

Prometeon Tyre Group's approach to **Industrial Relations** is founded on respect for constructive dialogue, fairness, and clearly defined roles. Ensuring and upholding free trade union activities is a core value embedded in the Company's Human Capital Management System. Relations and negotiations with trade unions are managed locally by each affiliate, in compliance with national laws, collective bargaining agreements at the national and/or company level, and the prevailing customs and practices in each country.

The general guidelines are defined by the headquarters and subsequently shared at the local level, ensuring that local departments follow the instructions provided by the headquarters. At local level, these activities are supported by the central department, which coordinates the activities and ensures that the aforementioned principles are observed throughout the Group.

Industrial Relations play an active role in the Company's commitment to health and safety, fostering strong collaboration between unions and workers. As of December 2024, 81% of Prometeon Tyre Group's employees are covered by representative bodies that, together with the Company, regularly monitor and address current issues, as well as develop awareness and intervention programs aimed at enhancing workplace safety and protecting employees' well-being.

Prometeon acts in compliance with statutory and contractual obligations governing overtime, time off, association and negotiation, equal opportunities and nondiscrimination, bans on child and forced labor.

The governance framework for protecting Human and Labor Rights is defined in Prometeon Tyre Group's Code of Ethics and its 'Global Human Rights' Policy, along with the 'Health, Safety, and Environment' Policy and the 'Social Responsibility Policy for Occupational Health, Safety, Rights, and Environment.' These documents are publicly available and have been communicated to employees in both English and local languages

Prometeon Tyre Group's approach has always been characterized by compliance with all legal and/or contractual requirements concerning working hours, the use of overtime and the right to regular days of rest. These requirements are often the subject of agreements with trade unions, in line with the regulatory context of each country. There are no restrictions on workers' right to use their total number of holidays and the period is generally agreed between the employee and the Company.

In addition to the trade union dialogue and coordination between Headquarter and local functions, Prometeon Tyre Group verifies the application of the law, rules and regulations of each country at its affiliates through periodic audits organized and performed on multi-annual basis by the Internal Audit, Sustainability & Compliance Department.

LABOR AND SOCIAL SECURITY LAWSUITS

Prometeon Tyre Group is strongly committed to preventing and resolving labor and social security disputes whenever possible, including through settlement procedures. To support this effort, the Company has established a Risk Committee to assess the status of ongoing lawsuits and evaluate all possible resolution measures, with the ultimate goal of maintaining a low level of conflict within the organization.

UNIONIZATION LEVELS AND INDUSTRIAL ACTIONS

The Company is not able to measure exactly the consolidated percentage of union membership at Group level, due to the fact that this information is not legitimately available in all countries where Prometeon Tyre Group operates.

However, it is estimated that over 81% of Prometeon Tyre Group employees are trade union members. This figure is associated with the historical, regulatory and cultural differences between each country.

In 2024, collective agreements were renewed in Italy, Brazil, Turkey and Egypt, introducing significant updates, as outlined below.

Italy

- Production bonus: new bonus scheme agreed linked to welfare, including also sales force and blue collars
- Lunch Ticket: increase in the daily meal voucher amount (Flexy Card) for all eligible employees
- Parental leave: paternity leave is doubled from 10 to 20 days and the indemnity for maternity leave is fully covered by the Company on top to social security one, guaranteeing full salary for the entire period
- **Mobility**: the company supports employees using annual public transportation subscriptions by covering one-third of the total cost

Brazil

- Flexible Work Arrangements: shift options (6x1, 5x1, 3x3, 3x1) and remote work policies for administrative employees
- Wage Adjustments and Economic Benefits: salary adjustments based on inflation, night shift premium, retirement bonus, salary supplement for leave and profit-sharing plan

- Working Conditions and Safety: job stability for injured workers, mandatory safety training, accident reporting, conflict mediation and protection for pregnant workers
- Benefits & Well-being: health plan, childcare allowance, transportation support and job stability for employees approaching retirement.

Turkey

- Salary increase: annual base salary adjustment split between the first and second half of 2025
- Benefits & Well-being: enhanced provisions for 2025 and 2026
- Attendance monitoring: implementation of the absenteeism tracking system and the Bradford Factor methodology
- Health & Safety Compliance: Implementation of HSE (Health, Safety and Environment) measures and disciplinary actions related to health and safety issues.

Egypt

- Salary increase: base salary increases scheduled for 2024, 2025, and 2026, with defined minimum thresholds
- Shift allowance: increase in shift allowance effective January 2024, with specific percentage adjustments based on shift types
- Merit-Based salary adjustment: increase in merit allowance based on performance evaluations, with specific amounts assigned to different performance levels
- Production incentives: introduction of new segments for production incentives
- Saving funds: increase in the annual saving pool, with specific contributions from the Company and the employees.

INITIATIVES FOR EXTERNAL COMMUNITIES

Prometeon Tyre Group is committed to playing an active and responsible role not only within the Company but also in the broader communities where it operates. Throughout 2024, Headquarters, Brazil, Turkey and Egypt implemented a wide range of social responsibility initiatives, aimed at building a positive impact and supporting local communities through concrete actions.

These initiatives reflect Prometeon's ongoing commitment to contributing to social well-being, fostering inclusive development and supporting projects that promote education, environmental sustainability, health and social inclusion. By engaging with local communities, supporting non-profit organizations and encouraging employee volunteering, Prometeon works to build stronger relationships with its surrounding environments, creating shared value that benefits both the community and the Company.

The following section provides an overview of the key community engagement initiatives carried out in 2024 by Prometeon's Headquarters and across its operations in Brazil, Turkey and Egypt, further demonstrating how the Company integrates social responsibility into its global sustainability strategy.

Some of the local initiatives have already been described in the section dedicated to Local Sustainability Committees, within the Governance dimension of this report, where the role of these committees in promoting sustainability at the regional level is further explored.

BRAZIL

In Brazil, Prometeon Tyre Group reinforced its commitment to social responsibility throughout 2024 by implementing several initiatives aimed at supporting local communities, fostering education and creating opportunities for young talent. These efforts reflect Prometeon's broader mission to act as a responsible corporate citizen, addressing both emergency situations and long-term social development goals.

The year 2024 began with severe summer rains that caused devastating floods across Rio Grande do Sul. In response, Prometeon launched the **Solidarity Action**, mobilizing employees, suppliers and resellers to contribute essential supplies for affected families. The campaign resulted in the collection of 47,240 tons of donations, including clothing, blankets, water, food, diapers, mattresses, and cleaning products. All donated items were delivered through Prometeon's partner carriers to the Gravataí City Hall Social Fund, ensuring proper distribution to those in need. In addition to material donations, 496 employees contributed to a cash fundraising campaign, raising R\$47,110, an amount that was tripled by Prometeon, bringing the total donation to R\$141,330.

Prometeon also continued to invest in **educational and cultural initiatives**. On October 30, 2024, in partnership with Laranjeira Cultural, the Company inaugurated the **Little Great Readers Library** at the **Homero Thon Municipal School** in Santo André (SP). The new space offers 400 books, 210 educational items including toys and games, as well as specially designed furniture to foster reading and playing activities. The library also includes materials for early childhood development, such as rattles, building blocks, and memory games, supporting both cognitive and motor development for younger children.

In addition, Prometeon reaffirmed its commitment to creating opportunities for young people through its Young Apprentice Program, which continued to play a key role in 2024. Developed in partnership with renowned institutions such as Clasa, CIEE, and SENAI, the program offers professional development and hands-on experience to young talents preparing to enter the workforce. During 2024, a total of 317 apprentices gained valuable experience within the Company, supporting their personal growth and career development.

These initiatives describe how Prometeon Brazil integrates social responsibility into its business strategy, combining immediate support actions with long-term educational and professional development programs to foster a more inclusive and sustainable future.

TURKEY

In Turkey, throughout 2024, Prometeon Tyre Group continued to demonstrate its commitment to Corporate Social Responsibility through a series of initiatives aimed at supporting education, environmental sustainability and community well-being.

As part of the "Don't Throw Away & Donate" campaign, organized in collaboration with TEGV-NGO, Prometeon facilitated the provision of quality education for 20 children by collecting and recycling electronic waste, turning environmental action into educational opportunities.

In addition, Prometeon encouraged employee engagement in charitable causes through the Wellbees Step Challenge, where 43 employees collectively walked over 7.6 million steps to promote a healthy lifestyle. As a result, a donation was made to UNICEF, funding the education of one child.

Education support also extended to earthquake-affected areas, with a book donation campaign for a primary school library in Hatay. Employees contributed books, which were used both as Christmas tree decorations at the workplace and subsequently donated to the school.

Prometeon also strengthened its long-standing partnership with TEGV Fireflies, a mobile education project providing educational opportunities to children in areas affected by the earthquake. As a tire donor, Prometeon ensured the safe mobility of the Fireflies education truck, helping it reach more children and continuing its valuable mission across the region.

EGYPT

In Egypt, throughout 2024, Prometeon Tyre Group reinforced its commitment to supporting local communities, with a particular focus on youth development, education and social inclusion, through a series of impactful initiatives that reflect the Company's ongoing Corporate Social Responsibility efforts.

One of the most significant milestones of the year was the official inauguration of the **Youth Building Centre in Alexandria** in June 2024, a project initiated in 2017 and fully supported by Prometeon. Designed to serve both employees and their families as well as the local community, the centre offers dedicated spaces for sports, recreational activities, and educational programs, creating a welcoming environment where families and children can gather, play, and learn.

Prometeon Egypt also continued to play an active role in enhancing technical education, addressing the skills gap between education and industry needs. In 2024, the Company strengthened its collaboration with IECD through the "Seeds of Hope Technical Internship Program," hosting and training six students in the Electrical Maintenance department over a two-month period, providing them with PPE, meals, and transportation.

In addition, Prometeon Egypt maintained its support for the **Technical Education Dual System Project at Al-Amerya Industrial Secondary School**, equipping students with hands-on technical training directly aligned with market needs. The project, which features a fully equipped maintenance and mechanical workshop provided by Prometeon, welcomed 60 students in 2024, offering practical training, transportation, uniforms, personal protection equipment, accident

insurance, daily meals, and monthly allowances, all in accordance with Ministry of Education requirements.

Prometeon also formalized a new strategic partnership with **Elsewedy Technical Academy** (STA), one of Egypt's most reputable dual technical academies. Through this collaboration, Prometeon hosts 24 students per year from El Sadat Industrial School, supporting them throughout a three-year learning path that combines theoretical education with practical, on-the-job training. The program offers rotational training across Electrical Maintenance departments, safety sessions, and technical workshops, equipping students with the skills and knowledge necessary to successfully enter the workforce. Each year, approximately 20 students graduate with an Electrical Industrial Diploma, ready to contribute to Egypt's evolving industrial landscape.

Additionally, Prometeon Egypt upheld its commitment to social welfare through its ongoing partnership with SOS Children's Villages in Alexandria. This collaboration, launched in 2021 and fully aligned with Prometeon Headquarters' global initiative, continued in 2024, providing essential household appliances and furniture to support the daily lives of children living in the village.

These initiatives, further detailed in the section dedicated to Local Sustainability Committees, within the Governance dimension of this report, highlight Prometeon Egypt's holistic approach to community engagement, combining education, youth development, and social support to create long-term positive impact in the communities where it operates.



SOS CHILDREN'S VILLAGES AROUND THE WORLD AND PROMETEON

As a commitment to the external community, in 2021 Prometeon Tyre Group, at Headquarter level started a new partnership with an NGO called SOS Villaggi dei Bambini Italia known at international level as SOS Children's Village which operates globally. The first SOS Children's Village was founded by Hermann Gmeiner in Tyrol, Austria, in 1949. The organization was committed to helping them by building loving families and supportive communities. With the generous support of donors, child sponsors, partners and friends, Gmeiner's vision of providing loving care in a family environment for children without parental care and of helping families stay together so they can care for their children, has grown steadily over six decades.

Today, SOS Children's Villages is active in 136 countries and territories around the world, helping hundreds of thousands of children each year through alternative care, family strengthening, schools, health centers, and other community-based work. Children all over the world are growing up without the care, protection and guidance they need. SOS Children's Villages is there, working with children, young people and families to tackle this global issue on a local level.

The mission of SOS Children's Village is to build families for children in need, helping them shape their own futures, and sharing with them the development of their communities. Over the last 70 years, SOS Children's Villages has supported 4 million children through alternative care and family strengthening.

With this activity the Company supported **SOS Villaggi Bambini Italia** helping them to sustain children and family in need.

In April 2024, Prometeon demonstrated its commitment to social responsibility by taking part in the Milan Relay Marathon, a charity event that offered companies the opportunity to combine sports and solidarity. On this occasion, Prometeon chose to support SOS Villaggi dei Bambini Italia, donating the entire registration fee to the organization. This initiative reflects Prometeon's ongoing dedication to promoting positive social impact and supporting vulnerable children and families through concrete actions.

Furthermore, two other charity initiatives were organized during 2024, involving Prometeon's employee. The first initiative took place in July 2024, where over 30 dedicated employees volunteered their time and effort to set up tents for the NGO's summer camp in Caldonazzo (Trento). Their collective efforts ensured that more than 80 tents were ready to provide a beautiful and welcoming environment for children in need, creating a memorable and impactful experience for the young participants.



Moreover, to continue to give support to this NGO, Prometeon Tyre Group decided also for 2024 to renovate the sending of the e-card for the year end period which has been furnished and customized by SOS Villaggi dei Bambini Italia and thus with the aim to share the commitment of Prometeon with SOS Villaggi dei Bambini Italia as per the constant donations made by the Company. Communication has been sent at a global level to all white collars and for the blue collars the e card has been printed and hung in the factory. Moreover, the e-card has been sent also to suppliers, stakeholders, banks and customers.

SOS Children's Villages - Egypt - Alexandria



Prometeon Tyre Group Egypt developed a new partnership with SOS Children's Villages Egypt in 2022, focusing in particular on the village of Alexandria. This collaboration became even more significant after it was announced that the Cairo village would be closed, with all

children relocating to Alexandria, increasing the need for resources and assistance at that facility.

In 2023, Prometeon Egypt further strengthened its involvement with SOS Children's Villages, responding to priority needs identified during regular site visits. One of the key requests concerned suitable winter clothing for the children, driven by unexpectedly colder winters caused by climate change - a challenge for which the village was not adequately prepared. In addition, with the arrival of children from the Cairo village, there was an urgent need to furnish additional housing to accommodate the growing community.

To meet these requirements, in October 2023, Prometeon Egypt equipped new homes for 102 children, providing kitchen equipment, beds, sofas, fans, and other essential items, ensuring that the living spaces were comfortable and fully functional.

In addition to these tangible contributions, Prometeon's Human Resources team also spent a full day at the village, creating memorable moments with the children through games, celebrations, and playful activities, while also distributing sweets and toys. This day of connection and joy reflected Prometeon's broader commitment to fostering positive relationships and a sense of care for the children.

Furthermore, during a site visit, it was possible to meet the children along with their house mother. These special women, each responsible for caring for nine children per house, have chosen to dedicate their lives entirely to the village. By foregoing the possibility of building their own personal families, they live within the village itself, fully committing themselves to providing education, care, and affection to the children, creating a nurturing environment where they can grow up feeling loved and supported.

The collaboration continued throughout 2024, with Prometeon once again contributing to improve the daily lives of the children living in the village. During the year, the Company provided essential household appliances and furniture, helping to ensure that the children's living spaces were comfortable, functional and well-equipped to meet their everyday needs.



ENVIRONMENTAL DIMENSION

This chapter provides a comprehensive overview of Prometeon Tyre Group's environmental strategy, management systems and performances for the year 2024.

The roadmap for reducing our impact and mitigating risks is also disclosed, with a focus on transition plans and the use of renewable and circular materials.

PROMETEON TYRE GROUP ENVIRONMENTAL STRATEGY

Prometeon's strategy includes a climate transition plan. Our plan is aligned with the Paris Agreement and guided by the Science Based Targets initiative (SBTi). The plan focuses on reducing GHG emissions across Scope 1, 2, and 3, targeting net-zero by 2040. Key initiatives include renewable energy adoption, sustainable product innovation, and circular economy practices. Governance of the plan is integrated into our corporate strategy, overseen by the Sustainability Committee. Progress is tracked using specific KPIs, which are disclosed annually in our sustainability report.

ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

Prometeon Tyre Group is committed to sustainable operations and all production sites have implemented an Environmental Management Systems certified under ISO 14001. These certificates are issued by Certification Bodies accredited by the US ANSI National Accreditation Board (ANAB) and CISQ, the Italian member of IQNET, the largest international network of Certification Bodies.

Our Turkish factory has also implemented an Energy Management System certified under **ISO 50001**.

The Group actively monitors environmental performance at each manufacturing site, R&D center and at the HQ central office through a centralized, web-based Environmental Data Management System (Sphera Cloud Corporate Sustainability - SCCS). This system is managed by Internal Audit & Sustainability dept. in conjunction with Health, Safety, and Environment to ensure consistent oversight across all sites.

Furthermore, through our Enterprise Risk Management program, all environmental risks are closely monitored and assessed by the Risk Committee. Regular updates ensure that the General Manager and Board of Directors are well-informed on key developments in environmental sustainability.

SCOPE OF REPORTING

The performances described here are related to the year 2024 and compared with the two previous years 2022 and 2023.

2016, the year of the Prometeon Tyre Group spin-off as Pirelli Industrial, is set as the initial reference for energy consumption and GHG emissions to assure a consistent benchmark for the group performances.

KPIs and Targets are set for both short and long terms to better manage and monitor the Company progress towards climate neutrality and sustainable use of resources.

Energy consumption, Greenhouse gas emissions, water withdrawals and discharge, waste management, use of solvents are collected and monitored with our SCCS Environmental Data Management System and reported both as absolute values and as intensity values.

The reporting scope includes all our four factories, the new HQ in Milan (from Aug 2024), the R&D center in Cinisello Balsamo (Milan) and the factories' R&D covering more than 97,5% of total group energy consumption and emissions.

Operational control consolidation approach, as defined under the GHG Protocol, has been adopted.

Regarding GHG emissions, scope 1 and 2 are fully disclosed in the aforementioned perimeter and the Company is actively working to implement scope 3 upstream and downstream accounting. Both Location and Market based data are reported.

Starting from this year, Prometeon is also reporting as Group in the CDP platform.

ENVIRONMENTAL PERFORMANCES

The following sections provide a comprehensive overview of Prometeon Tyre Group's environmental performances for the year 2024.

Important results have been achieved.

In 2024, the total electrical consumption of Brazilian factories was fully covered by International Renewable Energy Certificates (I-REC), bringing the renewable share of total electrical energy to 47.8%.

GHG inventory has been completed for scope 1 and 2 and we are working on scope 3.

The market-based figures showed a reduction of total emissions by 22.9% compared to the previous year.

Water and waste management are under control and solvent use is following the planned reduction path.

The commitment and the targets on growing use of renewable and circular materials is confirmed.



ENERGY

The Company monitors, manages and reports its energy consumption through four main indicators:

- Absolute consumption, measured in GJ, including the total consumption of electrical energy, natural gas, produced or purchased thermal energy, LPG and any other used combustibles
- Specific consumption, measured in GJ per ton of finished product
- Specific consumption, measured in GJ per EUR of Operating Income
- Specific consumption, measured in GJ per EUR of Revenue

Data are reported with details on sources of energy, showing trends and having as primary reference the values in the base year 2016.

The Sustainability Energy Plan implemented before the spin-off of Prometeon from Pirelli set a target of 10,98 GJ per ton of finished product for 2016. With production in that year amounting to 264,732 tons, the target was achieved with a value of 10,56 GJ per ton.






Direct -scope 1- and Indirect -scope 2- consumption






Indirect -scope 2- consumption by source


Electrical energy and its renewable share


Steam consumption by source

with an overall renewable share of 30,6%.




Prometeon renewable energy share




Specific consumption in GJ per ton of finished product



ENERGY TRANSITION PLAN


Energy efficiency actions

Further initiatives to target an even more significant improvement in energy efficiency in the mid-term are focused on technological and process changes.

In **mixing**, a **major change in the line configuration and process improvements** with the purpose of increasing productivity, reducing the cycle time and thus energy consumption are in the trial phase.

In semifinishing dept., the replacement of the open mills with extruders for compound feeding is progressing. This will improve not only the HSE conditions, but also the energy efficiency with a total estimated reduction at the end of the implementation of more than 12.000.000 kWh/year (more than 3.500 ton CO2-e/year with an average location-based impact factor).

In **curing**, a project to develop **electrical presses** is ongoing. The new solution with resistances and heated nitrogen is designed to improve process control, while eliminating the need for steam and thus the use of fossil fuel.



Equally important to mention, for the new **Headquarter in Milan**, where we moved in the summer of 2024, we have selected a **LEED** v4 **Gold** certified building (Building Design and Construction: Core and Shell), have installed charging stations for the company bikes and cars and covered **100% of the electrical energy** purchase with **renewable sources certificates**.

These actions and the increasing share of renewable and high efficiency sources of energy create a solid base for the ambition to be carbon neutral by 2040.









GHG AND CLIMATE TRANSITION PLAN

Prometeon Tyre Group recognizes the importance of having a climate transition plan and has set a roadmap toward net-zero.

In 2024 the Company completed the full GHG inventory for scope 1 and 2 and implemented a data collection and reporting system that automatically gathers the energy consumption data and calculated the GWP impact using constantly updated libraries.

With the implementation of the new Environmental Data Management System, the first step for the formulation of our transition plan has been completed. Scope 1 and scope 2 consumption and impact are now fully measured and progress is tracked. We have expanded the scope of reporting to include the HQ in Milan, Italy, the R&D Center in Italy, the company cars, VANs and testing Trucks covering more than 97.5% of our scope 1 and scope 2 impact.


Our transition plan identifies as primary target to be Net-Zero following the 1,5°C path as per Science-Based Target initiative -SBTi- definition by 2040. This challenging plan imposes a roadmap on two parallel rails: the path for a structured definition of mid-term and long-term science-based targets and prompt actions for impact reduction.

During 2024 Prometeon has successfully completed the **Climate Ambition Accelerator**, a **United Nation Global Compact program** to help businesses advance their climate goals and align their operations with the global target of limiting warming to 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels, as outlined in the Paris Agreement. Such program spans six months and includes workshops, peer-to-peer learning, and expert guidance and is designed to provide companies with the knowledge and tools needed to set and achieve science-based emissions reduction targets, fostering collaboration and innovation in addressing climate change.

Our transition plan has set the **year 2025 to develop the scope 3 inventory** and to commit with SBTi.

While we are completing upstream and downstream emissions inventory, we are already working on addressing the main challenges we have identified in our product LCA. In particular, scope 3 category 1 'purchased goods and services', category 11 'use of sold products' and category 12 'end-of-life treatment of sold products' have been identified as the major contributors and addressed with specific actions.

The main actions Prometeon has identified and included in the transition plans for our own emissions (scope 1+2) are, aside the year-on-year efficiency on energy consumption to continue promote improvements in the operations, the increase in the renewable energy share and the switch to biomass fuel for steam production.

The provisional targets for GWP Impact are set with reference to year 2016 (location- and market-based values are the same).




Biogenic CO2 emissions ton CO2


Specific emissions by source in ton CO2-e/ton market-based of finished products



WATER

Water is one of the planet's most vital resources, and at Prometeon we recognize our responsibility to manage it wisely. From minimizing consumption in our manufacturing processes to implementing advanced water recycling systems, we are committed to reducing our impact on this precious resource while supporting the communities and ecosystems that depend on it.

In the environmental strategy of the Group, the efficient and responsible use of water in production processes and at workplaces is addressed comprehensively with actions to improve it from design of the machinery and utilities to facility management activities. Particular attention is paid to the local context of the use of this resource, with action plans identified considering not only the amount consumed by Prometeon Tyre Group but also various external risks concerning local water resources such as water absence, scarcity, and drought.

According to Aqueduct Water Risk Atlas <u>www.wri.org</u> our factories in Alexandria, Egypt, in Izmit, Turkey and in Gravatai, Brazil are in areas classified as under water stress.


Prometeon addresses this issue not only with the required additional disclosure but also focusing its plans for water efficiency and treatment.

The Company monitors and manages its water footprint through two main indicators:

- Absolute withdrawal, measured in megaliters (Ml)
- Specific withdrawal, measured in m3 per ton of finished product


The figures in the following charts and tables show the water data and management performances of the 4 Prometeon factories located in Brazil, Egypt and Turkey. The production plants' performances are monitored on a continuous basis throughout the year as production and is the major driver of water use at the Group level. Other Company premises besides the mentioned factories, i.e. headquarters and R&D center in Italy as well as offices of subsidiaries and commercial branches in Germany, Poland, Spain, Switzerland and the UK are not monitored given the amount of water consumed by these latest is considered irrelevant for reporting purposes compared to the factories.

The year 2024 recorded an absolute withdrawal of 887 mega liters, that compared to the previous year corresponds to a decrease of 4,1% of water withdrawal.

The 2024 trend of the **specific consumption** is positive with a reduction of 1% compared to 2023, reaching the value of **3,05m3/ton**.

Water withdrawal details

In line with the targets set under the Sustainable Development Goal "6 Clean Water and Sanitation", the Company is committed to the improvement of water quality by decreasing the proportion of untreated wastewater, increasing recycling and safe reuse of wastewater.

In 2024 a total of 432 mega liters of domestic and industrial wastewater were discharged. 116 mega liters were discharged into surface water bodies, always in quantities that were marginal in relation to the volume of the receiving bodies and without significantly impacting biodiversity. Before being discharged into the final recipient, industrial wastewater – adequately treated as necessary – was periodically subjected to analytical tests that certify substantial compliance with locally applicable statutory limits.

The results presented in this section show the responsible use of water, which are not solely due to investments and expenses but also thanks to the awareness raising campaigns that the Company organizes in all its offices and factories.











WASTE

Tyre production is a complex process that involves the transformation of various raw materials through specialized machinery and techniques under controlled conditions. The production process and its auxiliary activities (e.g., material storage, preparation, and machinery maintenance) naturally generate by-products. These by-products may result from standard processes, deviations from company standards, or material inefficiencies.

While some by-products and residual materials can be reused within Prometeon's facilities for production, storage, or maintenance, others are deemed unusable or potentially harmful to human health and the environment. Such materials are classified as waste and are managed accordingly. Unusable waste is sent to external facilities for recycling, recovery, or disposal, depending on its specific characteristics.

Waste generated at Prometeon can be categorized into the following types:

- Technical waste (quality scrap): Finished and semi-finished products that deviate from company quality standards.
- Ancillary process waste: Materials generated by activities supporting production.
- Construction and maintenance waste: Discarded materials from the upkeep of production plants, machinery, and infrastructure.
- Packaging waste: Residual packaging.
- Urban waste: Waste from food, beverages, and cleaning activities (e.g., canteen and vending machines).
- Civil and industrial wastewater: Water waste generated from human and industrial activities.
- Scrap product waste: Tyres and components discarded due to market claims.
- Other waste: Materials from on-site sanitary activities.

Prometeon is committed to minimizing environmental impacts through a comprehensive waste management strategy that focuses on:

- 1. **Preventing waste generation**: Streamlining production processes to reduce materials requiring disposal.
- 2. **Maximizing recovery and recycling**: Identifying treatment channels that prioritize waste recovery, gradually eliminating landfill disposal under the "Zero Waste to Landfill" vision.

3. **Improving packaging management**: Optimizing both incoming packaging from suppliers and outgoing packaging for Prometeon products.

The company has set targets to recover more than 95% of its waste by 2025 and achieve a 97% recovery rate by 2030, in alignment with its Zero Waste to Landfill goal.

To further control our impact, we have also set and continuously monitor the specific waste generation by products mass. Prometeon aims to generate less than 60 kg per ton of finished product by 2025 and less than 55 kg per ton of finished product by 2030.

During the year 2024 the following actions were put in place to continue in our path toward our Zero Waste to Landfill goal. Notably, such actions account for a reduction of 4,9% of the total process waste in Prometeon.





Waste recovery rate 2024



Graphs and tables detailing this data illustrate the company's steady progress in waste management. In 2024, Prometeon achieved a **waste recovery rate of 98,2%, reaching our target set for 2030** to dispose to landfill (or incineration without energy recovery) less than 3% of the generated waste.

Our KPI waste generation by products mass has reached in 2024 the value of 60,6 Kg per ton of finished product, in line with the path toward our set targets.



Waste generation by Products mass (kg/ton)












SOLVENTS

Solvents are primarily used during tyre fabrication processes, mainly to reactivate vulcanized rubber. The Company remains committed to reducing solvent use by optimizing processes and promoting solvent-free technologies wherever feasible.

In 2024, Prometeon achieved a **17,8% reduction in absolute solvent consumption** and a **15,3% reduction in consumption per ton of finished product**. This specific index is particularly relevant to the tyre industry, as it reflects the efficiency of solvent usage relative to production output and serves as a key benchmark for operational performance.

The data presented reflects the total solvent consumption at the Company's four production facilities located in Brazil, Egypt, and Turkey.




Total solvent consumption by type

- Reducing raw materials usage and optimizing processes;
- Recycling used materials to be used in new tyres;
- **Rethinking** to new renewable materials and formulations.




"3R" concept

The Company is committed to increasing the use of the following three categories of materials in its products:

- Circular Materials: These materials are created by enhancing the circularity of industrial processes. Prometeon Tyre Group is exploring methods to increase synergies across various industrial sectors, improve industrial symbiosis, and boost the volume of recycled materials utilized in its products.
- Renewable Materials: Materials from renewable, organic sources that respect the environment and human rights without over-exploiting resources or people in the value chain.

 Bio-circular materials: Bio-circular polymers made from monomers derived from used cooking oils or tyre pyrolysis oil. They are a replacement for fossil-sourced polymers or Bio resins are plasticisers deriving from vegetal biomass such as plant seeds (sunflower or canola) or forest-based resins.



Currently, in our production, natural rubber is the main renewable material. Other essential materials like metallic and textile reinforcements, chemicals, carbon black, and synthetic rubber are non-renewable. The total volume and percentage of renewable materials used in 2022, 2023, and 2024 are as follows:



In 2024 Prometeon Tyre Group worked on identifying new materials for replacing all the materials currently used in production by gradually switching to renewable or circular materials. The Company aims to substitute completely the currently used materials by 2050 (and 40% within 2030) at most as follows:

- Synthetic Polymers: **polymers produced from bio-based products**, such as R-OIL -oil obtained from naphtha produced with circular feedstocks, and bio (circular) naphtha obtained from bio (circular) feedstocks-;
- Carbon Black: the Company is evaluating to supply carbon black obtained from two sustainable paths:
 - o Circular Carbon Black: obtained through pyrolysis of end-of-life tyres;
 - Renewable Carbon Black: obtained from bio-based oil produced from organic substances;
- Organic Based Silica: obtained through pyrolysis of rice husk that are enriched in Silica;
- **Bio-based Oil and Resins**: oil obtained from organic sunstances, such as Soybean Oil and Rapeseed Oil, and Resins produced from other organic substances;
- **Vegetable Fatty Acids and Fatty Acid Salts**: fatty acids and their derivates will be sourced from certified supplier in order to ensure the compliance with Prometeon Tyre Group's sustainability principles;
- **Recycled Steel**: the amount of secondary steel used in production will be increased, enhancing the percentage of circular materials involved in the production;
- Reclaimed Rubber: the integration of reclaimed rubber in the production of new tyres will further improve the Company's efforts towards achievement of the overall circularity.



Areas of actions for renewable and circular materials

With the increase in accumulation of waste from vulcanized rubber, the dispersion of these materials in the environment becomes more difficult to manage. Considering end-of-life products as an alternative resource of raw material can be a winning solution both in ecological and economic terms, perfectly embracing the basic concepts of sustainable development and circular economy. End-of-Life Tyres (ELTs) represents one of the most important categories of end-of-life products coming from vulcanized polymeric materials. R&D Innovative Materials Department studies projects regarding the re-use of these materials for production purposes maintaining all the characteristics and performances.

Moreover, the Company worked on projects aimed at developing **new materials that improve durability** of truck and agro tyres and virtual models that can predict tyre performances. In Brazil, R&D Department collaborates with the **University of Campinas** and chemical companies.

In line with the Company's research approach, Prometeon Tyre Group pursues organizing workshops with suppliers to develop and test innovative materials. In this context, the Research and Development Department carried out tests on new polymers and fillers in order to measure the balance between different parameters of performance (wet-dry grip and mileage).

FOCUS: NEW MATERIALS

Nowadays manufacturing companies pay attention to systems that reduce and eventually eliminate waste and manage raw materials scarcity through the circular use of resources. In other words, the focus is on design by developing tyres for both longevity and optimal performance in terms of sustainability, on continuous innovation to improve production processes by employing new and/or alternative raw materials which sustainably reducing waste, energy consumption, gas emission, material loss, recovering waste-streams and, where technically possible, replacing materials that may challenge significantly the material recycling of the tyres.

The concept goes through along the 'whole' supply chain, including purchasing raw materials to the end-of-life of the products. The key is extending product lifetime and closing material loops by implementing sustainable approach with 3Rs concept – Recycle, Reduce and Rethink & Reinvent.

As far as longevity is concerned, the focus is to design and develop tyres in the ways that facilitate repairment and retreading, thus increasing tyre lifetime and reducing environmental impact not compromising tyres performance in terms of safety and efficiency. Attention has to be put also on the type of materials used in production, therefore focusing on circularity of the materials which means exploring new potential sustainable raw materials, which can be reused and recycled, to replace the actual ones aiming to create fully sustainable products.

With these challenges lie ahead, assessment and innovative concepts together with constructive cooperation and development would be necessary along the whole tyre supply chain in order to foster know-how exchange with professionals, developing the new innovative strategies with stakeholders in line with the market trend and evolution. In these circumstances, the focus of the strategies is on durability, maintenance, repairability and upgradability, i.e. circularity of the whole process, aiming to increase products longevity in terms of performance and products utilization rate, as well as to improve material recycling and energy recovery, therefore to design and produce fully sustainable products as mentioned, aiming to protect human health and reduce environmental impact.

Following this purpose, the Company is introducing new materials in tyres formulations that have lower impact on environment. For example, by using silica obtained from rice husk ash to replace the classic silica produced from quartz sand. Rice husk ash is one of the most common agricultural waste; it is an agricultural waste by product from rice milling in the rice production. Moreover, processes which allow to recover energy by burning this waste have been developed. Additionally, from purification of ashes obtained, it is possible to get excellent silica in terms of purity which can be used in the compounds replacing the classic filler materials.

Another key element in the journey into sustainability is the replacement of raw materials deriving from petroleum with bio-based renewable raw materials. For instance, the Company is reducing the use of oils and resins deriving from petroleum and replacing them with ingredients of natural origin such as soybean oil and pine resin. In this way, new product line with high

percentage of renewable and circular materials has been designed and developed; it will be launched in the next future.

On top of that particular focus is put on one of the main components of the tyres as well – Natural Rubber. Natural Rubber is a completely renewable material, and it is mainly produced only in certain areas of the planet, equatorial zone. Prometeon is committed the conservation of forests and biodiversity by collaborating with suppliers which distribute worldwide internationally, reducing therefore the impact in some areas of the world (Malaysia, Indonesia, Thailand) where natural rubber is normally bought. In addition, the Company has adopted "Local 4 Local" supply chain approach which is focused on local sourcing and shorter supply chains in order to reduce pollution from raw materials transportation and the CO₂ footprint.

Over and above that, another element which would be crucial and has to be sustainably managed is tyre waste as it is not possible to erase totally the generation of tyre waste during the production. For instance, an idea has to be put in this field aiming to improve the production processes performance, prevent waste generation and keep it as low as possible, consequently reducing also the materials to be disposed. In other words, it may impact positively economic and environmental point of view.

FOCUS: ISCC+

ISCC+ certification is a voluntary scheme applicable to the bioeconomy and circular economy. It allows organizations to demonstrate, through a management system, the **traceability and sustainability of raw materials**.

In 2024, Prometeon successfully completed the process of certifying its management system for the **Turkish factory** and **began purchasing ISCC+ certified raw materials**.

BIODIVERSITY

Prometeon Tyre Group pays the utmost attention to ensure that corporate activities do not interfere with the biodiversity characteristic of the contexts in which the Company operates. The double materiality analysis carried out in 2024 saw 'Biodiversity' in the list of Prometeon Tyre Group's material impacts. A specific study was carried out on each of the 4 factories located in Brazil, Egypt and Turkey in order to understand and evaluate whether is there any environmental protection site located nearby the production facilities within a range of less than 5 kilometers. This enables Prometeon to manage biodiversity impacts effectively and avoid mismanagement.




END-OF-LIFE TYRES

Tyres that are no longer sufficiently safe or efficient to be reused, even if retreaded, are referred as "end-of-life tyres" (here in after referred as ELTs) and they are practically wastes. ELTs can pose a serious threat to the environment and for this reason must be collected and recovered with specific methods, as the rubber of tyre is made of a mix of very high-quality polymers with exceptional chemical-physical characteristics which remain unaltered even in the recycled rubber obtained from it. It is possible to channel ELTs towards one of two different processes: they can be either recycled, a process where it is possible to obtain new materials or recovered as energy.

As a tyre manufacturing company, Prometeon Tyre Group has a particular sensibility for the environment. In line with its sensibility, the Company pays great attention to both the sustainability of all production processes along the entire value chain and to ensure an efficient management of its products' life cycle in terms of maximizing efficiency in material consumption, waste generation and re-useability, recovery and recyclability of tyres, thus minimizing the negative impact on environment. In this context, regarding product disposal and recyclability, in line with its inspiration for SDG "9 Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure", "12 Responsible Consumption and Production", "17 Partnerships for the Goals", collaborates strictly with many different partners, from suppliers who produce raw materials from ELTs, such as micronized reclaim rubber and recovered carbon black, to organizations and initiatives dedicated to ELT recovery. Thanks to these collaborations, the Company provides tyres with a "second life" and hence contributing to the creation of circular economy as well as reduction of CO2 emissions. The Company collects its ELTs at worldwide level, respecting and even going beyond the minimum requirements set by local laws and regulations.

In general, the year 2024 saw the continuation of Prometeon's endeavor for reaching ELT collection and management targets adopted in the previous years. The targets set for ELT management are based also on the requirements stated by different local legislations in countries where the Company operates through its production plants as well as commercial activities. To achieve its ELT management objectives, Prometeon Tyre Group collaborates with other companies as well as consortium and associations operating in ELT management.



ELT management schemes currently in place in Europe

As regards Italy, ELT management is carried out through partnership with Innovando, a company operating in the field of industrial waste management and member of United Nations Global Compact like Prometeon Tyre Group. The partnership started in 2023 continued in 2024 as well. Thanks to the partnership, the Company kept active and close monitoring on its ELT management compliance operations in Italy, through real-time updates enabled by an advanced ICT platform developed by the service partner. Moreover, in addition to providing data on ELT collection and disposal/recycle/re-use, the platform allows as well to estimate the reduction in the environmental impact associated with the different operations performed on the ELTs. Thanks to all these features of the partnership and technical infrastructure, Prometeon is provided with a high level of compliance as regards its legal obligations regarding ELT management in Italy.

As target for the management of ELT in Italy, in line with obligations set by the national legislation, the Company has the responsibility to collect an amount equal to at least 95% of total weight of tyres inputted into the Italian market during the previous year, like other tyre producers and importers operating in the Country.

Within this context, in 2024, Prometeon Tyre Group overachieved its targets by **collecting more** than 11% of the annual target, thus in full compliance with both its own target and the requirements of the national legislation.

To further increase awareness on ELT management among all stakeholders and to foster the participation of customers and end-users to ELT program in Italy, the Company created a dedicated section publicly accessible on the corporate website dedicated to Italian





Furthermore, the materials that could be recovered and reused in production thanks to the new ELT management would promise a positive contribution to the Company's GHG emission indexes related to Scope 3.

In **Brazil** where without an adequate management, in addition to contamination of surface and underground waters as well as causing wildfires, ELTs can also lead to proliferation of aedes aegypti mosquitoes (which transmits dengue, chikungunya, and zika), with particularly high volumes generated occupying large spaces in cities. In line with the Brazilian legislation which requires tyre manufacturers, importers, distributors and dealers to collect one ELT for each tyre sold in the domestic market, the Company set its ELT target for the Country as recovering ELT equal to 100% of tyres sold in Brazil. To this end, Prometeon Tyre Group collaborates with **ReciclANIP** an initiative created by tyre manufacturers operating in the Country. Thanks to this collaboration, the initiative in 2024 managed about 425.000¹¹ tons of ELTs collected from various tyre producers operating in the Country.


In **Turkey**, the Prometeon Tyre Group is member of LASDER, association founded by tyre manufacturers operating in the Country for the collection and recycling of ELT. The institutional mission of the association is not limited to bearing responsibility for ELT management but includes informing the public about tyre sector and products through training sessions. In full compliance with applicable laws and regulations on requirements from the original equipment manufacturers (i.e. tyre producers) the Company set ELT management target as 80% tyres sold to domestic market customers. Thanks to the collaboration and willingness of Prometeon Tyre Group and other tyre manufacturers in Turkey, in 2024 LASDER managed to recycle a total amount about 213.558 tons of ELTs¹².

Moreover, in Turkey, in late 2023 the Company started to collaborate with a company that recycles and obtains rubber powder from ELTs with the use of high pressure water. Thanks to this collaboration, in 2024 Prometeon managed further 1690 tons of ELTs in exchange of about 108 tons of rubber powder to be used in production process.

In addition to the activities carried out In Italy and countries where production facilities are located, Prometeon Tyre Group is committed to the management of ELTs also in other countries where the corporate reality of the Company is limited to commercial business activities rather than productions.

In **Spain**, similarly to Brazil where the local legislation establishes extended responsibility for tyre producers, Prometeon Tyre Group set the ELT target as 100% of amount of product (pieces) sold in the market. To achieve the target set, the Company works with SIGNUS for the collection and management of ELTs in the Country.

As regards other countries in the western part of Europe, in line with obligations set by laws and regulations in place in **Belgium** and **France**, non-significant markets for Prometeon's business activities, the Company collaborates respectively with Recytyre and Aliapur.

In **Germany**, as local legislation imposes responsibility of paying a specific tax for ELT management on final consumers, the Company does not have neither an activity nor a responsibility for the issue. However, Prometeon, aware of the necessity to promote circular processes, also in 2024 the Company has continued to work on the definition of internal targets to better manage the ELTs current situation in these countries.

In **Poland**, the current legislation requires tyre manufacturers and distributors to recover a minimum of the 75% and to recycle at least 15% of tonnage of the products sold in the previous year. The Company works with Centrum Utylizacji Opon Organizacja Odzysku S.A.. In 2024 the Company paid fees for recovery and recycle tyres sold in the previous year, remaining compliant with the requirements of local legislation.

In **Hungary**, a market considered not particularly significant for the Company's business activities, Prometeon Tyre Group collaborates with Mohu Group to collect ELT. The legislation obliges the payment of "green tax" for 100% of total sales on kilogram basis. The Company was fully compliant in Hungary where green tax was paid for actual sales volume in 2024. In **Czechia** the Company collaborates with ELTMA. In parallel with its commercial performance in 2024, the Company marked an overachievement by collecting more than 170% of forecast expectations. In **Romania** Prometeon started a new collaboration with European Environment Agency, a public administration body. In these two countries (markets which are not particularly significant for the Company's business activities) Prometeon Tyre Group defines recovery plans on yearly basis that then are executed by the two above mentioned partners. In the mentioned Countries, the Company paid fees based on its actual sales volume for 2024.

In **Colombia**, Prometeon Tyre Group is founding member of Rueda Verde, the Country's first selective collection and environmental management system for ELTs. Thanks to its wide coverage across Colombia through 216 points of collections and presence in more than 100 cities, during 2024 the initiative collected more than 3.5 million pieces of ELT¹³.

In **Argentina** where Prometeon has a large and structured commercial presence through a network of more than 120 sales points, the Company, although with no legal obligations, launched a project concerning the ELT management. With commercial incentives based on the amount of ELT collected, the year 2024 saw about **406 tons of ELTs** recovered thanks to collaboration with **Geocycle** and other different companies located in different provinces of the Country.

As regards other countries where Prometeon Tyre Group has a significant presence, such as Egypt and Mexico where currently applicable laws and regulations do not require tyre companies to collect and manage ELTs, the Company monitors closely developments related to the subject. Within this context, Prometeon Tyre Group actively takes place in surveys and discussions related to the subject, exchanging opinions and, where it is possible, studying what the Company can do about the issue without expecting any specific legal requirements.













ECONOMIC DIMENSION

Creating sustainable economic value is the main purpose of Prometeon Tyre Group's business activities.

The Economic Dimension of the Annual Sustainability Report highlights Prometeon Tyre Group's role and its contribution to create a sustainable economy and business environment, explaining how it involves various stakeholders.

Beginning with an overview of the economic value generated and distributed throughout the year, the dimension then explores Prometeon's product design and development activities. It examines the criteria shaping these innovations, such as eco-sustainability, safety, and high-value approaches, which collectively form the foundation of future sustainable mobility.

Subsequently, Prometeon's relationships with its customers and its market approach are presented, along with the latest product portfolio, services offered to customers, and marketing activities undertaken during the year.

SHARING OF ADDED VALUE

In line with inspiration for the SDG "8 Decent Work and Economic Growth", the Ethical Code of Prometeon Tyre Group ratifies the commitment of the Company to operate to ensure responsible development over the long term, while being aware the bonds and interactions that apply to economic, social and environmental dimensions. This is to wed the creation of value, progress of the Company, the attention given to stakeholders and raising standards of living and quality of the environment.

Added value means the wealth created over a given reporting period, calculated as the difference between the revenues generated and the external costs sustained in the period. Distribution of added value among stakeholders allows the relations between Prometeon Tyre Group and its main stakeholders to be expressed by focusing attention on the socio-economic system in which the Group operates.

The Company is committed to establishing and maintaining the necessary procedures to evaluate and select suppliers based on their quality, social and environmental responsibility. As part of its commitment, Prometeon requests its suppliers to adopt a similar management

model, reinforcing responsible practices throughout the whole supply chain, extending beyond its direct suppliers.

In accordance with the "High Value" development strategy, the Company assesses products and services not only in terms of cost but also by considering their overall value. This evaluation includes key factors such as quality, innovation, flexibility, and commitments to economic, social, and environmental responsibility, as well as business ethics. Ultimately, each purchase order is contractually governed by the Sustainability and Business Ethics Clauses.

The self-assessment procedure introduced in 2018 requires new suppliers of raw materials and high value-added (HVA) parts to self-certify their compliance with the fundamental sustainability requirements, respecting key national and international regulations on labor, environmental standards and business ethics. Furthermore, it is important to note that the self-assessment process for all suppliers evaluates and selects them based on their adherence to ESG (Environmental, Social, and Governance) criteria.

In 2024, Prometeon Tyre Group continued its commitment to responsible sourcing by conducting on-site audits in collaboration with a third-party audit company. These assessments aimed to ensure suppliers' compliance with essential social, environmental and business ethics standards. To ensure a thorough evaluation, the Procurement and Internal Audit & Sustainability Departments jointly selected a sample of suppliers across key categories, including natural rubber, chemicals, carbon black and others.

Moreover, in compliance with the requirements and purpose of the "Conflict Minerals and Cobalt Sourcing Policy", introduced in 2021 and reviewed in 2023, Prometeon continued in 2024 to collect data from suppliers dealing with conflict minerals and cobalt. This process aims to ensure that these materials are sourced responsibly and are not linked to conflict-affected areas. (Further details are described under the "Our Policies" paragraph of the Governance & Business Ethics dimension). Prometeon Tyre Group is committed to promote responsible mineral sourcing practices across the overall value chain and to ensure that any contribution to armed conflicts, human rights violations, or unethical business practices is avoided. Based on this principle the Company conducts specific Conflict Minerals surveys on all relevant suppliers following the IPC1755 standard (e.g. CMRT).

Regarding the audit results, for the suppliers who did not meet the required standards, customized action plans are developed with specific deadlines. The plans are subsequently monitored and implemented using different methods based on the severity of the non-compliances.

During 2024, 100% of all new suppliers having collaboration with Prometeon Tyre Group have been evaluated in the area of Environment, Social and Governance.

In 2024, 17 audits on production/sourcing sites of suppliers of raw materials (natural rubber, chemicals, carbon black, cobalt and minerals) have been successfully performed (covering 21%)


of the total annual spending for raw materials) by the third-party audit company to attest their compliance on social standards and impacts.

Moreover, it should be noted that throughout the year 2024, 0% of suppliers were discontinued due to actual or potential negative social impacts identified during the assessment. Below is a summary of the average score results from the 17 audits conducted in 2024 (for each supplier audit can be carried out on more than 1 factory), used to evaluate the overall sustainability performance of raw material suppliers:

Cumulative audits and related spending coverage

During 2022, 2023 and 2024, Prometeon Tyre Group overachieved its targets regarding the audits on suppliers. The total number of audits in the year 2022, 2023 and 2024 is a KPI for the executives' LTI, overachieved with an actual value of 54 versus a target of 46.

The audit conducted by the third-party audit company is based on the SA8000 standard, covering the topics of Child Labor, Forced Labor, Health & Safety, Freedom of Association, Discrimination, Disciplinary Practices, Working Hours, Remuneration and Supply Chain Management Systems.

In compliance with this standard, each supplier must answer the questions on the corresponding checklist, with each question being scored on a scale from 1 (lowest) to 5 (highest). Each score is accompanied by the auditor's evaluation, and based on it, three types of non-compliance can be identified: minor, major and critical. Based on the results of the audit, the action plan proposed by the third-party audit company, and our commitment to adhering to all ethical standards, a monitoring action is undertaken for each non-conformity, including minor ones. The entire process of monitoring corrective actions is fully managed by the Sustainability and Internal Audit Department.

Critical non-conformities occur when there is a violation of workers' fundamental rights. This is the most serious form of non-compliance. On the other hand, major non-conformities refer to a systematic violation of a requirement or a significant deviation from the reference standard or Code of Conduct. Lastly, minor non-conformities represent an isolated violation or a less significant deviation from the reference standard or Code of Conduct: although it is of lesser importance, it is still required a corrective action, though with less urgency than a major or critical non-compliance.

In the case of minor non-conformity, the Internal Audit and Sustainability Department sends a formal email to the supplier, emphasizing the importance of addressing the issue and setting a deadline of three months from the receipt date. The supplier must respond by providing the necessary documentation and evidence to demonstrate that the non-compliance has been

addressed, and the appropriate corrective actions have been implemented. If the supplier fails to provide feedback within three months from receipt of the request, a second reminder will be sent, to which the supplier must respond within one month. If the supplier continues to remain unresponsive (despite the reminders), the minor non-compliance will automatically be upgraded to a major non-compliance, prompting the organization of a remote audit conducted by the third-party audit company. In the event the supplier continues to be unresponsive, the major non-compliance will be escalated to a critical non-compliance and an onsite audit will be organized, carried out by the third-party audit company.

In the case of major non-conformity, a half-day remote audit will be performed by the third-party audit company. In the event the supplier is unresponsive, the major non-compliance will be escalated to a critical non-compliance and an onsite audit will be organized, carried out by the third-party audit company.

In the case of critical non-conformity, the third-party audit company is required to promptly notify Prometeon Tyre Group. In response, immediate actions will be taken to address the issue, which may include a visit by a Prometeon representative to the supplier's location to conduct an investigation and identify an appropriate solution. If a resolution is found and the non-compliance is effectively addressed, the supplier will be allowed to continue working with Prometeon Tyre Group, though they will be subject to a re-audit onsite the following year to ensure ongoing compliance. However, if the critical non-compliance remains unresolved, the supplier will be disqualified without any possibility to be eligible to do business with Prometeon Tyre Group.

Due to the countries in which the Company operates and to monitor operations at significant risk of child labor, Prometeon Tyre Group, through the Risk Management Committee, ensures that child labor is not practiced under any circumstance or in any type of operation (such as manufacturing plants) in all its key locations and across all the countries where the Company operates. Moreover, to monitor the entire value chain and considering the geographical areas where raw materials are sourced, the Company, through the aforementioned third-party audit, also ensures that the prohibition of child labor is fully respected by its suppliers and the specific locations where they operate. In addition, in line with its commitment to the UNGC and its "Principle 1: Support and respect the protection of internationally recognized human rights" and "Principle 2: Ensure that business practices do not contribute to human rights abuses", as well as through the implementation of publicly available policies (including the Global Human Rights Policy, Conflict Minerals and Cobalt Sourcing Policy, Social Responsibility Policy for Occupational Health, Safety and Rights, and Environmental Policy), Prometeon Tyre Group plays an active role in the effective abolition of child labor. Moreover, respecting "Principle 3: Uphold the freedom of association and the effective recognition of the right to collective bargaining" the Company verifies that all its workers and those of the suppliers can have the possibility to prevail over their rights (Global Human Rights Policy, Conflict Minerals and Cobalt Sourcing Policy, Social Responsibility Policy for Occupational Health, Safety and Rights, and Environment).

At the contractual stage, the Sustainability and Business Ethics Clauses - including anticorruption provisions - have been systematically incorporated into contracts and purchase orders for goods, services and works for the past ten years. This applies globally to agreements with private suppliers, public administrations, publicly controlled entities and NGOs.

Specifically, these clauses ensure that suppliers are aware of the principles, commitments and values outlined in Prometeon Tyre Group's sustainability documents, including the Ethical Code, Code of Conduct, Global Human Rights Policy, Health, Safety and Environment Policy, and Anti-Corruption Program - all publicly available on the corporate website.

These documents outline the Company's core principles governing its operations and relationships with third parties. Moreover, suppliers are contractually obligated to affirm their commitment to maintaining these standards:

- not using or supporting the use of child labor and forced labor;
- ensuring equal opportunity, freedom of association and promotion of the development of each individual;
- opposing the use of corporal punishment, mental or physical coercion, or verbal abuse;
- complying with the laws and industry standards concerning working hours and ensuring that wages are sufficient to cover the basic needs of personnel;
- not tolerating any type or bribery in any form or manner and in any legal jurisdiction, even where such practices are effectively permitted, tolerated, or not subject to prosecution;
- assessing and reducing the environmental impact of their own products and services throughout their entire life cycle;
- using resources responsibly with the aim of achieving sustainable development in compliance with the principles of respect for the environment and the rights of future generations;
- establishing and maintaining the necessary procedures to evaluate and select suppliers and sub-suppliers on the basis of their commitments to social and environmental responsibility, regular overseeing compliance with this obligation on the part of the same;
- specifying that the Company reserves the right to verify at any time through activities of audit, either directly or through third parties, that fulfillment of the duties taken on by a supplier has been achieved;

The Sustainability Clauses have been translated into the languages of the regions where suppliers operate, ensuring maximum clarity and transparency regarding the contractual obligations they assume. This applies not only in relation to the Company itself but also to their own operations and interactions with their suppliers.

To ensure the highest level of accountability, Prometeon Tyre Group provides its suppliers with access to the Whistleblowing Reporting Procedure. More details about the platform, which

operates 24/7 and is accessible to all stakeholders, can be found in the "Governance & Business Ethics" section of this report or directly via the following link: https://prometeontyregroup.whistlelink.com. This platform is explicitly referenced in contractual clauses and allows suppliers to confidentially report any actual or suspected violations related to the Ethical Code, Code of Conduct, Global Human Rights Policy, Health, Safety and Environment Policy, and Anti-Corruption Program in their interactions with the Company.

Additionally, 2024 marked the introduction of the Supplier Awards, with the first recipients being recognized for their excellence. This initiative was promoted as part of the Sustainable Procurement Policy, issued in late 2023 and applicable to all supplier categories. The program aims to acknowledge suppliers who have demonstrated outstanding performance in providing materials and services, while also promoting innovation, sustainability and continuous improvement.

In its inaugural edition, the Supplier Awards evaluated more than 8,000 suppliers worldwide based on various key performance indicators (KPIs), including a specific focus on sustainability and ESG-related projects. For further details, refer to the "Our Policies" section within the "Governance & Business Ethics" dimension. Suppliers were assessed across five distinct categories:

- ✓ Best Raw Material Supplier (awarded at global level);
- ✓ Best ESG Supplier (awarded at global level);
- ✓ Best Local Logistics Supplier (awarded at local level);
- ✓ Best Global & Local Indirect Goods and Services Supplier (awarded at local level);
- ✓ Best Manufacturing Supplier (awarded at local level).

At the award ceremony, the Chief Procurement Office of Prometeon Tyre Group, Federica Tondini stated: "With these Awards, we want to recognize the value of our suppliers, who are critical to Prometeon's growth. They have helped us in supply chain management, investing in many cases in joint projects. The relationship we have built with our suppliers demonstrates that it is possible to successfully overcome difficult times generated by global uncertainty, as happened in the past with Covid, with the crisis on Europe's eastern borders, and more recently with the crisis in the Middle East and the flooding in Brazil just a few weeks ago. The award event concludes a year-long journey that has made the relationships between Prometeon and its suppliers even stronger, inspired by the pillars of the Group's strategy: innovation, quality and sustainability", emphasizing the importance of the awards.

Prometeon Tyre Group's relationship with suppliers and external collaborators is built on business integrity and equal opportunity for all parties involved in procurement processes, in line with the principles outlined in the Ethical Code.

The Company's policies not only emphasize the full integration of a sustainable supply chain but also reflect a longstanding commitment to addressing the core challenges behind SDG 8 – Decent Work and Economic Growth and SDG 12 – Responsible Consumption and Production. Many of these policies were adopted and implemented even before Prometeon's adherence to the United Nations Global Compact (UNGC) and the integration of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) into its strategy.

Sustainable supply chain management is also a fundamental aspect of several key policies, including

- Social Responsibility for Occupational Health, Safety, Rights, and Environment Policy
- Global Health, Safety, and Environment Policy
- Global Human Rights Policy
- Global Quality Policy
- Sustainable Natural Rubber Policy.

QUALITY CERTIFICATES

The quality certifications, obtained by Prometeon in the past years, have been renewed, as described below:

Quality Management System certification ISO 9001: In 2019, Prometeon Tyre Group
received the first certification successfully passing external party audits for Head Quarter
and all the operative units. In 2020 the Company had the first re-certification from
external surveillance audit. Between 2021 and 2024, the certificate was sustained and
renewed successfully passing surveillance external party audits for Head Quarter and all

- our operative units, results confirming continual improvement trend for the entire Prometeon Tyre Group.
- IATF 16949:2016: Following the evolution of the automotive industry, in 2018 Prometeon Tyre Group, has achieved the certification of the Quality Management System following IATF 16949:2016 (Automotive Quality Management System Standard). In 2019, the Group has sustained the certificate successfully passing surveillance third-party audits. Between 2020 and 2024, Prometeon has sustained the certification, successfully passing surveillance and recertification external audits, which confirms the robustness of the Quality Management Systems in-place and the continual improvement approach adopted by Prometeon Tyre Group.

The standards foreseen in the IATF framework reflects the approach of the global automotive network, **Original Equipment Manufacturers** that require the organization to comply with Basic Working Conditions in the Global Terms and Conditions and the related Supplier Social Responsibility and Anti-Corruption Requirements (*for further details please refer to Environmental Dimension of this report*).

Regarding **Quality**, Prometeon Tyre Group has continually reached and exceeded demanding customer requirements regarding the excellence of product and support activities by means of an integrated approach for development of people and know-how, using cycles of training, compliance control and conformity improvement of the Quality Management system, making it progressively leaner and more focused. In 2023 and 2024, a new information system dedicated for Quality Management was launched and deployed to increase the effectiveness of the activities and coordination among areas.









ESG KPIs

Prometeon strictly monitors and reports all the ESG KPIs for effective management. Additionally, some KPIs constitute the calculation base for employees' variable compensation in the HQ, executives' LTI plan and ESG-linked loan.

In particular, the HQ employees' variable compensation is related to:

- Training: % of people trained at worldwide level (considering only training not mandatory by law), with a target for year 2024 set at 86% and an actual value of 98%,

the executives' LTI for the years 2022-2024 is related to:

- Training: average % of people trained at worldwide level in the years 2022-2024 (considering only training not mandatory by law), with a target set at 84% (equal to the average of the 1st LTI cycle 2021-2023 + 2pp.) and an actual value of 95%
- Waste: Cost of waste on total production cost, with specific internal targets
- Audit on suppliers: number of 3rd party audits on suppliers in the years 2022-2024, with a target set at 46 and an actual value of 54,

and the ESG-linked loan issued in the year 2025 is related to:

- Audit on suppliers: number of 3rd party audits on suppliers with specific targets
- CO2-e emissions: CO2-e/Operative income, with specific targets.

With the selected KPIs Prometeon intends to cover the most significant aspects of sustainability, including environmental, social and governance issues and focusing on specific themes as supply chain mapping, training to internal stakeholders, waste management and GHG emissions that our Company deems as primary drivers for its development.













PROMETEON ON THE FIELD: PRODUCTS, CUSTOMERS, SERVICES AND BEYOND

As the only tyre manufacturer focused solely on the commercial sectors, Prometeon Tyre Group has a strong commitment in providing products and services that meet market needs. The goal of the Company is to offer effective solutions to become the partner of choice of its stakeholders. The following paragraphs offer an overview of Prometeon's products and services, research & development activities, the Group's relations with its suppliers and its overall approach towards its business partners and stakeholders.

PRODUCT SAFETY, PERFORMANCE AND ECO-SUSTAINABILITY

Aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) "9: Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure" and "12: Responsible Consumption and Production," Prometeon Tyre Group is dedicated to developing materials that minimize environmental impact. This includes using materials free from petroleum-based ingredients and incorporating recycled components. The company's product research and development prioritize safety and sustainability, while maintaining the high level of performance of its products unchanged.

Prometeon Tyre Group is committed to excellence, efficiency, transparency, and technological innovation in the development, production, and sale of tyres for Medium and Heavy Commercial Vehicles for goods and passenger transport, Agriculture, and OTR. Prometeon offers a diverse product portfolio that includes the brands PROMETEON, PIRELLI, FORMULA, PHAROS, ANTEO, SESTANTE, ERACLE, and TEGRYS.

The company, which can count on over 100 years of experience in the commercial tyre industry, has developed its own technological expertise.

In 2024 Prometeon Tyre Group has completed its new Research and Development Center in Italy, completely dedicated to Innovation Projects with new cutting-edge indoor machinery, equipped with the latest technical solutions. Moreover, an important additional investment has been approved for the same Research and Development Center: new laboratories are under construction and the project is expected to be concluded by 2027 with tools and facilities to carry out physical and chemical analysis of the materials and compounds used in tyres. The use

of innovative and advanced tools will allow Prometeon to accelerate its innovation path by experimenting with increasingly high-performance and at the same time more sustainable materials.



Prometeon Tyre Group new R&D Center in Italy

In 2024, a special ceremony inaugurated the new R&D Center in Egypt for local product research.

With these new investments, the Company's research and development capacity has grown significantly, totaling 4 R&D centers in Brazil, Egypt, Italy, and Turkey. This enables autonomous product development to meet various market demands globally.

Prometeon Tyre Group R&D is based on an Open Innovation approach to develop new knowledge through collaboration with Universities, Startups, and Companies that have consolidated know-how in specific areas of study. Thanks to projects realized jointly, the Company can develop new technological knowledge to improve the performance of commercial vehicle tyres in terms of safety, sustainability, energy saving and environmental impact.

In this context, the Company is actively engaged in the advancement of knowledge aimed at enhancing the environmental quality of the tyre sector and, more broadly, the entire automotive industry. Regarding that, one of the most important projects is associated with Tyre and Road Wear Particles (TRWP), small particles that are produced during drive. The friction between the tyre and the asphalt produces microparticle pollution that remains in the air, water and land for long periods, up to different centuries and affects, throughout ascending the trophic chain, not only the marine and non-marine ecosystems, but also human health. In fact, due to the hazard TRWP represents for the environment and human health, they are one of the central topics under discussion in Europe. In this context, Prometeon Tyre Group is working in partnership with a prestigious Dutch University to find a methodology to allow a correlation

between laboratory trends and outdoor performance to develop innovative techniques to address this challenge.

Maximizing performance with minimum environmental impact is the essential principle laying the foundations of Prometeon Tyre Group product design and development process. Design and development activities have always considered the products' environmental performance, starting from the production process until the very end of the product life cycle. To enhance the overall design and development processes by providing for a more structural, unified and systematical approach, in 2024, Prometeon R&D Department together with Marketing and Quality Departments worked on the review of Corporate Quality Procedure on Management of Product Development Projects. With the review carried out, eco-design requirements through cross-department meetings have been included in preliminary assessment criteria for the development proposals of new projects, thus having the Company officially embedded its sustainable business principles at product design phase and adopted an approach associated with eco-design.

Prometeon Tyre Group's Research and Innovation activities address market needs and prioritize sustainability, which is a significant focus for the Company. All developed themes aim to enhance fundamental research and innovate product performance through:

- the study and acquisition of expertise;
- creation of virtual models;
- implementation of new laboratory survey methodologies;
- development of new instruments for measuring and reproducing phenomena.

These efforts facilitate the identification of potential innovative solutions and their subsequent integration into the Company's product offerings.

The primary role of the Research and Development (R&D) Department is to develop new products and processes through innovation, based on the following six pillars:

- **collaboration with lawmakers** in order to gather information regarding legislation evolution both at national and international level;
- business perspective collaboration with OEMs in order to understand and analyze the development and growth regarding products and technologies, therefore aiming to study analyze and anticipate future market trends;
- **technology evolution of the product** to be up to date with the latest developments in Innovation;
- application of digital mobility solutions to tyre business in order to increase the overall safety and performance;
- **open innovation** to foster collaborations with experts in their relevant fields for increasing the Company know how;
- Sustainability: Ensuring all activities are conducted respecting nature, caring for society, and promoting continuous innovation



6 Pillars of Innovation of Prometeon Tyre Group

During the last years, several projects have been started with a particular focus on the study of sustainable new materials, the recovery of waste and the waste materials coming from different working cycles. In this regard, several collaborations have been agreed with universities that represent excellence in different fields of research.

The recent focus of the industry for the digitization and development of IOT systems has recently highlighted the need to collect and process information from tyre usage enabling through the implementation of algorithms, the best use of both in terms of environmental impact (energy consumption reduction) and safety, allowing a constant and real-time monitoring of conditions of the use of tyres. The optimization of their use and related maintenance can lead to fuel efficiency and longer life, reducing fuel consumption and significantly increasing the life of the tyres with a consequent reduction of the impact on the environment.

The push given by the European Community requiring a substantial reduction in CO2 emissions has led to an increase of restrictive regulations for vehicle manufacturers. The major vehicle manufacturers have required all their component suppliers to reduce energy consumption. It has to be noted that tyre manufacturers have been firstly involved and required to optimize energy-saving performance without penalizing other essential qualities such as safety and durability.

Moreover, several national entities have promoted incentive actions in the use of low environmental impact vehicles and components, giving a greater push for research and innovation on new materials, new technological solutions, new production processes, new control systems.

Thanks to the focus on sustainable innovation and technological solutions developed in the Research and Development centers of the Company, the new O2 Series of Prometeon is developed based on two key words, Innovation and Sustainability, which represents the

maximum in terms of cost efficiency for professionals in the transport sector and respect for the environment.

The design effort for the current product lines has been managed efficiently, focusing on operating costs to achieve high mileage and "active sustainability". This results in longer tyre life and lower rolling resistance, which subsequently decreases tyre consumption and fuel consumption.

The development activity of the new lines has been focused on formulations containing sustainable materials, on innovative technological solutions and processes that have led to a significant reduction in the weight of tyres, to obtain, with equal safety standards, a very balanced product, able to offer the best performance in full compliance with the principles of sustainability.

Prometeon has launched new product lines focused on energy saving (Profuel) and increasing the durability of products while maintaining the same performance. Specifically, the new H02 Profuel Series aims to enhance the energy efficiency of tyres (Class A). These tyres are designed for sectors where long-haul driving at constant speeds can maximize the positive impact of CO2 reduction.

Based on calculations made with VECTO (the simulation tool developed by the European Commission to determine CO2 emissions and fuel consumption of heavy vehicles), a trailer equipped with 385/55 R 22.5 HO2 PROFUEL Steer tyres and 315/70 R 22.5 HO2 PROFUEL Drive tyres on the tractor, and 385/55 R 22.5 tyres on the semi-trailer, uses 1.4 liters less fuel per 100 kilometers than a vehicle equipped with the previous product line. For a fleet of 150 lorries, each covering 130 thousand kilometers per year, this translates to 702 tons less CO2 emissions and a fuel cost saving of 465 thousand euros annually (based on an average diesel fuel price of 1.7 ℓ /l).

To maximize the reduction of the tyre's rolling resistance, the R&D Department has decided to implement a combination of various factors, including adjustments in the type of materials used, optimization of the structure, and overall reduction of tyre weight.

For the structure cords made of high strength steel were used giving high flexibility and preventing the spread of corrosion, ensuring the integrity and longevity of the casing. Zero-degree spiral belt cords with new geometry and increased diameter for durability and strength.

Reinforced heel, in combination with the new geometry of the metal wires, gives great flexibility, strength and high load capacity. Innovative belt pack configuration to optimize tyre weight, contain energy dissipation, promote low rolling resistance and fuel consumption containment.

Engineering systems have shown through numerical calculation and virtual simulations that the tread impacts more than 50% of the rolling resistance coefficient due to the materials used and the design. The Company has redesigned the tyre by re-engineering all the materials within it, including compounds and structure, to meet these goals.

Thanks to the know-how of the designers, an innovative concept of tread design, which is a Prometon's patent, has been developed. The aim of this design was to reduce the mobility of the various parts of the design itself maintaining adherence qualities on slippery surfaces and thus thanks to the contribution of innovative materials that maximize road holding while maintaining very low levels of hysteresis, that is low energy consumption during the rolling.

Through an optimized combination of materials and tread patterns, mileage performance has also been preserved on long-haul applications, optimizing tyre life efficiency. This has been possible using a high percentage of silica in the tread compound which required necessarily a new production process of the tyre be able to discharge the electrostatic charges integrating in the tread a conductive insert.

The development of the new Profuel product lines required four years of study, 180 million kilometers of tests on the roads in Italy, Germany and Turkey. 2,500 tires have been tested with a working group of one hundred professionals involved in the project composed by the Research and Development, Marketing, Logistics and Commercial Department. Thanks to the results obtained with the tests on wet, dry and snow, the Profuel attained the winter homologation 3PMSF. Moreover, it must be highlighted that mileage and structural strength tests were conducted, in line with current product lines, as well as all tests related to the required legal approvals.

In addition, all 02 Series tyres are equipped with an internal RFID sensor that allows identification.

Product line dedicated to electric vehicles and urban buses

The aim of the project was the development of a new line of products dedicated for the equipment of latest generation of electric traction vehicles specialized in transport of people in urban areas. Sustainable mobility, especially in urban contexts, is a theme driving to the decision to renew and/or upgrade the fleet vehicles that are used for urban public transport at worldwide level:

The main manufacturers of heavy vehicles are releasing on the market new generation electric traction buses that meet a twofold objective: to increase operating autonomy by using more powerful batteries, but of a heavier weight, and maintain the same passenger capacity as conventional and/or hybrid vehicles and thus lead to an increase of the overall mass of the vehicle.

To meet these needs, tyre manufacturers were required to develop new products/measures with increased load capacities (which were not allowed by international standards at the beginning of the study) and reduced rolling resistance, to limit battery charging cycles.

Starting from the knowledge acquired regarding the advancement of the latest generation of products, the development and design activity has been focused on the research of

combinations for technological solutions properly balanced that could achieve the main performance targets required.

UO2 URBAN-e PRO Multiaxle meets the needs of the new generation of electric mobility vehicles: thanks to an increased load capacity, compared to the previous product line, that allows the use of batteries with high autonomy without compromising the number of passengers.

The new product line has a rolling resistance reduced by 10% compared to the previous product and is classified among the best in class with Category B on fuel consumption. UO2 URBAN-e PRO Multiaxle helps increase the autonomy of city buses, reduce battery charging cycles for fully electric vehicles and reduce CO2 emissions.

In line with the evolution of hybrid and electric vehicles for urban use, characterized by frequent stop and go, the new product reduces operating costs, as well as offering a higher level of comfort, a uniform wear and reduced generation of noise (69dB in measure 275/70R22.5) and thus with excellent safety performance.

UO2 URBAN-e PRO Multiaxle is suitable for all axles. The M+S and 3PMSF markings, together with the Category B in wet grip, ensure a high level of performance even in winter conditions as well. To achieve this performance, Prometeon R&D has redesigned the materials and internal structures of the product. The introduction of the new SWITe technology and the reinforced structure have allowed an increase in load capacity, while improving rebuildability of tyres. To increase the durability of the product subject to strong creeps and impacts against sidewalks, a reinforced sidewall profile and a new compound more resistant to abrasion have been added. To optimize the rolling resistance performance, the design criteria of the newly developed tread patterns, with reduced deformability, were used, applying the concepts contained in the patent application filed.

Such drawing installations should be such as to permit compaction by limiting the mobility/deformation of the longitudinal grooves or transverse anchors in particular loading or driving conditions. Limitation of the deflection energy of the tread contributes to reducing the hysteresis of the tyre. However, to keep in line, the wet sealing performance with the previous product, a particular geometry of the longitudinal grooves that guarantees an enlargement of the cross-section of the same at mid-life promoting water drainage and therefore vehicle controllability, has been adopted (see patent IT201700084726A1).

Furthermore, the new tread geometry has been designed to ensure excellent impact resistance and high traction throughout the life cycle, considering also the high torque transmitted by electric traction engines on tyres. Prometeon has developed this product line in collaboration with the main manufacturers of new generations of urban vehicles working with electric motors or alternative fuels to diesel.

In particular, Prometeon Tyre Group in collaboration with the company E-CO Hev, which produces an innovative electric vehicle without batteries but with a super condenser, is continuing a project on sustainable urban transport in major Italian metropolitan cities. The new

line is available in Category B for fuel consumption and wet grip (best in market class) and Category A (69dB) in external rolling noise.

RO2 PROFUEL for motorway, regional and urban routes

For the Regional line, designed for trucks with 17.5", 19.5" and 22.5" tyres operating on motorways, regional, and urban routes, the focus was on reducing fuel or energy consumption and increasing durability. The tread patterns were developed to provide grip and traction in all seasons and on wet and moderately snowy surfaces, and to ensure an optimal distribution of the footprint on the ground for uniform wear and mileage.

The new geometry of the sides and the increase in the thickness of the rubberization, measurable with ISW indicator, give resistance to impacts and contribute to the longer life of the products. The performance improvements of RO2 PROFUEL compared to the previous product line are as follows:

- -20% rolling resistance;
- +15% acoustic comfort;
- +10% grip on wet and snow;
- +10% wear regularity.

Calculations using VECTO indicate that the RO2 PROFUEL 285/70 R 19.5 tyres used on a 4 2 vehicle can reduce fuel consumption by 0.8 liters per 100 kilometers compared to the previous product line. For a fleet of 50 vehicles, each covering 130 thousand kilometers per year and with diesel fuel priced at $1.7 \ \text{e/l}$, this results in 40 tons lower CO2 emissions and an annual saving of 88 thousand $\ \text{e}$ in fuel costs.



R02 PROFUEL

S02 PISTA for Special Use

The Prometeon SO2 Pista is part of the new Serie O2, which uses the same technological package of the product line. It is designed to offer great structural integrity in the most extreme off-road use.

Compared to the product it replaces (PS22), the speed of use has increased from 90 km/h to 110 km/h while maintaining the same load capacity. The product has been completely rethought in the tread geometries, which, having to satisfy the greater stresses at higher speeds, when used at cruising speeds of 90-100 km/h, increase its durability and structural resistance. However, this increased resilience does not compromise either traction or the ability to expel mud when used in the most extreme conditions. The S-shaped tread design guarantees progressive contact with the ground, improving comfort and reducing noise when driving on asphalt.

The new Prometeon SO2 Pista can also operate with low pressures and with "run flat" and "bead lock" systems, in all types of terrain ranging from asphalt to sand, from earth to grass, from marshy to rough terrain.

Available in size 14.00 R20, it boasts a load capacity of 10 tons in single use, 18 tons in twin wheel configuration. The load index is 164/160K.'

At the beginning of 2024, we participated in the Dakar Rally in Saudi Arabia as the official tyre supplier for the Italtrans team, using our first Prometeon-branded tyre, the 14.00 R20 S02 PISTA. Thanks to the performance of our tyres, Italtrans achieved strong results in this challenging competition, placing seventh. This success opened the door for us to take part in other key events throughout 2024, including the Baja Aragón in Spain (July 2024) and the Rallye du Maroc (October 2024). These competitions served as invaluable preparation for the development of a new tyre for 2025 Dakar Rally.

G02 ECO (MULTIAXLE and DRIVE)

GO2 ECO represents the latest generation of tyres for mixed use service, designed for efficiency by guaranteeing maximum performance - C Fuel Class - and fleet operating cost optimization.

Thanks to the new reinforced casing construction G02 ECO offers an increased load capacity that allows to carry up to more than 1 ton.

The tread pattern design and new compound formulation offer excellent grip, traction and wet braking performance, for the maximum driving comfort and handling. The product line saw the use of two Prometeon Patent technologies, designed and developed by Prometeon Tyre Group employees. While the innovative **Bumper Technology**, designed to reduce tread movement and vibrations, promotes regular wear, grip and safety in any condition, the **special waved groove surface** enhances easy self-cleaning and great traction on all surface conditions.

The G210 is specially designed for heavy-duty regional applications, offering exceptional durability, enhanced integrity, and safety. It features improved resistance to punctures and is built for long-lasting performance, ensuring both durability and retreadability.

G02 (MULTIAXLE and DRIVE) for MEA

The GO2 represents the first product line launched under the PROMETEON brand, showcasing the latest generation of tires designed for mixed-use applications. These tires are optimized for exceptional retreadability, superior tear resistance, and outstanding off-road grip, while also offering high levels of acoustic comfort and durability, even on asphalt roads.

RO2 PROWAY (STEER and DRIVE) for EUROPE

In 2024, the European range will expand with the new RO2 Proway series, specifically designed for regional medium and short-distance transport. The RO2 Proway product line is dedicated to versatile applications, offering excellent Total Cost of Ownership (TCO), high mileage, and integrity to deliver the most efficient performance in any condition. The product is designed to emphasize durability and provide uniform wear throughout the tire's lifespan. The RO2 Proway M1 is compliant with winter regulations (M+S & 3PMSF), ensuring high safety and optimal performance in wet grip class.

RO2 PROWAY M1 has optimized footprints with uniform ground contact pressure distribution to enhance regular wear throughout life and additional providing: High mileage; Excellent even wear over the entire life.

The performance improvements of the RO2 Proway M1 compared to the previous product line are as follows:

- +20% Integrity and robustness;
- +10% mileage;
- +10% even wear;
- +5% load capacity;

Scheduled to enter the market in the second half of 2025, CO2 is Prometeon's first tyre to be launched with an **A-class rating** for rolling resistance. It has been developed to meet the demands of Prometeon's partner vehicle manufacturers for sustainable tyres for original equipment.



CO2 Coach Drive

Featuring extremely low rolling resistance with values below 4.0N/kgN, it will help reduce CO2 emissions and operating costs. It boasts a fuel consumption improvement over the previous line of 0.9 liters less per 100 kilometers (source: VECTO), leading to an annual savings of €102,000 (based on a fleet of 50 vehicles, each covering 130,000 kilometers per year), equivalent to 157 tons of CO2 saved annually. Prometeon CO2 is a sustainability champion with **80 percent of recycled and certified, or renewable-source materials used for its production**.

To meet the increased load requirements of new hybrid and electric vehicles, the load index has been raised to 156/150 M. The products are equipped with RFID technology.

ROAD SAFETY

As being the fundamental pillar of transport systems, safety is the top priority. 
Original Equipment (OE).

The Sustainability team created a guide to help complete the SAQ.5 questionnaire. Continuous training sessions are scheduled to support local teams. Additionally, the Company is working to centralize OEM sustainability requests to better manage assessments across multiple platforms

IAA deserves a special mention: in fact, the Prometeon booth gave visitors the chance to discover two important world premieres: the new product for coach transport, Prometeon CO2, the first Prometeon tyre with an A rating for rolling resistance and made with 80 percent of recycled and certified, or renewable-source materials; Prometeon SuperFleet, the new set of tailored fleet management solutions developed to meet the growing needs of a wide range of fleets, offering not only high-quality tyres, but also a range of services and technologies aimed at optimizing efficiency and sustainability.

 April 2024 saw the launch of the Prometeon-engineered SerieO2 product range in Brazil. A brand-new range of products for regional applications (RO2 line) and for onoff applications (GO2 line) highlighting Prometeon's commitment to technology innovation and sustainability.

• In May 2024 with Egypt launch event, Prometeon marked its historic transition to a product brand by staging a special ceremony, which hosted customers and media, in the shadow of the Giza pyramids in Egypt. The first tyres to carry the Prometeon brand have been the G02 ON-OFF and the G210, which inaugurated the production of Prometeon-branded tyres for Egypt, other Middle East nations and Africa in the innovative and increasingly sustainable manufacturing site in Alexandria, which is also the location of the company's fourth research & development facility. This launch coincided with the 30th anniversary of Prometeon factory in Egypt, where more than 2,000 people are employed, and which guests had the opportunity to visit through a dedicated guided tour.

Participants had the opportunity to visit the Izmit plant, which employs 2,000 people and houses one of the company's Research and Development Centres and recently received the ISCC Plus certification which attests that the materials it uses derive from

bio-based, bio-circular and circular sources. Guests had also the opportunity to explore the wonders of historic Istanbul, and enjoy a unique experience at the Istanbul Park Circuit, where they tested trucks equipped with Prometeon tyres both on the track and off-road, driven by professional motorsport drivers who collaborate with Prometeon in sports competitions: Martin Macík Jr., winner of the 2024 Dakar Rally, Claudio Bellina, participant in the 2024 Dakar Rally with Prometeon tyres, and Bia Figueiredo, winner of the Copa Truck in the Super Truck Elite category of the Copa Truck Championship in 2024

Prometeon participated also to the 37th International Truck Grand Prix, the largest event dedicated to trucks in Germany which took place from 11 to 14 July at the Nürburgring, sponsoring the "Prometeon SuperTruck Awards": the prize that rewards trucks with aesthetics and special technologies.

These activities support the improvement of Prometeon brand awareness and recognition at worldwide level as well as providing the opportunity to strengthen the relationship with our customers and prospects, beyond daily business interactions thanks to the hospitality activation.

The Code Group of Ethics formulates the principles general of transparency and fairness inspiring the conduct of business. It indicates the objectives and the values informing business activity in relation to the main stakeholders with which Prometeon Tyre Group interacts on a daily basis: investors, environment, financial market, customers and staff. The year also saw an active participation of the Company in several events and webinars on various sustainability issues and sustainability related aspects of "doing business". The "networking" among the business community is the key instrument for Trade Marketing to support the sell-out multi-brand retails rather than a simple sell-in strategy. Especially in business-to-business markets like the one of industrial tyres, networking plays a fundamental role in supporting a real enhancement of the offer made to end-users in terms of products and services. Trade marketing and product sell-out are two concepts that link to each other

indissolubly. On the one hand, a true sell-out action on the end-user requires an available, strong and coherent Network, while on the other hand the success of networking activities relies on an ever greater direct and indirect sell-out action. SuperTruck Network was born in Italy in the mid-2019 and currently the Italian Network consists of **145 Points of Sale** of which **59 of SuperTruck Consortium.** In October 2020 the Network expanded beyond the Italian borders, arriving in Poland. Since then, the Network has expanded to other countries, such as Germany, Switzerland, the United Kingdom, Spain, Portugal, Greece and Cyprus, bringing total number of the **Network Points of Sale in Europe** to **381**.

To reinforce the relationship among the Network Members, in October 2024 the II International SuperTruck Convention was held in Istanbul. The convention saw the participation of 105 SuperTruck dealers from all the Countries of the Network creating a great opportunity

"Prometeon SuperFleet" a solution designed meet the evolving needs of fleets, alongside SuperTruck, it represents the Prometeon ecosystem, meaning a network of trusted partners



designed to address the critical needs of modern fleets, combining advanced technology, comprehensive tyre management and exceptional support services.

SuperFleet is composed of four different hubs, with designated core offerings.



Starting with the **SuperFleet Tyre Hub**, it leverages advanced technology to optimize fleet performance through **Smart Tyre Management**. This hub is featured by three different Pro Services: Pro Check and Pro Retread

• **PRO CHECK**: Tyre Monitoring System designed for fleets and retailers, which helps to monitor tyre performance and plan tyre maintenance activities.



 PRO RETREAD grants a high value on casing quality and initial investment in new tyres, with an eco-friendly approach, with lower cost per kilometer, lower overall cost, and lower impact on the environment.





The second hub is **the SuperFleet Care Hub**, with comprehensive maintenance and assistance solutions. In this case too, there are different services offered, in particular the 24/7 roadside assistance, effectively reducing the unexpected downtime with a quick response. More in particular:

PRO TIME: a Network of European dealers identified by Prometeon Tyre Group to create an international roadside assistance service offered on a 24 hours/7 days basis, guaranteeing a high-quality service to the fleets.



Part of the Care Hub is also SuperTruck, a network of professional and specialized independent dealers, which offers a complete range of tyres and integrated offer with the service package, by Prometeon.



Next, there is the SuperFleet Efficiency Hub.

Prometeon SuperFleet streamlines fleet administration with integrated digital solutions that seamlessly merge with existing management systems, providing comprehensive monitoring and reporting capabilities.



PROJECT OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF MILAN TO BUILD AN EXEMPLARY SMART MOBILITY DISTRICT IN TERMS OF SUSTAINABILITY AND INNOVATION

As far as SDGs "11 Sustainable Cities and Communities","17 Partnerships for the Goals" are concerned, Prometeon Tyre Group is committed to make every possible contribution aimed at making sustainable everyday life. To this end in late 2019, Prometeon Tyre Group has joined a specific task group formed by the Municipality of Milan. Together with other 9 companies and 2 public entities located in Bicocca which have shown interest and have been involved in the initiative with the aim of transforming Bicocca District, the City's business district.

The participants are Prometeon Tyre Group, prestigious multinational corporations such as Agos, Bicocca Village, BIM, Deutsche Bank, Engie, Gruppo 24 ORE, Prysmian Group, Pirelli, Tecne-Autostrade per l'Italia and public entities, the University of Milano-Bicocca and the National Research Council of Italy (*Consiglio Nazionale delle Ricerche*), all located in Bicocca District and willing to take part in this innovative and ambitious initiative. At the heart of the initiative lays the implementation of sustainable and innovative transport solutions in the district such as the promotion of the use of public transport and the adoption of alternative transport systems such as car and bike sharing.

2024 saw the continuation of the project related to the Smart Mobility District. During the course of the year several meetings were organized to discuss the actual status of studies and activities related to mobility management in the district as well as the next steps to be taken for the purposes of the project.

Regarding mobility management of Bicocca District, the Round Table conducted and shared home-workplace mobility survey for 2024 with Municipality of Milan. Surveys with similar questions were submitted to all stakeholders, including employees of companies and entities taking part in the round table as well as students of the University of Milano-Bicocca.

The project is an integral part of the MUSA -Multilayered Urban Sustainability Action-.an Ecosystem of Innovation Project funded by the Ministry of Universities and Research under the National Recovery and Resilience Plan which identifies the Milan area as a laboratory for testing models of public-private collaboration and integrated innovations that act on multiple fronts of sustainability. Thanks to the results of the surveys, the main key performance indicators such as average distance between home and workplace, average day of presence at workplace, preference for private/public transport etc. were identified, which, with the support of the round table participants' best practice proposals led to discussion and adoption of a series of actions.

Summary of the results of Home-Workplace Mobility Plan survey


As regards mobility management of Prometeon Tyre Group, in May 2024 the Company moved to its new Headquarter "SuperLab", a sustainable building located in Bicocca Area. Within this context, in late 2024, a new home-workplace mobility survey was carried out among headquarter employees to understand the actual and to identify the employees' needs for sustainable workplace mobility.



Prometeon Home-Work Mobility Plan survey leaflet


The Company released its workplace mobility which has been also communicated to the Ministry of Transport as required by the Italian law, which requires to all the companies having more than 100 employees to declare its workplace mobility. Employees participated positively to the survey, 141 of 291 employees fulfilled the questionnaire corresponding to 49% of the total employees working for Prometeon Tyre Group in the Company Headquarter . The survey highlighted interesting information on Prometeon HQ employees' mobility choices and habits.

Based on the analyses carried out it emerged that 49% of the participants prefer to travel by private transport, 44% with public transport, while about 6% use the soft mobility (walking, cycling,) only 1% prefer carpooling. The main reason for opting for private transport is essentially to enjoy freedom of movement in a comfortable and efficient manner.




Distribution of transport method preferences of Prometeon Milano Headquarters employees

The survey revealed also that major part of employees answered the survey – roughly 57% - reside at a distance greater than 10 km form the Headquarters while about 42% reside at a distance between 1 to 10 km.




Analysis of Prometeon employee's locations compared to Headquarters in Bicocca

Furthermore, thanks to the survey it has been identified that the 62% of the employees working in Italy offices are between 21 and 40 years old. As a reflection of Prometeon's young employee population, the survey highlighted a significantly high propensity to switch to new, modern and sustainable mobility solutions. In specific, 59% of participants expressed an interest in gamification of sustainable mobility solutions where users are rewarded for their preferences. While 50% or participants have a propensity to use local public transport, 47% would prefer shared mobility solutions such as bike, scooter and car sharing.

ESG RATING ASSESSMENT

In 2024, Prometeon continued the external ESG rating assessment of its annual performances for the third consecutive year. The assessment was conducted by **Morningstar Sustainalytics**, a reputable rating firm specializing in analytical environmental, social, and governance (ESG) research, ratings, and data. The annual rating results obtained encompass all the sustainability KPIs, including:

- Governance & Business Ethics
- Social Dimension
- Environmental Dimension
- Economic Dimension

Sustainalytics' rating methodology evaluates all ESG risks using a score from 0 to 100. A lower final score indicates lower overall unmanaged risk, suggesting the company's ESG risk management performance is effective.

For the 2024 assessment, Prometeon Tyre Group obtained an overall result of **12.5**, indicating that the Company is at low risk of experiencing material financial impacts from ESG factors.

NEW SYNERGIES BETWEEN LOGISTICS AND SUSTAINABILITY

In 2024, the Logistics and Sustainability Departments continued their projects launched in 2023 with the aim of reducing CO2 emissions by increasing maritime transportation and optimizing warehouse logistics.

During the course of the year, Logistics Department has been working to maximize efficiency of transportation flows between the Turkey factory and European customers to reduce emissions. The Department focused its activities on increasing maritime and intermodal (especially rail) transport while decreasing road transport. Transport volume variations in 2023, 2024 and expected for 2025 are shown in the table below.

Regarding the optimization of vehicle movement in warehouses, various plans were adopted with the aim of increasing number of electric powered vehicles used for transportation activities, which can be summarized as following:

• Replacement of diesel forklifts used in Egypt factory warehouses with_electric forklifts in the next 6 years;

Turkey electric tow truck, the aim of the project for Turkey is to replace diesel tractor
used in factory -warehouse transportation flow with an electric tow truck. Benefits of
the project include an estimated € 7.2 k saving per year, no use of diesel and reduction
of HSE risks caused by diesel engine vehicle which differently from the electric one has
a less reliable braking system.

• <u>Turkey lithium-ion batteries</u>, replacing forklifts using "lead acid batteries" with "lithium-ion batteries" powered forklifts. In 2024 the replacement of all 73 forklifts in the fleet was completed.

The data for Social Dimension takes into account the corporate population of the entire Group, as specified above.

The data for the Environmental Dimension includes the four plants where the Group produces, the HQ in Milan, Italy and the R&D Center in Cinisello Balsamo (MI), Italy. For energy consumption and GHG emissions, the scope is further detailed in the following paragraph.

DATA COLLECTION AND REPORT VALIDATION PROCESS

The data and information reported in this document were collected through interviews with representatives and data collection forms.

The final version of the Sustainability Report is presented to and approved by the Board of Directors on 15 April 2025.

MATERIAL TOPICS DEFINITION

After the identification of current and potential impacts, through the analysis of company external and internal activities and external pressures, they are evaluated based on their significance. Afterwards the impacts are prioritized, resulting into the List of Material Topics.

The relevance assessment of the impacts depends on two variables: severity and likelihood. Severity takes into account the severity of the impact; how widespread the impact is along the Group's value chain and how hard it is to counteract or make good the resulting harm. On the other hand the likelihood express the chance that the impact occurs.

CALCULATION METHODOLOGY

The methodological indications for certain indicators reported in this Sustainability Report are shown below.

HUMAN RESOURCES

New employee hires and employee turnover (determined as FTE at 31st December of each fiscal)

The number of new hires and leaving employees during the course of the year are indicated respectively as "incoming" and "outgoing". However, it has to be taken into consideration that the Company avails of temporary labor in order to meet the unexpected increases in production volumes as well as to compensate the absence of labor during annual leaves or in cases of sickness leaves. Therefore, the temporary employees have to be detracted from the amounts of incoming and outgoing employees for understanding the actual flows of employees during the course of the year.

The calculation of the Group personnel by geographical area, gender and contract type was carried out with respect to the data received from the various countries.

Remuneration indices

In determining the Disclosure 2-21, the following elements of fact were taken into account:

- all employees reported under Disclosure 2-7 were taken into consideration;
- for each part-time employee full-time equivalent (FTE) pay rates has been used;
- the remuneration has been calculated taken into account of:
 - theoretical base salary;

- actual bonuses, commissions, cash profit-sharing, and other forms of variable cash payments received by employees during the reporting period (excluding welfare and other similar company benefits – e.g. company car);
- the highest-paid individual holds the position of General Manager.

Health and safety indices

Accident rates are calculated as shown below:

- injury rate is the ratio between the total number of accidents and the total number of hours worked, multiplied by 1.000.000;
- the occupational disease rate is the ratio between the total number of confirmed occupational diseases and the total number of working hours, multiplied by 1.000.000;
- severity rate is the total number of serious accidents expressed as a percentage of the total number of labor hours multiplied by 1.000.000;
- lost days are the calendar days lost due to accident as of the day following that of the accident;
- recovery time corresponds to the lost time due to the fact that by company policy injured employees cannot return to work with different tasks than those they originally performed;
- worked hours for non-employees and EU, APAC and USA salesforce (less than 2% of the employees) are estimated considering 8 hours/day for each worker for 22 days per month per year.

ENVIRONMENTAL

Energy and GHG emissions

Mobile energy conversion factors for petrol and diesel from DEFRA 2024, considering average biofuel blend, 'Average car' for company cars, 'Average (up to 3,5 tonnes)' for VANs and 'All HGVs 0% laden' for outdoor testing trucks.

Plug-in hybrid electric vehicles factors from SECR kWh pass & delivery vehicles 2024 and from SECR kWh UK electricity for EVs 2024.

Mobile energy and impacts calculated on effective consumption or distance travelled.

LPG conversion factors from IPCC 2006 until 2023 included, from DEFRA 2024 for 2024.

Natural gas for steam boiler conversion factor from IPCC 2006 until 2023 included, from DEFRA 2024 for 2024.

All the values for both mobile and stationary combustion refer to net calorific value.

GHG conversion factors from IPCC 2006 until 2023 included, for 2024 from DEFRA v13 (09/2024), EPA v6.0 (10/2024), IEA v6 (01/2024), MLC v16.1 (05/2024).

Both location and market-based emissions are disclosed and reported as CO2-e considering the GWP over a period of 100 years for the six gases listed in the Kyoto Protocol: carbon dioxide (CO2), methane (CH4), nitrous oxide (N2O), hydrofluorocarbons (HFCs), perfluorocarbons (PFCs) and sulphur hexafluoride (SF6).

Biogenic CO2 emissions from biomass are disclosed separately.

This report includes at least 97.5% of scope 1+2 energy and both location- and market-based emissions. This is based on the following considerations.

HQ office in Milan (4.400 m2) accounts for less than 0,1% of total scope 1+2 energy consumption and for less than 0,1% of total location-based emissions. Being subsidiaries and commercial branches offices in Germany, Poland, Spain, Switzerland, Turkey, Egypt and the UK in total less than 2.000 m2, we assume that they account for scope 1+2 less than 0,1% for both energy and emissions.

Factories internal transportation by diesel driven vehicles is not fully reported. Assuming that energy and emissions are proportional to the overall production, starting from the mapped data we can conclude that internal transportation accounts for 1,5% of energy and 2,0% of emissions.

Saleforce cars in EU are not fully reported. Assuming that energy and emissions are proportional to the overall number of cars, starting from the mapped data we can conclude that non reported cars account for 0,2% of energy and 0,3% of emissions.

NOx and SOx Emissions

The emissions are calculated based on hourly emissions measurements made in each plant, which are subsequently calculated on a yearly basis. Since measurement of the emissions at Santo Andre factory is carried out on biennial basis in compliance with the requirements of local laws and regulations, data shown for 2023 are calculated based on 2022 values reproportioned on the value of production.

Water

The Company evaluates the water stress area by using the on-line tool provided on <u>Aqueduct Water Risk Atlas (wri.org)</u> to understand water-related risks and assess exposure to water risk across multiple locations. For Sustainability Reporting purposes, areas subject to water stress have been considered those for which in 2024 the Water Resources Institute have highlighted a water stress from high to very high, namely the plants of Alexandra (Egypt), Gravatai (Brazil), and Izmit (Turkey).

Materials

Materials disclosure is limited to materials that are part of the finished products, including process scrap. The recycled content includes the recycled share of the total steel used estimated with 2023 shares data declared by the suppliers for each purchased product and the actual 2024 quantities data. The highest value declared is replaced with the weighted average as a precaution.

Biodiversity

The Company evaluates the impact of its production activities on environmentally protected areas in the vicinity of the production plants. In order to measure the distance of the productions plants in Brazil, Egypt and Turkey from environmentally protected areas and areas with particular values in terms of biodiversity located in their vicinity, in particular to understand whether the distance is whether more or less than 5 km, the Company avails from an online tool provided on <u>Account Login - ArcGIS Online</u>.

RESTATEMENTS OF INFORMATION

The restatement of information from previous reporting periods, in respect to some metric related to 2022 and 2023, and the reasons for such revisions are summarize and described below. These changes were mainly due to the introduction of new HSE Data Management System (Sphera Cloud Corporate Sustainability - SCCS) and to the improvement of ESG reporting process. In particular the adjustments were made to the following KPIs:

- Number and rate of recordable work-related injuries (GRI 403-8): in 2024, to enhance accuracy and ensure consistent reporting across all sites, a new HSE Incident Management Standard was issued and implemented worldwide. Injury data for 2022 and 2023 have been adjusted accordingly.
 - The changes applied were related to injury data, that has been updated due to methodological changes, and to additional information collected for worked hours related to the subsidiary Prometeon Logistica y Distribuçãos Ltda (former PTG Logistica e Serviços Ltda). This generate a change on prior years indexes calculation;
- NOx and SOx Emissions (GRI 305-7): for Santo Andrè plant the measurement of the emissions is carried out on biennial basis in compliance with the requirements of local laws and regulations and for this reason such data were not included in sustainability report 2023. In 2024 Sustainability Report, thanks to the improvement of estimation process (estimation based on 2022 values reproportioned on the value of production), the quantity related to NOx and SOx for 2023 has been included;
- Water withdrawal (GRI 303-3): in 2024 the area where the Gravatai plant (Brazil) is located has been identified by the Water Resource Institute as a area with high water stress, so the water withdrawals of the plant itself have been qualified consequently in the Sustainability Report. In addition, in 2024, withdrawal from purchased steam condensate used in Izmit (Turkey) has been considered as third-party water. Water withdrawal breakdown for 2022 and 2023 have been adjusted accordingly; it has not been registered any changes in total withdrawal data.
- Water discharge (GRI 303-4): in 2024, to enhance accuracy and thanks to the improvement of data collection processes and water consumption monitoring systems, treated water used in Alexandria (Egypt) for irrigation is cosidered as water discharge to surface. Data for 2022 and 2023 are adjusted accordingly.
- Water consumption (GRI 303-5): Considering the changes applied to the volumes of water discharges and to the breakdown of water withdrawals, water consumption data for 2022 and 2023 (that are calculated as the difference between withdrawals and discharges) has been adjusted accordingly.
- Solvents (non-GRI disclosure): data for 2022 and 2023 updated to exclude soap-based antiadhesive.

In addition, due to the introduction of the already mentioned new HSE Data Management System (Sphera Cloud Corporate Sustainability - SCCS), used for collection and reporting of

environmental data and HS information, some minor rounding differences with previously disclosed data have been registered.

EXTERNAL ASSURANCE

The Sustainability Report is subjected to limited review by the auditing firm EY S.p.A., in compliance with the International Standard on Assurance Engagement (ISAE 3000 Revised).

Independent auditors' report on the "Sustainability Report 2024"

To the board of Directors of Prometeon Tyre Group S.r.l.

We have been appointed to perform a limited assurance engagement on the "Sustainability Report 2024" (hereinafter "Sustainability Report") of Prometeon Tyre Group S.r.I. and its subsidiaries (hereinafter the "Group" or "Prometeon Tyre Group") for the year ended on 31st December 2024.

Responsibilities of Directors on the Sustainability Report

The Directors of Prometeon Tyre Group S.r.I. are responsible for the preparation of the Sustainability Report in accordance with the "Global Reporting Initiative Sustainability Reporting Standards" issued by GRI - Global Reporting Initiative ("GRI Standards"), as described in the paragraph "Methodological Note" of the Sustainability Report.

The Directors are also responsible for that part of internal control that they consider necessary in order to allow the preparation of a Sustainability Report that is free from material misstatements caused by fraud or not intentional behaviors or events.

The Directors are also responsible for defining the commitments of Prometeon Tyre Group S.r.l. regarding the sustainability performance, as well as for the identification of the stakeholders and of the significant matters to report.

Auditors' independence and quality control

We are independent in accordance with the ethics and independence principles of the *International Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (including International Independence Standards) (IESBA Code)* issued by the *International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants*, based on fundamental principles of integrity, objectivity, professional competence and diligence, confidentiality and professional behavior.

Our audit firm applies the *International Standard on Quality Control 1* (*ISQC Italia 1*) and, as a result, maintains a quality control system that includes documented policies and procedures regarding compliance with ethical requirements, professional standards and applicable laws and regulations.

Auditors' responsibility

It is our responsibility to express, on the basis of the procedures performed, a conclusion about the compliance of the Sustainability Report with the requirements of the GRI Standards. Our work has been performed in accordance with the principle "International Standard on Assurance Engagements ISAE 3000 (Revised) - Assurance Engagements Other than Audits or Reviews of Historical Financial Information" (hereinafter "ISAE 3000 Revised"), issued by the International Auditing and Assurance Standards Board (IAASB) for limited assurance engagements. This principle requires the planning and execution of procedures in order to obtain a limited assurance that the Sustainability Report is free from material misstatements.



Therefore, the extent of work performed in our examination was lower than that required for a full examination according to the *ISAE 3000 Revised* ("reasonable assurance engagement") and, hence, it does not provide assurance that we have become aware of all significant matters and events that would be identified during a reasonable assurance engagement.

The procedures performed on the Sustainability Report were based on our professional judgment and included inquiries, primarily with Company's personnel responsible for the preparation of the information included in the Sustainability Report, documents analysis, recalculations and other procedures in order to obtain evidences considered appropriate.

In particular, we have performed the following procedures:

- analysis of the process relating to the definition of material aspects included in the Sustainability Report, with reference to the methods of analysis and understanding of the reference context, the identification, assessment and prioritization of actual and potential impacts and the internal validation of the process outcome;
- comparison of economic and financial data and information included in the paragraph "The
 distribution of value for our stakeholders Sharing of added value" and in the annex "Country by
 country reporting" of the Sustainability Report with those included in the Prometeon Tyre
 Group's consolidated financial statements;
- 3. understanding of the processes that lead to the generation, detection and management of significant qualitative and quantitative information included in the Sustainability Report.

In particular, we have conducted interviews and discussions with the management and the personnel of Prometeon Tyre Group S.r.I. and Prometeon Turkey Endüstriyel ve Ticari Lastikler A.Ş. and we have performed limited documentary evidence procedures, in order to collect information about the processes and procedures that support the collection, aggregation, processing and transmission of non-financial data and information to the management responsible for the preparation of the Sustainability Report.

Furthermore, for significant information, considering the Group's activities and characteristics:

- at Group level
 - a) with reference to the qualitative information included in the Sustainability Report, we carried out inquiries and acquired supporting documentation to verify its consistency with the available evidence;
 - b) with reference to quantitative information, we have performed both analytical procedures and limited assurance procedures to ascertain on a sample basis the correct aggregation of data.
- for Prometeon Turkey Endüstriyel ve Ticari Lastikler A.Ş. (Izmit plant), that we have selected based on its activity, relevance to the consolidated performance indicators and location, we have carried out site visits and remote interviews during which we have had discussions with management and have obtained evidence about the appropriate application of the procedures and the calculation methods used to determine the indicators.



Conclusion

Based on the procedures performed, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the Sustainabilty Report of the Prometeon Tyre Group for the year ended on 31st December 2024 has not been prepared, in all material aspects, in accordance with the requirements of the GRI Standards, with reference to the GRI Standards selection as described in the paragraph "Methodological Note" of the Sustainability Report.

Other aspects

The comparative information presented in the Sustainability Report for the year ended on 31st December 2022 have not been examined.
